NEWEST FIRE DEPT MEMBERS JENNA TRACY & BRETT ULRICH

Jenna Tracy, 37, along with Brett Ulrich, 46, are the newest members of the Chatham Borough Volunteer Fire Department (CBVFD).

Jenna joins Ella Scannell and Annemarie Lord as the third active female member. Jenna, a lifelong resident of Chatham Borough, is also the third generation of her family to join CBVFD. Her grandfather, Donald Tracy, joined in 1967 and her father, Dennis Tracy, joined in 1983. It was shortly after her father's passing in May 2023 that Jenna decided to follow in his footsteps and legacy to join the Engine 2 Company. She has started training and will be attending the Fire Fighter 1 (FF1) class at the Morris County Fire Academy in August 2024.

Jenna has been working at ECLC of New Jersey Chatham School for the past nine years - ECLC of New Jersey is an accredited, nonprofit, educating students ages 5-21 with severe learning and/or language disabilities, autism spectrum disorder, down syndrome, or multiple disabilities at schools in Chatham and Ho-Ho-Kus and is excited to continue serving the Chatham community as a first responder.

"It is a pleasure to welcome Jenna to the CBVFD. She will be the third generation in a time-honored tradition of serving the residents of Chatham Borough. Both her grandfather and father served for many years before her. Although the path will be difficult and challenging in the beginning as she attends the Morris County Fire Academy in August, I'm confident that she will do great. She will be attending with two more probationary firefighters who will go through their FF1 training together. I wish her a safe and extensive span of service as a "legacy" member of the CBVFD." said CBVFD Chief Pete Glogolich.

Rescue Company Lieutenant and Recruitment Committee Chair Shell Lee shared, "It's truly commendable that Jenna and Brett have stepped up to serve as a volunteer firefighter in addition to their work commitments and support for family and friends. Volunteer firefighters (estimated 65% of the total number of firefighters in the U.S.) play a crucial role in safeguarding communities, often going above and beyond to protect lives and property. Volunteer firefighting is a selfless endeavor, and it's heartwarming to witness individuals like Jenna and Brett dedicating their time and effort to serve their neighbors. These unsung heroes respond to emergencies, participate in community events, and foster strong bonds within our neighborhoods. Their commitment ensures that our communities remain safe."

The Chatham Borough Volunteer Fire Department was established in 1898, and is comprised entirely of volunteer firefighters, including probationary and junior members who provide services 24 hours a day/365 days per year. The department operates its headquarters at Fire House Plaza and has responded to 396 calls in the last year, both within Chatham, and in the form of Mutual Aid to departments in our neighboring communities. Last year, CBVFD celebrated their 125th anniversary of serving the community!

JUNE IS MEN'S HEALTH MONTH

Prevention of chronic disease is key to leading a healthy life for men of all ages. The number one cause of death is heart disease in the USA. Cancer is the second leading cause of death. There are many resources available to screen and reduce complications of both heart disease and cancer, if caught early.

Please join us for a Healthy Aging for Men seminar on Thursday, June 6, 2024, from 7-8 pm at the Library of the Chathams, 214 Main Street, Chatham provided by the Community Health & Outreach Department at Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center.

Routine comprehensive physical exams screen for both heart disease and certain cancers. Routine bloodwork includes Comprehensive Metabolic Panel, Complete Blood Count, Lipid Panel (to check cholesterol), HA1c (to check sugar control). Additionally, you can request for Vitamin D deficiency screening, as it is not standard but a common deficiency in the USA. Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) is another blood test that becomes routine to screen for prostate cancer, which is typically started at age 50 unless at a higher risk. Colonoscopies are now recommended for routine colon cancer screening at age 45. If you are a current everyday smoker, or a former smoker, discuss this with your general practitioner. You could be eligible for low-dose chest CT for lung cancer screening. Additionally, a one-time aortic aneurysm screen is

Prevention of chronic disease is key to leading recommended for smokers and former smokers healthy life for men of all ages. The number one with significant history after the age of 65.

In addition to routine screening, daily commitment to personal health is key. Physical activity and a well-balanced diet can help improve overall quality of life and reduce risk for health complications. Physical activity improves mental health, improves mobility, and can increase one's chance of living longer. The American Heart Association recommends at least 25 minutes of cardiovascular exercise, where your heart rate is elevated above baseline, for at least 5 days a week. There are also benefits of resistance training such as improved bone health and a decrease in visceral fat.

