#### **ALJ HIGH SCHOOL COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY 2024**

Arthur L Johnson High School held its sixty-eighth commencement ceremony on June 19th, 2024. The event was attended by Clark Board of Education President Steven Donkersloot, Clark Board of Education Vice President Thomas Lewis, Clark Board of Education members, Clark Mayor Sal Bonaccorso, Clark Superintendent Edward Grande, Garwood Board of Education President April Farrell, Garwood Superintendent Christopher Kinney, family members, teachers, administrators, and other community members.

Christopher Di Nucci, Interim, introduced those in the processional. Assistant Principal Katrina Poskay served as master of ceremonies for the event. Senior Class President Zoey Brown led the Pledge of Allegiance and Marianna Milara sang "The Star-Spangle Banner". The processional leaders included Zoey Brown and Shannon Lancellotti, Student Council President.

Salutatorian Taylor Normann addressed the class stating, "When you leave here today and move on to go to either college, trade school, job, military or wherever your path may lead, I want you to remember to embrace the change. Confront the fear. And don't forget where you came from." She continued, "Do what makes you scared. Don't let anxiety and fear be the thing that stops you. Let it be what drives you to keep pushing forward."

Marianna Milara and ALJ Alumni Judah Gray performed a duet of the song "Unwritten" by Natasha Bedingfield.

Zoey Brown, Senior Class President reflected on her experience at ALJ stating, "If each of our lives is a book, then each of our books is a different volume to the series we call ALJ. The final pages may be written here tonight as peers add their final words and memory of switching their tassel from right to left." She continued, "Some of us may be introducing the new book in our series at the college of our dreams in the next two months, some going into the trade they are fascinated and driven by, and others may not be sure where their pages take them next, and that is okay."

Clark Board of Education President Steven Donkersloot stated, "As you embark on what comes next, remember the lessons learned during your years spent in school and with the community and carry those lessons with you moving forward in life. Continue to work hard, dream big, be kind, and make a difference." He congratulated the students and thanked parents, guardians, teachers, administrators, and staff for the efforts in supporting these graduates.

Superintendent Edward Grande shared the honors, accolades, and pursuits of the Class of 2024 mentioning that this class received over \$14.5 million in scholarships. He asked students to "Live with intensity and focus. Take calculated risks. Challenge both yourselves and others but make sure that the needed supports for success are in place. Love with all that you have. Be patient for you never know what others are coping with. Be the one in the room whom the others can count on to speak the truth

about them when they are no longer there."

Tara Oliveira, principal of ALJ, addressed the graduating class about likening your life to a book. She stated, "Undoubtedly, you have learned a lot over the course of your four years. Think back to your first day of freshman year at ALJ. I'm sure you were nervous yet excited about the unknown. Remember the friendships that you forged in the classrooms, on the playing fields, the late nights you spent studying or laughing. These are the moments that have shaped you. That have defined the Arthur L. Johnson chapters of your life."

Students were awarded diplomas by Board of Education members. Names were announced by students Abigail Henkel and Shannon Lancellotti.

Valedictorian Grace Wright talked about following your passion and getting out of your comfort zone. She asked the class to consider, "What are you passionate about? What do you think about for hours on end that you just can't seem to shake? What do you need and crave to make yourself feel whole? What ignites a fire so big and bright inside you that it's too painful to keep it in?" She gave examples from her graduating class of different "sparks" of passion. She concluded with a message to "Carry yourself with kindness."

Ms. Poskay concluded the ceremony wishing the students "Blessings, peace, protection and happiness on all of the adventures that lie ahead of you. You will always be Crusaders and this will always be your home. Make us proud."





#### **LOCAL STUDENT TEACHERS NAMED TOP IN STATE**

Kean University

Three new teachers who recently graduated from Kean University were recognized as among the top student teachers in the state this year.

They were among 16 new teachers who received the highest commendation, Awarded with Distinction, from the New Jersey Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (NJACTE) and the state Department of Education (DOE) as clinical interns, or student teachers. In all, 63 new teachers who recently graduated from 22 New Jersey colleges were recognized as Distinguished Clinical Interns at a festive ceremony held recently at Kean University.

"I know the importance of what takes place in classrooms every day, and I am so proud of each of you," Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., told the group. "You are stepping into your role at a time when teachers are needed more than ever. I have no doubt you will have a profound impact."

Kean graduate Cristiana Rodrigues '24, who completed her student teaching in a third grade classroom at Washington Elementary School in her hometown of Union, said it was "surreal" to receive the top honor. In the fall, she will be a full-time teacher at the school, which she also attended as a child.

"I get to go back and thank all the teachers who made me want to be a teacher," said Rodrigues, who is also beginning studies at Kean this fall for a master's degree in special education - learning and behavioral disabilities.

working alongside cooperating teachers as part of their training. Stationed in classrooms throughout the state and across grades, they taught classes, prepared lessons, conducted labs and served as role models to children.

The state education department and NJACTE also recognized the cooperating classroom teachers who worked with the student teachers. New Jersey Acting Education Commissioner Kevin Dehmer and Assistant Commissioner Jorden Schiff, Ed.D., both took part in the ceremony.

"This collaboration between cooperating teachers and clinical interns exemplifies how much we can accomplish for New Jersey's students by working together," Dehmer said. 'These remarkable individuals stand at the intersection of learning and teaching, and their commitment serves as an inspiration to many."

Monmouth Regional High School social studies teacher Joseph Nappi, the 2023-2024 State Teacher of the Year, also spoke at the ceremony. Nappi, who works closely with the Holocaust Resource Center at Kean and teaches an elective class on the Holocaust, genocide and humanity that gives his students Kean credit, congratulated both the new teachers and the cooperating teachers.

"This is an amazing profession," Nappi said, "one that will impact, by the time you're done, thousands of minds."
