## **UNICO CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY**

The Scotch Plains Fanwood chapter of UNICO, America's largest Italian-American service organization, celebrated their 50th Anniversary on Saturday, April 13, 2024, at the Scotch Plains Italian American Club with over 125 guests in attendance. The national organization was founded in Waterbury, CT in 1922 to serve the community and contribute to charitable, cultural, and educational organizations. Then, in 1973, a group of Italian-American men of Scotch Plains and Fanwood were approached about starting a local chapter of UNICO, and they were chartered with over 70 founding members.

Two of the founding members were in attendance at the event, Luigi Suriano and Vincent Losavio. When the chapter was chartered, Luigi was elected as one of the two Vice Presidents and Vincent served on the Board of Directors. First Vice President, Daniela Sellinger, who presided over the event's ceremonies called up Luigi and Vincent to the podium to be recognized as a force behind preserving Italian heritage within the community and establishing the chapter.

The family of founding members were also recognized, including the daughters of Frank DiNizo, Cathy Fluta and Eileen Parenti - the daughter of Thomas Perrucci, Dorianne Perrucci - and the family of Carmen Ponzio, Carmen's wife, Arlene, and their son Andrew and his wife Celeste. Frank, Tom, and Carmen were great assets to the chapter and they each had immense pride in their Italian-American heritage.

Special guests that were in attendance included Anthony Bengivenga, the Executive Vice President of UNICO National - District Governor April Bengivenga of UNICO's NJ District 10 - UNICO National Membership and Retention Director Geri Samuel, who is also a past chapter President and current board member - JD Bryden, the Deputy District Director for Congressman Tom Kean, Jr - Al Mirabella, Union County Commissioner and Scotch Plains Township Manager - Scotch Plains Mayor, Josh Losardo - Fanwood Mayor, Colleen Mahr - members of the Scotch Plains Democratic Committee and Scotch Plains Township Council - Deputy Police Chief Al Sellinger of Scotch Plains Police Department - and Father Andy Prachar and Father Matthew Gonzalez of St. Bartholomew Church.

Since the chapter was formed in 1973, they have stayed true to UNICO's objectives and the motto of "Service Above Self". Some of their ongoing service initiatives have included co-hosting the town's largest Italian-American Labor Day Festival along with St. Bartholomew's Church, hosting Columbus Day Italian Heritage Celebrations, organizing food drives, donating thousands of dollars to organizations, individuals, and families in need, and donating over a quarter of a million dollars' worth of scholarships to local high school students of Italian descent to use towards their secondary education.

The chapter currently has 64 members and its officers include President, Alfonso Gialanella - First Vice President, Daniela Sellinger -

Second Vice President, Jeff Blanck - Treasurer, Kon Zoganas - Recording Secretary, Matt Marino - and Corresponding Secretary, Maryann Matteo. The chapter's Board of Directors includes Ben Caruso, Paul Raphael, Luciana Rodak, Geri Samuel, Bob Steinbergher, and Stephen Steinbergher. The celebration wouldn't have been possible without the hard work and dedication of the 50th Anniversary Committee, including Luciana Rodak, Jeffrey Blanck, Gina Suriano-Barber, Marla Mackey, Maryann Matteo, Paul Raphael, Geri Samuel, Daniela Sellinger and Angelo Ucciferri.

A delicious dinner spread was catered by local businesses, including Mazella's Gourmet Market of Mountainside and Godwit Coffee of Scotch Plains, and the night wrapped up with a DJ dance party.

The Scotch Plains Fanwood chapter of UNICO would like to thank all the community members and special guests in attendance. It was a wonderful celebration of 50 years of Italian heritage preservation and service to the community.





"It's a great honor," said Fr. David. "I've just

seen the great honor that's bestowed upon the grand marshals, the men and women who served their country, and I know that they're met with great admiration from the community."

"It's pretty cool. I'm definitely more integrated into the community now, having been here since 2015," Brian added.

For the identical twins, an interest in military service was always a thought in the back of their minds, but after witnessing the events of Sept. 11, 2001, as freshmen on the campus of Rutgers University, they felt an obligation to enlist and serve their country.

The brothers are very excited about this year's Memorial Day Parade, getting the chance to honor fellow service members as well as celebrate with a community they both care for very deeply.