A well-balanced diet is usually defined as the Mediterranean diet. The Mediterranean diet has been extensively studied and has been consistently found to contribute to overall health and wellness. It consists of healthy fats, whole grains, and largely plant-based with occasional fish and meat. Once a day men's multivitamin can also provide additional benefits to the Mediterranean diet; it is also recommended to take an over-the-counter Vitamin D supplement as this is a common deficiency. Living a healthy life requires daily commitment and routine annual screens.

LIBRARY OF THE CHATHAMS CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

Chatham Library Foundation

On Friday evening, May 10, exactly 100 years after the opening of the building at 214 Main Street, a large crowd celebrated this anniversary of the Library of the Chathams building. In the foyer—the original portion of the library-members of the community, library board members, representatives of the Chatham Borough and Chatham Township governing bodies and of both the Chatham Historical Society and Chatham Township Historical Society, as well as volunteers and library staff raised a champagne toast. They were treated to historical markers, a trivia game relating to library additions (of which there have been at least six) and facts of the times, and a beautiful cake with an artistic rendering of the library building. This special event was hosted by the Chatham Library Foundation.

Andy Hollander, President of the Library Board of Trustees, spoke of the importance of "people and books." He continued, "We thank Lynda Phillips Lum [the first Chatham librarian] and all the people who contributed to the library over the years with their time, their devotion, their philanthropy, and more. We stand on their shoulders. For by strengthening the library, they strengthened our community... May our library remain a beloved community center for books and people for another century."

Others who addressed the guests were Chatham Borough Mayor Carolyn Dempsey, Chatham Township Deputy Mayor Michael Choi, Chatham Borough Historical Society representative Lynn Magrane, Chatham Township Historical Society representatives Martha Wells and Pat Wells, and Library Director Karen Brodsky.

Both the Borough of Chatham and the Township of Chatham issued official proclamations celebrating the anniversary.

At the kickoff of the library's Summer Reading Program on Monday, June 17, the celebration will continue with the distribution of 100-Year-Anniversary t-shirts!

"We both saw our older brothers having so much fun in Scouting, and we really looked up to them," said Maciejewski. "When Troop 280 formed in Chatham, we joined right away and became founding members of the troop," added DiPasquale. The two have been friends since childhood, and now enjoy an even stronger bond through Scouting.

They've hiked 100 miles at the BSA Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico, braved river

rapids for a week in West Virginia, helped lead a marine science live-aboard sailboat trip in the Berkeley Heights officially has its first two Florida Keys, and together spent well over 100 nights camping around our region.

> "The adventures pulled us together with so many new friends," said Maciejewski, "And we've each grown in so many ways, in our abilities, confidence and leadership."

> Their Troop started with just eight girls, but has grown to 48 registered girls today, ages 11-17. "It grew really quickly because we had so much fun doing all the different things we did together. And we laugh a lot," noted DiPasquale.

> For their Eagle Projects, each built a hefty bridge to help hikers complete a 1.3 mile loop at the Green Village Conservation Trail in Chatham Township, noted by a sign and kiosk at 328 Green Village Road, Green Village. They fundraised to purchase the materials and led teams of Scouts to cut the lumber, construct the bridges and boardwalks, and move the bridges

into place over a half-mile from the street. They also led volunteers to transport woodchips to enhance the trails.

"Signing up for a volunteer day is one thing," said Maciejewski, "but leading a big project and volunteers from start-to-finish is another, and really satisfying."

Both live busy lives outside of scouting. DiPasquale, a senior at Governor Livingston High School, will attend Kean University in the fall and play on the basketball and lacrosse teams. Maciejewski, a sophomore at Mount Saint Mary Academy, is pursuing her pilot's license. And they remain active in scouting. "Once an Eagle Scout, always an Eagle Scout," they concur.





For Westfielder Pat Colbert, volunteering at Dominican nuns who reside on the Rosary Shrine grounds that include a large chapel open to the public. Several years ago, the cloistered nuns began making a number of products to sell, including candles, soaps, face and foot crème, etc. Those items are available, along with a host of religious goods, at the gift shop and online at cloistershoppe.com. Proceeds provide funds needed to support the 20 nuns who live at the monastery.

