Jaya Dave, a senior at Watchung Hills Regional High School, was recently awarded the Governor's Award for Exceptional Artistry & Community Leadership in Dance. She has been dancing since the age of 4 at the Washington Rock Dance (WRD) school in Warren. During her time at WRD, she has trained preprofessionally in ballet and modern dance as well in contemporary, jazz, hip-hop and tap. She also has many years of training in Bollywood and Classical Indian dance. Jaya has furthered her dance technique at the Ailey School Professional Division Summer Intensive as well as the American Dance Festival Pre-Professional Intensive.

Through the years, Jaya has had many prominent roles in the WRD's Nutcracker Ballet production as well as had opportunities to perform alongside professional in various venues throughout New Jersey and New York City. Most recently, she was invited to dance at a reception at the Governor's Mansion during a Women's History Month event.

In addition to advancing her artform through her own training, Jaya has spent many hours over the last 7 years teaching dance as an assistant teacher at WRD, where her passion for dance education and leadership began. Jaya strongly believes that all students should have access to learning various dance forms, regardless of socioeconomic background, and thus led the initiative to reintroduce the dance program into the Watchung Hills Regional High School curriculum. A SLIME OF A GOOD TIME

The Somerset County Library System of New Jersey's Watchung branch recently hosted a STEAM-themed slime lab program especially for children in grades K-5.

Slime was created using liquid glue, baking soda, and contact solution. Food coloring and beads were added to make the slime even more special.

"Science programs at the Library allow students to explore educational concepts in a hands-on way," said Katie Salerno, youth services librarian. "Attendees learned about the different states of matter. They discovered this by stretching and squashing the slime; that it's not quite a liquid or a solid, but something in between called a non-Newtonian fluid."
