



Garwood Historical Committee

On Thursday, August 21st, 1924, at 10:30 a.m., almost a hundred years ago, a terrible train crash occurred at the Lincoln Ave. crossing, at the border of Garwood and Cranford. This is where Frosty Freeze was on North Ave. and Walgreens Cranford is on South Ave. At that time, the rail tracks ran flat on the street and cars on Center St. and Lincoln Ave. ran right over the tracks.

On that day, construction was being done on North Ave., so traffic was detoured down Lincoln Ave., across the railroad tracks onto South Ave.. There was no gate, but there was a warning bell at the crossing that went off to signal that a train was coming. There happened to be a stationary freight train nearby and the driver of a truck thought that it was that train ringing the bell so he could safely cross. However, the passenger train, Philadelphia & Reading express train #604, heading eastbound through Garwood into Cranford, and moving at 60 miles per hour, overtook the crossing and slammed into the 10ton truck.

The truck was thrown 75 feet. The locomotive and 3 of the 4 train cars overturned and slid 3 city blocks. Sadly, the truck driver died along with 3 people on the train including the engineer. 40 people were injured. Everyone living nearby went to help the passengers. Local homes were used as first aid stations. The injured were rushed to Elizabeth General Hospital and Muhlenberg Hospital. Many of the injured were from Philadelphia and Plainfield.

This accident made headlines in the major local newspapers. This was one of many train crashes, most of which were minor, over the next decade along the Jersey Central railway, but none were more spectacular than this. The company finally made the decision to raise the railroad in many places and Lincoln Ave. now has an overpass for trains. As for the Center Street train crossing, it wasn't until 1963 that the underpass was built to avoid a replay of this tragic incident.







The Two Hundred Club Medal of Valor Award is a prestigious honor reserved for the courageous Police and Firefighters of Union County who have gone above and beyond in the line of duty. Each spring, our Annual Spring Valor Award Luncheon is held, attracting hundreds of attendees who gather to celebrate and honor these true heroes. Since 1968, we have recognized over 400

police officers, firefighters, and State Troopers, all of whom have selflessly risked their lives in service of the public good. The Valor Awards Luncheon is also a time to pay tribute to those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty. With solemn respect, we honor the memory of those who have given their lives to protect and serve our community.

GARWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT HONOREES:

On November 28, 2023, Garwood Police Headquarters received a 911 call from an individual reporting an unspecified medical emergency. The caller, sounding disoriented, abuptly hung up.

Being that the caller had contacted Garwood Police several times for various medical is-sues in the previous hours, Patrolman Pridy and Patrolman Sanchez were dispatched to the scene to conduct a welfare check.

Arriving at the door to the apartment and

hearing no response from inside, Sergeant Wright was called in for backup. Together, they made the decision to breach the door to check on the individual in distress.

The officers were met with a harrowing sight - a man standing on the edge of his third-story balcony with a cable tied around his neck, seconds from taking a fatal leap. As the officers approached, the distressed man jumped over the railing. Patrolman Pridy, Patrolman Sanchez, and Sergeant Wright managed to grasp the man just in time – putting themselves at risk of being pulled over the railing – and successfully pulling the distressed man back to safety.

The NJVN works from the heart and is therefore able to work with all the other amazing veteran charities that share the same common goal, putting veterans first. Our donations go directly to the veteran's programs, which allows us to assist veterans and their families throughout the entire state and host numerous recreational therapy activities as well. This year we are starting up a few veterans' retreats and will focus on increasing events at our state veteran hospitals and shelters.

We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives. 