> Many people come to the shop to secure perpetual enrollments that provide prayers for individuals.

> "These are beautiful cards that people usually buy to give to families of recently deceased individuals or for any living person who might need prayers," says Tina Lesher, of Westfield, who along with her husband, John, volunteers at the shop. "We print out these lovely enrollments and include a special holy card."

> Morris Township resident Kathy Sette has been a dedicated volunteer for 20 years.

> "We're more blessed being here," says Sette. "There's just a feeling about it."

> Her feelings are echoed by decades-long volunteer Dorothy Shanahan of Summit.

> "Curiosity led me as a young woman to investigate that big church on the hill...Simply put, God's grace and love began a lifelong association with the monastery...this journey has been a very special privilege and gift to my life and my family."

> Many of the volunteers are members of the Rosary Guild, an auxiliary that assists the nuns

in such undertakings as raising funds, driving the nuns to appointments, shopping with the sisters, etc. The current president is Joan Brinkerhoff of Summit. She argues that working in the shop "can give me and all the volunteers an Evangelizing ministry---a time to care for others emotionally in a loving, Christian way. We reach out to our shoppers to help them find a special gift for a new grandchild, a sick friend or help them with a loss of a friend, child, parent or even a life-altering illness...we are the lay hands and voices of the nuns."

While handling the shop duties, volunteers also answer calls coming into the Rosary Shrine and relay the messages to the nuns.


"Many of the callers are seeking the nuns" prayers for a variety of reasons, often because of illness or loneliness or depression. As I listen to the pleas, I feel so lucky," says Tina Lesher.

The Summit monastery was founded in 1919 when a group of sisters from a Union City monastery moved to the current site. As contemplatives, the nuns use prayer and penance to spread the Kingdom of God. The average age of the current 20 sisters in Summit is in the 50s.

The monastery chapel houses the only copy of the Shroud of Turin. The 400-year-old shroud copy can be viewed during the open chapel hours from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily. Mass for the public is celebrated daily at 7:30 a.m and Sundays at 8 a.m. The Cloister Shoppe is open Mondays through Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The Monastery is located at the corner of Springfield and Morris Avenues in Summit.





HISTORICAL SOCIETY 2024 DINNER MEETING

The Chatham Historical Society recently held its 2024 annual dinner meeting at Fairmount Country Club. As customary the officers for the society were elected for 2024-2025. Amy Crandall and Karen Hoerrner will continue serving as co-presidents, Debbie Fabian as vice president, Christine Grobert as treasurer, and Stacey Keenan as secretary. The co-presidents also presented the Library of the Chathams with an annual contribution check for the library's support and assistance with the society's programs, events and collections.

The guest speaker, award winning journalist and author Mark Di Ionno, presented a program "How the Watchung Mountains Won the Revolution."

A Summit native, Di Ionno is a former Star-Ledger columnist. Since 2009 he has been an adjunct professor of journalism at Rutgers University. He was a 2013 Pulitzer Prize finalist for his news commentary on Hurricane Sandy and a five-time winner of the Rutgers Academic Alliance Award. He has written many books about New Jersey that serve as guides to the history and landscape of the state. When A Guide to New Jersey's Revolutionary War Trail was published in 2000, it was said to be the most comprehensive collection of New Jersey's Revolutionary War sites listing 350 places by exact address.

In his presentation Di Ionno touted the importance of the Watchung Mountains to General George Washington and his troops during the Revolutionary War. The protection of the hills and the great swamps gave the Colonial Army an advantage as the terrain was unfamiliar to the British. From the hilltops the colonial troops were also able to detect any encampments of the British troops. Washington and his troops spent three and half years in this area of New Jersey during the eight-year war. He talked about three lesser-known battles that took place in the Watchung Mountains vicinity: the Battle of Bound Brook in April of 1777; the Battle of Short Hills in June of 1777; and the Battle of Springfield in June of 1780 – which was the final British effort to conquer New Jersey.

Di Ionno devoted a portion of his presentation to current geopolitical problems. As a Navy Corpsman from the Vietnam Era, he has made seven humanitarian trips to Poland and Ukraine since the Russian invasion in February 2022. He also lamented the lack of appreciation of United States history among the younger generations. After the presentation he stayed on to sign copies of his book Revolutionary War Trail that was available for purchase. The proceeds of those sales will go to benefit an orphanage in Ukraine.
