BULK PICKUP SCHEDULE

Township of Berkeley Heights

The following table outlines the dates for pick up by township section. All acceptable materials must be placed at the curb before 7 a.m. on the first cleanup scheduled day. The contractor will cover each street only once. Therefore, your junk MUST be out for collection on the first scheduled day. By state law, doors on cabinets, appliances and refrigerators must be removed as a safety precaution. Boards, swings, monkey bars and similar items must be dismantled and cut to a maximum of 4 feet in length.
