FARMERS MARKET OPENS FOR 2024 SEASON AT BEST LAKE

Farmers Market every Tuesday from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Best Lake parking lot. The market opened on June 4th and will continue to the end of October.

The Farmers Market will provide residents with an opportunity to access local products from local vendors. Many vendors will be returning, and new vendors will be joining the market this year.

Returning vendors include: Schiefersteins Farm - provides local JERSEY FRESH produce grown by our farm neighbors; Innoculated Farms - providing exotic mushrooms, Microgreens from Verde Harvest, Organic produce from Circle Brook Farms; Pequest Valley Farm - Farmer Joseph Bullock provides his own locally grown beef and organic eggs, as well as fresh cheese and butter from Sutton Farm; Smart Buy Natural Foods -beef, poultry, pork, bison, seafood; Bobey Lou - Baked desserts, with a portion of all proceeds being donated; Raining Sprinkles Bake Shop - Cookies; Pickle Culture; Paolo's Kitchen; Sweet Nana's Jamalade; Hot Graham Sauce; Handmade Jewelry by Crystals and Co. and Sunny Dayz Jewelry; Gramp's Kitchen - Fresh meals cooked to order. More vendors are anticipated and there will be special events, such as music and tables by local scouting troops.

There will once again be a borough table providing information from CERT/OEM and the Environmental Commission. There will be a Watchung Lions Club collection box for eyeglasses and hearing aids. The Green Team will collect excess reusable shopping bags for donation to a local food pantry.

In addition to providing fresher produce and more personal service than large chain stores, farmers markets are an integral element of sustainability plans. They ensure food



SCLSNJ'S WATCHUNG BRANCH TEMPORARY LOCATION

The Somerset County Library System of New Jersey's (SCLSNJ) Watchung branch opened the doors to its temporary location on June 5th at 20 Stirling Road in Watchung - only a short distance away from the temporarily closed, but to-be-renovated, original branch.

"We cannot wait to welcome back our Library customers and show off the temporary space that the Watchung Borough, in partnership with Mr. Frank Bisignano and SCLSNJ, have provided for the community," said Manny Miracle, branch manager. "I think our customers will be delighted to see how charming the branch is and how hard staff throughout the Library System have worked to ensure there is something in the building for everyone to enjoy."

The new temporary space offers an outdoor book drop, limited curated collections for customers of all ages, new materials, photocopier services, public computer access, a phone charging station, access to Library programs, and more. While smaller programs will be held at temporary Watchung space,

larger events such as the One Man Sideshow, will be held at the Wilson Memorial Church in Watchung.

The temporary location has parking available in front of the former Valley Furniture Store, as well as at Best Lake. The temporary branch hours will be as follows:

Mondays: 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.; Tuesdays through Thursdays: 2 p.m. - 6 p.m.; and Saturdays: 10 - 2 p.m.

All customer holds will be available at the Watchung branch temporary location for pickup during open library hours. Customers may change their holds pickup location at any time by accessing SCLSNJ's online catalog at catalog.sclsnj.org. If you require personalized assistance to complete a holds pickup location change, email ask@sclibnj.org.

GROUNDBREAKING RIVER CLEANUP EFFORT CELEBRATED

Township of Green Brook

On Sunday, May 19, 2024, an official ceremony was held in Green Brook to celebrate the installation of the Bandalong Bandit Litter Trap in the Green Brook at the end of Jefferson Avenue. The Bandalong Bandit Litter Trap, which is the first of its kind in the State of New Jersey, catches any debris and waste that flows through the section of the brook, reducing pollution and aiding cleanup efforts. The pilot program was made possible through a grant from the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, which fully funded the project, in addition to partners including the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Lower Raritan Watershed Partnership (LRWP) and the Borough of Dunellen.

improve aquatic habitat by way of an innovative method, with this being the first in-stream litter trap in the State of New Jersey. Removing floatable trash will benefit fish and wildlife through plastic and microplastic pollution reduction in the Green Brook and all the way out to Raritan Bay and the Atlantic Ocean," said Fish & Wildlife Biologist Jillian Stark of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

The ceremony began with remarks from

Cilento, and Green Brook Mayor Jim Van Arsdale. The ribbon-cutting ceremony was concluded with live demonstration of the litter trap by the Dunellen Department of Public Works (DPW), who installed the trap with Storm Water Systems. The trap will be maintained by Dunellen DPW, with assistance from Green Brook DPW. LRWP will be charting all debris cleanup data for further analysis.







GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD TAKE ACTION PROJECT

I, Navya Venkatesh, a girl scout and a junior at project must address the root cause of an issue, is a key component of managing time. For this Watchung Hills Regional High School, have recently completed a Take Action project in order to complete the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor a girl scout can earn.

The Gold Award is a Take Action project meaning that it goes beyond community service because it must have a long lasting impact. The

have a national and/or global link, demonstrate leadership, and have a sustainable and measurable impact.

I looked at my community to find an issue that needed a solution. I noticed that my peers were very concerned about school and the future in general. Things like staying up past midnight and studying during lunch are commonplace. That's why for my Gold Award Take Action project, I wanted to focus on stress management.

My Take Action project began in December of 2022 when I first began brainstorming and finding a team of volunteers to help with the project. Emma Giantisco, a student assistance counselor at Watchung Hills, was my project advisor who had the task of guiding me throughout the process. Active Minds, a student organization at Watchung Hills, will sustain the project for many years to come. Other members of the team include Premini Thanasegaran, my troop leader; Jason Sabino, the head of the guidance department at Watchung Hills; and Dr. Savitha Puttaiah, a psychiatrist.

My project consisted of three workshops that were planned around students' most stressful times of the year including December, March, and late April. These periods occur around the end of the first semester, the month of the year with the most school days, and right before AP exams, respectively.

The first workshop was in December of 2023 and focused on time management skills. Students learned about the pomodoro technique and how to avoid procrastination. To end the workshop, students made a schedule for themselves which workshop, 93% of participants reported that they learned something new.

The second workshop was in March of 2024 and focused on ways to de-stress where students learned about the effects of cortisol, the stress hormone, and how to lower cortisol levels by doing arts and crafts, journaling, and self-care. For this workshop, 96% of participants reported that they learned more.

The third workshop was in April of 2024 and focused on the connection between physical and mental health. 90% of participants reported that they learned more about how physical and mental health are related.

Overall, the three workshops involved more than 75 students and across the three events, 90% of students learned something new.

The project not only benefited the community at Watchung Hills, but it also benefited me. I learned more about stress management while teaching it to my peers. However, I also learned more about myself. Through the process of earning the Gold Award, I learned that I am capable of taking on a complicated, long term project with many steps that require early planning and effective communication with many people.

I am very grateful that this project was able to benefit my community and that it will continue to serve Watchung Hills students for years to come.

Additional notes: The project began in December, 2022 and ended in June, 2024. Over 80 hours of community service went into the Take Action project.

On May 29, 10th and 11th grade students at Watchung Hills Regional High School experienced a Career Day that gave them exposure to a diversified number of professions, allowed them to practice communication skills, and opened up their world to new ideas, careers, and people. Over 100 vendors participated in Watchung Hills Career Fair, bringing their expertise and memorabilia from their companies with the sole goal of sharing their job descriptions and advice to over 850 students.

Taking their scavenger hunt cards to different vendors (putting them in the running for the raffle for tricky tray baskets donated by the vendors), students learned about occupations they were both interested in as well as those they had little prior frame of reference for - finding out the best paths to take to get to where they want to be in their future. Many made valuable connections or obtained internships and summer jobs.




