Nearly 1,000 elementary and middle school students attended a free educational concert held at the Union County Performing Arts Center (UCPAC) on February 21, 2024. The event was presented by the New Jersey Youth Symphony (NJYS).

Nearly 600 students from Union County public schools and 350 students from Paterson Public Schools were bussed to UCPAC for this special event celebrating Black History Month featuring music selections by all-Black composers including Duke Ellington and William Grant Still. The Township is working with the Berkeley Heights Historical Preservation Committee to preserve and restore portions of the historic Littell-Lord Farmstead. Several grants from Union County and the State of New Jersey have been received but more funds are needed and we can't do it without your help! The Township is asking for the community to gather together to raise \$50,000 by April 10, in time for us to apply for this year's New Jersey Historic Preservation Trust grant. The grant is a matching grant, which means the Township can only apply for an amount it can match with money on hand in the Trust, from donations.

To put the \$50,000 goal in perspective: If 2,500 people in a town of over 13,000 gave just \$20, we would hit our goal!!! Or, if every household in BH donates just \$20, we would far

surpass our goal and reach \$80,000 - which means even MORE restoration work can be done!

The Littell-Lord Farmstead, located in Berkeley Heights, is a pastoral site reminiscent of Union County's agricultural past. It was built in approximately 1760 and added to the National Register of Historic Places on March 7, 1979. It currently serves as the home and public museum of the Berkeley Heights Historical Society. The historical architectural firm, Connelly & Hickey is overseeing the restoration work. The work is beginning with stabilization - first phase of which

should be done by the second week of April - and will continue with a carpentry phase, which includes repairing the historic windows. These efforts are 100% paid for with donations and grants the Township and volunteers have obtained, but more financial assistance is needed in order to continue the progress.

IMAGINE SEEKS VOLUNTEERS

been offering free peer support groups to children, youth and adults who are grieving for more than 10 years. The volunteers who facilitate these groups create safe spaces where the pain of grief can be acknowledged and shared, and where group members feel felt. Imagine's volunteers are the heart of Imagine's programs, and many find their volunteer work with Imagine so fulfilling that they continue for many years, some having stayed since the program began. Here's what some of Imagine's volunteer facilitators have to say about their experience:

"People outside of Imagine are always supportive when they hear that I volunteer at a grief support center. But I know it can be a little confusing to hear that volunteering at a grief support center is the best night of my week. And that's the magic. Imagine's volunteer facilitators come from all walks of life and no special background is required other than a willingness to listen, a heart inclined to serve, and the ability to be with children and adults in grief without trying to fix, solve or give advice. Volunteers must be 18 years or older and bilingual (Spanish speaking) volunteers are needed as well. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving and help create a space where

This Spring, Imagine will offer two facilitator training classes for those who would like to join this amazing group of volunteers. The first will be held at their location at 570 Broad Street in Newark from May 3-5 from 9 am-5 pm each day. The second option will take place at Imagine's location at 244 Sheffield Street in Mountainside from June 7-9, also from 9am-5pm each day. Imagine staff ask those participating in the training to plan to attend all three days.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO ADVOCATE FOR CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

Five-year-old Jennifer is diagnosed with autism and almost completely nonverbal. Due to excessive violence in the family home, a concerned neighbor called for help and, after investigation, Jennifer was placed in foster care. The two phrases Jennifer can say graphically depict violence witnessed at home and confirm trauma she's endured. Since entering care and being enrolled in school, it's evident Jennifer has also experienced educational neglect. At age three, she was entitled to an Individualized Education Plan from the Department of Education to provide such intervention services as in-home speech and behavioral therapies, both helpful for future enrollment in a half-day educational program. Unfortunately, Jennifer's parents neglected to utilize these services and she is now more than two years behind her peers.

Jennifer is just one of the more than 500 children removed from home in Passaic and Union counties each year due to abuse and neglect. These children are separated from all they've ever known: parents, siblings, friends, teachers, and their belongings. For Jennifer, the road ahead is long, and she needs a caring, consistent adult in her corner to protect her best interests while in foster care. That's where Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteers come in.

A CASA volunteer is trained on the ins and outs of advocating for child-victims and fully supported by CASA staff for the duration of the case. No special background in child welfare is necessary; successful CASA volunteers are dedicated community members with varied life experiences who believe abuse and neglect are non-negotiable. CASA volunteers visit the children, make unbiased observations, interview others in the child's life, and make recommendations to the judge. They often are the only consistent adult in the life of a child involved in the child welfare system, as caseworkers, professionals, and even placements can be ever-changing. A CASA volunteer

The nonprofit is court-empowered to recruit, train and support volunteer advocates to speak up for the best interests of children in foster care. Assigned by a court order that grants access to the child and all those in their lives, the CASA volunteer gathers information and makes informed recommendations to the judge deciding the child's future. Often, the CASA volunteer is the only consistent person in the child's life. ELECTRONICS RECYCLING FOR APRIL

The Township's monthly electronics and #6 foam recycling drop off is available Saturday April 6, and Saturday, April 20 (first & third Saturday of every month) at the Department of Public Works yard off of Berkeley Avenue, near the new Municipal Complex. Coming from Plainfield Avenue, go past the old Town Hall and take your first right onto Berkeley Avenue. Coming down Park from Mountain Ave, Berkeley Ave is on your left just before the old Town Hall.

Time runs from 9 a.m. - 12 noon. In addition,

residents can drop off their thin-film plastic during this event the first Saturday of every month. Reminder that we are now accepting electronics for recycling from our residents as a service twice a month because of the heavy volume - the first and third Saturday of every month.

Please bring proof of residency and please arrive with sufficient time as it ends promptly at noon. You do not need to get out of your car; DPW workers will take the items out of your car for you.

SPRING CHIPPING PROGRAM

Township of Berkeley Heights

The Spring Chipping Program in Berkeley Heights will begin on April 8, 2024. All branches must be out for pick-up on the first day of the schedule for your section. Absolutely no branches will be collected once a section is completed. There will be no more than 1 pickup per household. There will be no exceptions to the published schedule.

Branches should be placed in neat piles at curbside with large diameter cut ends toward the street. The largest size branches shall be limited to 4 inches in diameter. Short branches under 2 feet in length will not be accepted. Lumber, building materials, fence posts, leaves, roots, stumps, briars, vines, decayed branches and other debris which can damage the chipper WILL NOT be accepted. Material of this nature will be left for your disposal. This program is for yard branch cleanup only and is not intended to be used as a tree disposal program. Residents who have trees cut down and placed at the curb for pick-up with this program will have their piles rejected.
