FAMILY ROCKING CHAIR OF THREE GENERATIONS RESTORED

In the quiet corners of SAGE's furniture restoration workshop, a silent witness to the passage of time awaited its resurrection - a rocking chair with a storied past. Rose Shuhala, aunt to Cathy Vander Meulen of Madison, held memories of those rocking days back in 1938 when she was just a 10-year-old. The chair, perhaps once adorned in vibrant red or subtle brown stain, now stood in a state of disarray, a testament to the wear and tear of decades.

Cathy, the curious custodian of this familial relic, pondered its origins. Was it tucked away in her mom's basement, or did it find refuge when the original Newark house changed hands in 1985? The chair, a puzzle of dismantled parts, lacked even a seat, echoing the void left by the passage of time. Rose, the last surviving sibling of eight in a family of Ukrainian immigrant parents, recounted the chair's presence on the porch of their humble abode. Two such chairs existed, but the fate of the other had faded into the recesses of forgetfulness.

As the family grew and evolved, the rocking chair bore witness to countless stories. In the transformed two-family house, where siblings sought stability and shared living spaces, the chair was a constant. Now, at the hands of the skilled artisans at SAGE, this humble piece of furniture underwent a meticulous resurrection. Restored, the rocking chair bridged the generational gap, becoming a tangible link to the struggles and triumphs of the family, a timeless seat echoing with the whispers of familial bonds.

"I want to thank everyone who worked on my grandmother's rocking chair that sat for years on her front porch. I've had it in storage for 35+ years, unassembled with no seat. You brought the chair back to life!" said Cathy Vander Meulen of Madison. She continued "When my 95-year-old aunt came over on Thanksgiving she spotted it immediately and said, "that's Baba's (her mother) chair!" She couldn't believe she was seeing it again after all this time."

The Workshop is located in the basement of the SAGE building at 290 Broad Street, Summit and is easily assessable. For more information about the service or to schedule an appointment to bring in furniture, call 908-598-5531.

The Summit Area Old Guard is a social, educational, and recreational organization that restoring old furniture. Our speaker will be Bob serves men of retirement age. On April 16th we will be discussing saving and McAnally, Furniture Workshop Manager of the S.A.G.E. Restoration Workshop. SAGE Eldercare, an all-round senior daycare center in Summit, has a volunteer group which repairs furniture for an extremely low price. We will learn what goes on behind the scenes at this iconic Summit institution.

Donna Goggin Patel will be our speaker on April 23rd. Donna serves as Chair of the Summit Environmental Commission. She will tell us about something amazing, Summit's tiny forest. It is possible to grow a full micro-forest on as little as an acre in a few decades. Summit has such a forest. It was planted behind the Community Center several years ago and is thriving. We will learn about the importance of native species and how dense pocket reforestations can help mitigate climate. Donna can also discuss the latest sustainability efforts in Summit and other planned and ongoing environmental efforts.

Finally, on April 30th our own David Dietze, Managing Principal, Senior Portfolio Strategist at Peapack Private Wealth Management, will present.
