## **WHARTON ARTS STUDENTS PERFORM AT METS GAME**

Wharton Arts is located in Berkeley Heights, New Providence, and Paterson, NJ and reaches students from 12 counties. The New Jersey Youth Chorus (NJYC), a program of Wharton Arts, finished the 2023-24 season on a high note by singing the National Anthem at Citi Field prior to the Mets vs Padres game on June 14th.

100 choristers from the Union County, NJ non-profit youth choral education program, in grades 3-12, descended on the ballpark to celebrate American independence, bravery, and heroism by lifting their voices in song. NJYC sings the Star-Spangled Banner at Citi Field biannually.

The young singers' performance at the Mets game rounded out a season of community engagement and performances, including singing at Radio City Music Hall in December and an April performance of Carmina Burana in Mendham, NJ. Additionally, the New Jersey Youth Chorus was recently named the recipient of the 2024 Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant presented by Chorus America and the American Composers Forum, which will support a composition to be premiered next season by the Chorus.

Wharton Arts is New Jersey's largest independent nonprofit community performing arts education center serving over 2,000 students through a range of classes and ensembles. The 5 ensembles of the New Jersey Youth Chorus, an auditioned choral ensemble program for students in grades 3– 12, encourage a love and appreciation of choral music while nurturing personal growth and creative development. The 15 ensembles of the New Jersey Youth Symphony, which serve nearly 600 students in grades 3–12 by audition, inspire young people to achieve musical excellence through high-level ensemble training and performance opportunities. Based in Paterson, the Paterson Music Project is an El Sistema-inspired program of Wharton Arts that uses music education as a vehicle for social action by empowering and inspiring young people to achieve their full potential through the community experience of ensemble learning and playing. From Pathways classes for young children to Lifelong Learning programs for adults, the Wharton Performing Arts School has a robust musical theater and drama program and offers both private and group classes for instruments and voice for all ages and all abilities. With the belief in the positive and unifying influence of music and that performing arts education should be accessible to all people regardless of their ability to pay, Wharton Arts offers need-based scholarships.







## ADVOCATE FOR ABUSED AND NEGLECTED CHILDREN IN YOUR COMMUNITY

CASA Training Program in Clark this Fall

Child Focus is seeking dedicated community members to make a difference in the lives of abused and neglected children by volunteering as Court Appointed Special Advocates, or CASA volunteers. The next training session to become a child advocate kicks off in September at the Clark Public Library.

Each year in Union County, more than 250 children are removed from home, through no fault of their own, and placed in foster care. These children suffer a dual layer of trauma - first from the abuse and neglect that led to their placement in the child welfare system, and second from the upheaval and uncertainty that comes with being removed from the only home they've known. They need a reliable adult on their team, someone whose only agenda is speaking up for the best interests of that child.

That's where the nonprofit Child Focus' Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) program comes in. A CASA volunteer ensures a child's needs are met while in care awaiting a safe, permanent home. Advocates visit the child

regularly and connect with those in the child's life, making informed, independent, evidencebased recommendations to a family court judge. As caseworkers and resource homes frequently change, the CASA volunteer is often the only consistent adult presence in the child's life, and providing continuity during a time of turmoil and unknowns is critical.

No professional experience or prior knowledge of the child welfare system is needed, as volunteers are trained on the ins and outs of advocating for child-victims, and fully supported by CASA staff. Volunteers complete a 36-hour in-person training course that covers a wide range of topics to ensure volunteers are prepared to navigate court proceedings, build trusting relationships with children, and collaborate with caseworkers and attorneys to create a comprehensive support network.

"Our CASA training program is designed to ensure that volunteers have the tools they need to succeed in this role and advocate for what's truly in the best interests of the child or sibling group," said Erica Fischer-Kaslander, Executive Director

of Child Focus. "We teach a strengths-based approach, which helps volunteers harness the potential within each child and the support network surrounding them. It's about fostering resilience and optimism for children who have experienced very difficult circumstances, and for all those involved in their journey toward a brighter future."

In addition to educating volunteers on the child welfare system and preparing court reports, the multi-disciplinary training delves into a range of issues from trauma and mental health to poverty and cultural competency. The training incorporates role-play as well as courtroom observations, the latter of which help demystify the work. Upon successful completion of training, volunteers are equipped with the tools needed to successfully advocate for local vulnerable children, and are sworn in by a Family Court judge.

