One thing our team decided to do was to have Gold Star families meet disabled veterans at our events, so they can work together and form a bond. This effort was extremely affective and immediately brought joy to both the Gold Star families and to the disabled veterans. By adding veteran family members to the team, it allows us to work together on our peer support and recreational therapy programs. We are honored to have veteran family members to work alongside us and know they are just as committed with helping our veterans live a better way of life.




THREE COMMUNITY **COOLDOWNS PLANNED**

EVENT RAISES FUNDS TO HELP GRIEVING CHILDREN

Experience Camps

Hundreds of people attended the "Day of Champions" event held on June 2, 2024, in Warren, NJ for a day of family-friendly fun and fierce competition. It was all tied into one glorious morning of camp-inspired challenges and activities to benefit Experience Camps.

Experience Camps is an award-winning national nonprofit that transforms the lives of grieving children through free, weeklong, summer-camp programs, and innovative, yearround initiatives. There are six million young people in the U.S. who will experience the death of a parent or sibling, and Experience Camps aims to provide as many young people as possible joy, hope and strategies for learning how to navigate their grief journey.

The "Day of Champions" event started in 2018 in Westport, CT. It grew out of the desire to host a different type of fundraiser for Experience Camps, and the idea to do a massive "Color War" (think camp Olympics) was formed. This was the second annual Day of Champions at Camp Riverbend in Warren, NJ.

For the event, 20 teams sign up for an amazing day of fun. They are each assigned a spirit color which they are encouraged to fully embrace (including tie dye, spray paint, body/hair paint, tutus...the wilder, the better). They competed in five activities to earn points. Along the way they were also tasked with fundraising for Experience Camps. A minimum of \$2,500 is expected to be raised by each team.

The day kicked off with Opening Ceremonies, which includes some words from the Event Chair and a camper speaker. The games then ran for


about an hour and a half, before finishing the day with Closing Ceremonies, which included the awarding of trophies. Then everyone celebrated with treats, and there was much to celebrate!

"It was incredible to see so many families of Summit join together where the joy of friendly competition met the power of philanthropy, creating a kaleidoscope of fun and goodwill for everyone who participated," said Justine Lelchuk, Day of Champions Team Captain and Summit Resident. Added Ari Landau, Day of Champion Team Captain and Summit Resident, "Bereavement can be a difficult topic to talk about but I felt uplifted knowing so many of us came together to support grieving children and raise critical dollars for much needed bereavement programming."

Jenni Hetrick, Assistant Director & Division Head of Camp Riverbend, where the event took place said, "Camp Riverbend has always believed in the magic of camp and is proud to partner with Experience Camps and other organizations that support grieving children."

In addition to a lot of smiles and community bonding, the teams raised \$125,000 that will support Experience Camps' programming and help heal thousands of grieving teens. POOL SAFETY TIPS CAN HELP SAVE A LIFE

U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission

Drowning is the leading cause of unintentional death in children ages 1 through 4, and data released by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) shows that more than 375 children drown in pools and spas each year. Children younger than 5 years old account for 75 percent of these drownings, 56 percent of which are attributed to a gap in adult supervision. Most child drownings (71 percent) happen at home.

In response to these numbers, CPSC's Pool Safely campaign is sharing simple water safety steps that families can take to prevent drownings, especially while many families are spending more time around backyard and portable pools this season.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission's Pool Safely campaign urges parents and caregivers to follow the Pool Safely simple safety steps to prevent more drownings:


- Never leave a child unattended in or near water, and always designate an adult Water Watcher. This person should not be reading, texting, using a smartphone or be otherwise distracted. In addition to pools and spas, this warning includes bathtubs, buckets, decorative ponds, and fountains.
- If you own a pool or spa, be sure to install layers of protection, including a four-sided fence with a self-closing, self-latching gate.
- Learn how to perform CPR on children and adults. Many communities offer online CPR
- Learn how to swim and teach your child how to swim.
- Keep children away from pool drains, pipes and other openings to avoid entrapments.
- Ensure any pool and spa you use has drain covers that comply with federal safety standards and if you do not know, ask your pool service provider about safer drain covers.

Families can visit poolsafely gov for additional water safety tips to prepare for a summer that is safer and more fun.