"I think it's a good example to young people, specifically, that serving your country is noble, and it's a beautiful thing," Brian said. "That serving your country can give you a lot of opportunities you would've never considered."

"I just know that there's tremendous respect paid to veterans who serve our nation in the community," Fr. David added. "I just like being in that environment. And also just reconnecting with familiar faces, with people that maybe I haven't seen since I left."

## **GAIL RHEIN, LOYAL SCOUT LEADER PASSES**

With heavy hearts we share that Gail Rhein, loyal Scout Leader with Scouts BSA Troop 104 in Scotch Plains-Fanwood, passed away on April 10, 2024, after a brave battle with Leukemia.

Scouting is a youth-led, youth-run program, but the youth must be trained to be leaders. Adult role models in Scouting provide an ideal learning experience for all youth and every adult volunteer has something valuable to offer. Gail was an exemplary leader who touched the lives of countless scouts and instilled in them the virtue of community service.

She started off in Scouting when her son, Steven, joined Evergreen School Cub Pack 34. Their Scouting journey then continued with Troop 104, where Gail took on an active role as a Troop leader, assuming many responsibilities. She organized the Troop's holiday wreath and poinsettia fundraiser which helped to spread joy and cheer to everyone's home, extending it with the inclusion of a Chanukah candle fundraiser as well. Gail also participated in Boards of Review where the progress of each Scout was evaluated, and she was instrumental in encouraging them to continue further on the path to Eagle. She interacted with all recent Eagle Scouts, giving them just what they needed as a mentor, cheerleader, coach, trusted advisor, and friend.

Gail's greatest passion was helping others – in her career as a grief counsellor and as an active role model for community service to the scouts. She coordinated the troop's community service activities collaborating with other local groups to organize service opportunities for the Scouts. This included helping with the Fanwood holiday tree lighting ceremony, Fanwood 5K, Party in the Park, Easter Egg Hunt, Harvest Festival, Frazee House, Earth Day Cleanup, MLK Day of Service, and many projects at the Scotch Plains Community Gardens. She was immensely proud when Troop 104 received a commendation for contributing over 2,395 hours of community service in a single year across 30 different service projects – the most hours of any Scouting unit in the entire Patriots' Path Council of NJ.

One of Gail's favorite Scouting activities was the week-long summer trip to Sabattis Adventure Camp in the Adirondacks where the Troop would organize their own campsite, sleep in tents, and cook all their own meals. She would help to comfort first-time campers who might have felt homesick, and she used her training as an EMT to ensure that Scouts with medical requirements maintained their regimens while away.

Most of all, Gail complemented the skills and experiences of the other Troop leaders, and she was "always there" to help the Scouts in any way that she could.

Members of Troop 104, along with All Saints' Episcopal Church, held a public event to commemorate Gail and her contributions to the local scouting program.



## MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID CERTIFICATE

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools is proud to announce the outstanding success of its teen Mental Health First Aid (tMHFA) certification program. This year, 329 high school students completed the program, marking a significant milestone as the initiative enters its second year. This remarkable achievement highlights the district's dedication to prioritizing the mental well-being of its students.

Recognizing the concerning increase in mental health challenges among adolescents across the nation, SPF initiated the program last year with funding from the Mental Health Association of New Jersey and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

The district offers the course to its 11th-grade students as an integral component of their health curriculum. This course is designed to provide students with the necessary tools to recognize, comprehend, and respond to indicators of mental health and substance use issues among their peers. The tMHFA certification program, initially developed in Australia and adapted for the United States by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing and Born This Way Foundation, aligns with New Jersey's comprehensive health standards, incorporating mental and emotional health components into the district's curriculum.

"Our commitment to promoting mental wellness extends beyond the classroom," said Kristine Iarussi, Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools' Director of Counseling, Health and Wellness. "With over half of our high school students trained in tMHFA, we've empowered our student community to act proactively to recognize and address mental health concerns."

Participation in the certification program is a

school-wide effort with health teachers undergoing training sessions conducted by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing. This comprehensive approach ensures that educators are well-prepared to effectively guide students through the curriculum.

As students navigate the complexities of modern life, including academic pressures, social dynamics, and familial expectations, initiatives like tMHFA can play a pivotal part in supplying them with the skills to promote resilience and well-being. Student testimonials underscore the program's impact on fostering a supportive environment where individuals feel encouraged to address mental health challenges. Ellie Szopinski, 16, emphasized the importance of approaching mental health discussions with empathy and understanding.

