# THE AMERICAN HEART CHALLENGE AT WMS

Warren Township Schools

Government Association (SGA) recently teamed up with the American Heart Association (AHA) to complete the American Heart Challenge to raise money for the health of all hearts.

Brandon Volosov, 7th grade student and fundraising chairperson of the SGA came up with the idea to raise money for the AHA based on personal experience and his knowledge of a beloved 6th grade math teacher at WMS who recently received a successful heart transplant. Brandon was passionate about the American Heart Challenge and wanted to share his passion with WMS.

Nurse Lisa Lontai, Principal George Villar, and Vice Principal Maria Mensinger strongly support embracing philanthropy as an integral part of the school's educational ethos, as it equips children with the values and skills they need to become responsible, compassionate, and socially conscious members of society. The additional benefit of the American Heart Challenge is that students learn valuable life-saving skills, such as Hands-Only CPR, the dangers of smoking and vaping, and how to quickly recognize and respond to someone having a stroke.

Over 200 students registered to complete the American Heart Challenge and a total of \$18,532.82 was raised. Brandon exceeded his fundraising goal and raised \$17,258.00, and Ria Rimani was also very successful in raising \$650.00. As appreciative as the students were for those who donated to their fundraising efforts, the majority of students were grateful for learning about Hands-Only CPR and how to respond in an emergency.

"Warren Middle School did an amazing job with their American Heart Challenge event and we are extremely grateful for Principal Villar, Vice Principal Mensiger, Nurse Lontai and the Student Government Association for putting together a wonderful post-challenge event where students were able to get their hearts pumping by participating in various activities such a relay races, basketball games, jump rope, and high

jumps. Students also had the amazing opportunity to learn Hands-Only The Warren Middle School (WMS) Student CPR as part of the stations," said AHA Representative Katie Farina.

The AHA also donated \$1300.00 in physical education equipment to WMS as a thank you for all of our efforts.

# **GROUNDBREAKING RIVER CLEANUP EFFORT CELEBRATED**

Township of Green Brook

On Sunday, May 19, 2024, an official ceremony was held in Green Brook to celebrate the installation of the Bandalong Bandit Litter Trap in the Green Brook at the end of Jefferson Avenue. The Bandalong Bandit Litter Trap, which is the first of its kind in the State of New Jersey, catches any debris and waste that flows through the section of the brook, reducing pollution and aiding cleanup efforts. The pilot program was made possible through a grant from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, which fully funded the project, in addition to partners including the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Lower Raritan Watershed Partnership (LRWP) and the Borough of Dunellen.

"The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is thrilled LRWP Board President and de facto Executive to see this project be implemented because it will improve aquatic habitat by way of an innovative method, with this being the first in-stream litter trap in the State of New Jersey. Removing floatable trash will benefit fish and wildlife through plastic and microplastic pollution reduction in the Green Brook and all the way out to Raritan Bay and the Atlantic Ocean," said Fish & Wildlife Biologist Jillian Stark of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Director Heather Fenyk, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Biologist Jillian Stark, Dunellen Mayor Jason F. Cilento, and Green Brook Mayor Jim Van Arsdale. The ribbon-cutting ceremony was concluded with live demonstration of the litter trap by the Dunellen Department of Public Works (DPW), who installed the trap with Storm Water Systems. The trap will be maintained by Dunellen DPW, with assistance from Green Brook DPW. LRWP will be charting all debris The ceremony began with remarks from cleanup data for further analysis.



# **CAREER DAY DRAWS OVER 100 VENDORS**

At 15 and 16 years old, many students are thinking about what to eat for dinner, how much homework they have that night, or what video they can post on Instagram. While many also have thoughts about their future in mind, do they really know what they want to do post-high school? What their ideal job is or what they will

study in college or as an apprentice?

On May 29, 10th and 11th grade students at Watchung Hills Regional High School experienced a Career Day that gave them exposure to a diversified number of professions, allowed them to practice communication skills, and opened up their world to new ideas, careers, and people. Over 100 vendors participated in Watchung Hills Career Fair, bringing their expertise and memorabilia from their companies with the sole goal of sharing their job descriptions and advice to over 850 students.







# **GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD TAKE ACTION PROJECT**

Watchung Hills Regional High School, have recently completed a Take Action project in order to complete the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor a girl scout can earn.

The Gold Award is a Take Action project meaning that it goes beyond community service because it must have a long lasting impact. The

have a national and/or global link, demonstrate leadership, and have a sustainable and measurable impact.

I looked at my community to find an issue that needed a solution. I noticed that my peers were very concerned about school and the future in general. Things like staying up past midnight and studying during lunch are commonplace. That's why for my Gold Award Take Action project, I wanted to focus on stress management.

My Take Action project began in December of 2022 when I first began brainstorming and finding a team of volunteers to help with the project. Emma Giantisco, a student assistance counselor at Watchung Hills, was my project advisor who had the task of guiding me throughout the process. Active Minds, a student organization at Watchung Hills, will sustain the project for many years to come. Other members of the team include Premini Thanasegaran, my troop leader; Jason Sabino, the head of the guidance department at Watchung Hills; and Dr. Savitha Puttaiah, a psychiatrist.

My project consisted of three workshops that were planned around students' most stressful times of the year including December, March, and late April. These periods occur around the end of the first semester, the month of the year with the most school days, and right before AP exams, respectively.

The first workshop was in December of 2023 and focused on time management skills. Students learned about the pomodoro technique and how to avoid procrastination. To end the workshop, students made a schedule for themselves which

I, Navya Venkatesh, a girl scout and a junior at project must address the root cause of an issue, is a key component of managing time. For this workshop, 93% of participants reported that they learned something new.

> The second workshop was in March of 2024 and focused on ways to de-stress where students learned about the effects of cortisol, the stress hormone, and how to lower cortisol levels by doing arts and crafts, journaling, and self-care. For this workshop, 96% of participants reported that they learned more.

> The third workshop was in April of 2024 and focused on the connection between physical and mental health. 90% of participants reported that they learned more about how physical and mental health are related.

> Overall, the three workshops involved more than 75 students and across the three events. 90% of students learned something new.

> The project not only benefited the community at Watchung Hills, but it also benefited me. I learned more about stress management while teaching it to my peers. However, I also learned more about myself. Through the process of earning the Gold Award, I learned that I am capable of taking on a complicated, long term project with many steps that require early planning and effective communication with many people.

> I am very grateful that this project was able to benefit my community and that it will continue to serve Watchung Hills students for years to come.

> Additional notes: The project began in December, 2022 and ended in June, 2024. Over 80 hours of community service went into the Take Action project.