## **BROTHERS CELEBRATE 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF LIFESAVING TRANSPLANT**

#### NJ Sharing Network

On February 11, 2014, Jared Wohl, then 27, donated 65 percent of his liver to his younger brother, Cameron, then 24, who was battling primary sclerosing cholangitis (PSC), a rare autoimmune disease impacting the bile ducts of the liver, via a living donor transplant. The successful transplant marked the beginning of a new chapter for both brothers, who continue to advocate for organ and tissue donation awareness and education.

In a heartfelt celebration of the 10th anniversary of their lifesaving liver transplant, co-founders of The Wave Set Cameron and Jared Wohl of Little Falls and Livingston, NJ, have announced a philanthropic contribution of \$10,000 to the Sharing Network Foundation. This gift will support the newly established Joseph S. Roth Simulation Center, a state-of-the-art training facility at NJ Sharing Network's (NJSN's) headquarters. The Simulation Training Center is crucial for enhancing the education and training of healthcare professionals, ensuring they are well-equipped to manage organ and tissue donors and support families, ultimately helping to save more lives.

"Contributing to the Simulation Training Center and the hands-on training it will provide in a real-world setting is our way of giving back to NJ Sharing Network and the community that has supported us throughout our transplant journey. As a former educator, and having been a living transplant donor, it means so much to be able to play a part in maximizing organ donation outcomes at NJSN and helping to save and enhance more lives through education," said Jared Wohl.

"Our contribution is not just about honoring our ten-year milestone; it's about investing in the future of organ and tissue donation and ensuring that NJ Sharing Network's teams have the best A FULL CIRCLE JOURNEY training possible to make the biggest impact on the number of organs recovered and, ultimately, number of lives saved," said Cameron Wohl.

The Wave Set: Spreading Awareness and Educating

In 2013, leading up to the transplant, Jared and Cameron founded The Wave Set, an organization aimed at raising awareness and educating the public about the importance of organ and tissue donation, while showing the world that "We Are Vital to Each Other." Now a named fund of the Sharing Network Foundation, The Wave Set has been instrumental in promoting organ and tissue donor registration and supporting donor families. In 2016, they launched a crowdfunded documentary, "65 Percent," depicting their family's journey through the transplant experience and offering a poignant look at the impact of organ donation. Since then, Jared and Cameron have planned and executed speaking engagements and fundraising events to support The Wave Set's mission.

Reflecting on Ten Years of Life and Health

"It's surreal to see how far we've come since the transplant. When I'm having a tough day, I'll occasionally think back, and it helps give much needed perspective on how fragile life is and what's really important – our health. And to see my brother and nephew, it's just incredible," said Jared. Cameron echoed these sentiments, stating, "I'm so grateful to have my health. I think of all the things I've done in the time span since my transplant - going back to school, picking up hockey again, changing careers, starting a family. It helped shape me into the person I am and the outlook I have."

Cameron's post-transplant journey led him to pursue a career in healthcare. After becoming a registered nurse, he worked in the operating room at University Hospital in Newark, where he had the chance to collaborate with one of the surgeons from his transplant team. Cameron now works as a Field Clinical Specialist, introducing new therapies to physicians to optimize patient outcomes, combining his passions for patient care, relationship building, and technology.

Jared works as a Senior Account Director in SAAS sales, partnering with higher education institutions to strategize ways to improve their academic offerings, fuel skill development for staff and faculty, hire top talent, and support student career-readiness. He is also a singersongwriter and the proud father of two young boys.

#### **SUPPORTING THE JOSEPH S. ROTH SIMULATION CENTER**

The Joseph S. Roth Simulation Training Center, named and dedicated in memory of NJSN's former President and CEO, is designed to prepare clinical teams with the best hands-on learning options available to manage organ and tissue donors and support families. The center features the same advanced technologies and equipment used in partner hospitals throughout New Jersey, including patient simulators, monitors, ventilators, and advanced video technologies.

#### **LOOKING AHEAD**

With Cameron's primary sclerosing cholangitis (PSC) in remission and the recent birth of his son, Lucas John, the Wohl family has much to celebrate. The brothers, along with their families, continue their mission of spreading awareness and educating the public about organ and tissue donation. "One way we can save more lives is to get more people to sign up as registered organ donors and consider living donation," said Jared. Cameron added, "Perhaps even more important is sharing those wishes with your family."