"The most notable thing was learning to recognize the behaviors themselves and how to identify these crises and stop them before they become life-threatening," Ant Butters, 16, added.

Saman Zeb, 17, highlighted the significance of destigmatizing mental health issues and promoting open dialogue.

"Mental health is often overlooked," Zeb said.
"It's nice to have a course that allows you to take
a deep breath and realize that your mental health
and the mental health of others is really
important."

Students also said the class encourages self-preservation.

"I feel like it's just as important for people to educate themselves not only to help others but also to help themselves," Cooper Tamase, 16, said, adding that mental health has been a focus of his for years.

## **LECTURE: INTERGENERATIONAL** TRAUMA CAUSED BY THE HOLOCAUST

Plains will host a lecture by Irit Felsen, PhD, who will speak about the psychological effects of the Holocaust on survivors themselves, as well as on their children and families. The discussion will take place at CBI on Sunday, May 19, at 5 p.m. The program is free of charge and open to the community and is designed to appeal to a wide audience.

Dr. Felsen is a clinical psychologist specializing in trauma and traumatic loss and is a renowned speaker in her field, both nationally and internationally. Her work has focused on the long-term effects of the Holocaust on survivors and their families, and on intergenerational transmission of unique vulnerabilities and resilience to descendants.

A daughter of two Holocaust survivors, Dr. Felsen grew up in Israel and has been living in the United States since she did her postdoctoral training at Yale University. She is Co-Chair of the Trauma Work Group in the NGO on Mental Health in Consultative Relationship to the United Nations and was the Chair of the Covid-19 APA Interdisciplinary Task Force during the years of its operation. She is an Adjunct Professor at Columbia University and at Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology, Yeshiva University. She also has a private practice in New Jersey.

"We are excited to invite Dr. Felsen to our community," said Rita Geller, who is a co-chair of the Second/Third Generation Holocaust Survivors Group, sponsor of the event. "Besides being informative for the members of our group, whose parents or grandparents survived the

Congregation Beth Israel (CBI) in Scotch Holocaust, it will be very interesting for everyone else too. Intergenerational trauma is a hot topic in psychology today."

The Second/Third Generation Holocaust Survivors Group was created at Congregation Beth Israel, but also includes participants from other area synagogues and the community. It functions as a support group for its members to share experiences. The group also plans events to educate the public about the Holocaust.



## **HINDU FESTIVAL DIWALI NOW A SCHOOL HOLIDAY**

#### Universal Society of Hinduism

Hindus have welcomed Scotch Plains-Fanwood Public Schools (SPFPS) in New Jersey announcing closure of its eight schools (in its 2024-2025 School Calendar) on their most popular festival Diwali; which falls on November one this year.

Zed hoped that SPFPS would make Diwali holiday a permanent fixture of its school calendar in the coming years, thus recognizing the intersection of spirituality and education.

Rajan Zed noted that awareness about 'other' religions, thus created by such holidays like Diwali, would make SPFPS students well-nurtured, well-balanced, and enlightened citizens of tomorrow.

Zed further says that Hinduism is rich in festivals and religious festivals are very dear and sacred to Hindus. Diwali, the festival of lights, aims at dispelling the darkness and lighting up the lives and symbolizes the victory of good over evil.

Hinduism is the oldest and third largest religion of the world with about 1.2 billion adherents and moksh (liberation) is its ultimate goal. There are about three million Hindus in the USA.

SPFPS is a regional school district serving

5,500 students from preschool through 12th grades. Per its School Calendar 2024-2025, besides Diwali; schools are closed on Rosh Hashanah (two days), Eid Al-Fitr; while Christmas fell in December 23-31 Winter Break, and Spring Recess April 14-18 (which includes Good Friday on April 18) was just before Easter (April 20).

Dr. Joan Mast and Evan Murray are Superintendent and Board President respectively of SPFPS, which covers diversified communities of Township of Scotch Plains and the Borough of Fanwood; and besides others, also teaches classes on chemical dependency and family life education. Its goals include "Diversity" and "Justice".

Diwali is the Hindu festival of lights, with variations celebrated in other I ndian religions. It symbolises the spiritual "victory of light over darkness, good over evil, and knowledge over ignorance".
