Berkeley Heights Township offers residents an opportunity to join the "No Knock List" to avoid being approached on their private property by licensed solicitors by visiting berkeley heights.gov, or by contacting Township Clerk Ana Minkoff at 908-464-2700 ext. 2220 or via email aminkoff@bhtwp.com.

If a commercial canvasser does come onto the property of a resident already on the "No Knock" list, the resident is urged to call non-emergency police at (908) 464-1111 while the solicitor is still at the home or in the immediate area to report it. Regardless of whether or not a resident is on the "No Knock" list, all residents have the right to ask to see a solicitor's Township-issued permit.




