#### Westfield Public Schools

The Westfield Public School District is pleased to announce a series of significant staff achievements that underscore the high level of commitment and professionalism within the district's educational community.

Among the notable accomplishments, Westfield High School Boys Tennis Coach George Kapner reached a remarkable milestone with his 700th win on April 9, highlighting Kapner's dedication to excellence and his impactful guidance on athletes over the years.

Supervisor of Athletics Sandra Mamary notes that this milestone makes Kapner "the winningest coach in Westfield Blue Devil history."

In early March, WHS Technology Education teacher Laura Doyle was among the outstanding technology and engineering educators honored by the International Technology and Engineering Educators Association (ITEEA) at its annual conference in Memphis. Doyle received the 2023-2024 Teacher Excellence Award, one of the highest honors given to technology and engineering education classroom teachers in recognition of their outstanding contributions to the profession and their students.

Visual and Performing Arts Supervisor Shawna Longo joined other music educators for a congressional briefing on March 11 in Washington, D.C., organized by the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) and the Country Music Association Foundation (CMAF). Longo, who received the CMAF Teachers of Excellence Award last fall, was on a panel that briefed lawmakers and others in attendance about the importance of music education. Longo also has been appointed to the NAfME Artificial Intelligence Task Force, which will examine the use of AI in music education.

WHS Cross Country / Track and Field Head Coach Christopher Tafelski, who teaches science at the high school, received national recognition earlier this year by the U.S. Track and Field and Coaches Cross Country Association (USTFCCCA) as a 2023 High School Cross Country State Coach of the Year. ## **ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE (RYE) PROGRAM**

Submitted by Dr. D Michael Hart At a recent regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Westfield Rotarian Mark Wright explained how the RYE program works. The RYE program creates worlds of possibilities, leadership skills, lifelong memories, and new friendships for both students and the families they live with during their time away. Designed for high school students aged 15 to 18.5 at the time of departure, over 9,000 students around the globe participate in the program each year and the RYE program offers a fun, yet safe way to travel and immerse yourself in another country and culture.

Mark explained the details of the Student Exchange program is run through ESSEX (Eastern States Student Exchange Program) which provide structure and oversees the program for Rotary Districts along the East Coast of Canada and the US, including Bermuda. Students enter the US on a J-1 visa and host parents and volunteers are required to complete a background check and training from the Department of State. ESSEX also requires the use of certain insurance programs and travel agencies to ensure the safety of the students during their year abroad.

During the academic year (typically August to June), the students attend the local high school and live with a host family, may also take sponsored and Rotary sanctioned trips throughout the country. Mark's daughter is currently in Argentina and will take three extensive trips during the year and his exchange student from France will take a month-long trip around the United States.

ESSEX also offers short term Student Exchange programs for several weeks over the summer. In our District, we focus on Japan and have established an excellent exchange experience.

Out district collaborates with neighboring Rotary districts (eastern PA and southern NJ) during the year with a goal to bring the bring the exchange students (15 total over three districts) together once a month. We had a joint orientation in September, followed by a Halloween party in October and a Friendsgiving in November. In

December, we went to NY City and in February, the exchange students will have an international pot luck supper where each student brings a dish from their home country. The event is in Allentown, PA.

In March or April, SSEX will decide on the exchange student match for the 2024-2025 academic year. The students put in their top 5 countries, and the hosts put in their requirements. For Example, Mark asks for girls since he has 3 daughters, and someone who does not speak German, since both he and his wife are fluent, and find it more interesting to deal with someone speaking another language.

A civil claim could also hold you financially responsible for injuries sustained by a third party as a result of the actions of a minor, who has been illegally served or had alcohol.

"Parents Who Host, Lose the Most" is a public health awareness campaign that encourages parents and the community to send a unified message that teen alcohol consumption is unacceptable.
