# RAHWAY GIRL SCOUTS - A HISTORY OF FUN, LEARNING, AND SERVICE



Juliet Gordon Low, the founder of the Girl Scouts USA, organized the first Girl Scout troop meeting on March 12, 1912, in Savannah, Georgia. Six years after the introduction of Scouting, Mrs. Mary Edmonds of Colonia, New Jersey brought twelve Rahway and Colonia girls together to form the first group of Girl Scouts in this area. Interest in scouting was on the rise across the nation and as more troops were established the need for local councils became necessary.

On March 15, 1921, an official council in Rahway was organized at a meeting held at the Ilderan Club. Girls representing each troop were present along with their parents and a number of prominent local women who were selected to serve as officers of the council. Mrs. Francis Dobbins was elected to the position of Commissioner. During the meeting, craft and skill demonstrations were given, games were played, Scout songs were sung, and merit badges awarded. The guest of honor was Mrs. Arthur Choate, President of the National Headquarters, who spoke of the aims and ideals of the Girl Scout program. She stressed that scouting "makes girls absolutely dependable, it makes them healthy, and it teaches them how to accomplish things."

Scout meetings were originally housed in a building located near the corner of West Milton Avenue and Fulton Street where the girls shared space with other tenants. In 1923, they moved into a large Victorian styled home on the corner of West Milton Avenue and Jaques Avenue that was owned by the Rahway Women's Club giving the Scouts a meeting area of their own.

A major event in the history of the Rahway Girl Scouts occurred in 1932 when Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Squier, owners of the historic St. Georges Inn (presently the Merchants and Drovers Tavern Museum) generously offered the recently renovated four-story building to the troops to use for their headquarters. Not only would the Scouts hold their meetings there, but

they would utilize the building for all manner of activities. They staged craft shows and fashion shows and held holiday parties and award Girl Scout Cookie Drives and was the perfect place for ghost stories and sleepovers. Shortly after moving into the building, the Council had it painted red after which it would become known fondly as the Girl Scout House. The building served as Scout Headquarters for 37 years (1932–1969) and was quite possibly the largest and finest Girl Scout Headquarters in the country.

Besides enjoying the fun aspects of scouting, the girls were always active in the area of community service. During the Depression years, the girls hosted holiday parties for needy children and collected clothing and food for poverty-stricken families. Throughout World War II, the Scouts participated in metal and paper drives and planted Victory Gardens. Following the war, they collected food items and sent them to the war-torn parts of Europe. In the 1960s and 1970s the Scouts assisted programs at Rahway Hospital and the Rahway Library.

Scouts have always been willing and eager to learn new things. With the cooperation of qualified volunteer leaders, the girls received training in many fields of interest including child care, dramatics, sewing, cooking, gardening, nature study, and leather and metal crafting.

The camping experience was also important in the life of a Scout. Over the decades, generations of Rahway girls attended camps with memorable names such as Camp Chickagami, Camp Wanakea, and Camp Hoover. Camp activities included swimming,

boating, hiking, camping, archery, and even horseback riding.

On June 29-30, 2012, the Rahway Scouts held ceremonies there. It was the command center for a Girl Scouts USA Centennial Celebration and Reunion in observance of the national organization's 100th Anniversary. Fittingly, the celebration took place on the grounds of the Merchants and Drovers. Activities during the two-day event included storytelling, recycling projects, trail sign reading, knot tying, beading, Museum tours, a history hunt in the Rahway Cemetery, and instructions on the basic steps of the Virginia Reel. Scouts and visitors were treated to S'mores, a Girl Scout staple, which were toasted over an open fire pit. A special commemorative patch, picturing the Girl Scout House, was created for the event and given to all participants.

Today, there are six active troops in Rahway, two of which hold their meetings at the Merchants and Drovers. Like the Scouts who came before them, the girls remain active in their service to the community. Early each spring they plant daffodil bulbs to beautify the Museum property and Veterans' Memorial Park on the adjacent corner. They participate in the City's Halloween "Trunk or Treat" event. They collect food for the Food for Friends Food Pantry and design placemats for the Food for Friends Saturday lunches. On Memorial Day and Veterans' Day, the girls place American flags on the graves of veterans who are buried in Rahway Cemetery.

In their 123-year history the Rahway Girl Scouts have been faithful to the mission of Girl Scouts – "to build girls of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place."

## **DIAGNOSING GARDEN PROBLEMS**

RUTGER'S GARDEN HELPLINE CAN HELP!

Its summertime and finally the tomatoes are next year at 'bud break. Bud break is when the ripening in New Jersey. The most popular vegetable/fruit of most home gardeners, tomatoes bring back memories of our youth. It could be a tomato sandwich with mayonnaise or just biting into a ripe tomato, this month millions of people are enjoying the taste of fresh grown Jersey tomatoes. Unfortunately, tomatoes can host many diseases that can devastate your harvest just when you are looking forward to it.

Problems aren't limited to just the vegetable garden. Annual flowers, perennials, shrubs and trees can develop diseases which if left untreated will weaken and slowly kill your plants. The best resolution is proper identification of the problem, and then the correct treatment and cure.

Vegetable problems may be the easiest to detect because we handle the plants so often when they are young. When I spot a deformed baby tomato, I pluck it off the vine so the plant's energy can be focused on better fruit. Often, I can take action then to fix the problem early.

Cultural problems that we cannot control such as a very wet and rainy spring create fungus and other viruses that can damage trees. When checking leaves be sure to turn the leaf over and look are the bottom also. Tree diseases are harder to cure. It is important to follow the directions on the label and not skip an application. Missing a timely application can allow the disease to come back. If that happens we have to start over from the beginning.

Some tree problems do not show up until summer. Rust is a form of leaf spot that if left untreated for a few years will kill a tree. I've seen this happen on trees like ornamental cherries. When you realize the tree has rust it's too late for treatment "this year". Research the problem NOW and gather the equipment to treat it early

flower petals start to crack open. After that follow the directions on the label and don't skip spraying when the time is right.

There is too much information to explain in this article, but I hope this gives you a good idea what to look for.

There are some dependable websites and knowable Farm and Garden Supply owners and employees that can help you. Luckily New Jersey has our own Cooperative Extension service.

Even landscape professionals occasionally need assistance identifying problems. Diseases of trees and shrubs or insects need to be properly diagnosed before they can be cured or controlled.

Luckily for us, Rutgers Cooperative Extension has county offices throughout New Jersey. Your county office can be found in the yellow pages or online. Rutgers Garden Helpline is staffed by trained volunteers to assist the citizens of their county with continuing educational opportunities supplied by Rutgers agricultural department during the year.



## ADVOCATE FOR ABUSED AND NEGLECTED CHILDREN IN YOUR COMMUNITY

Child Focus is seeking dedicated community members to make a difference in the lives of abused and neglected children by volunteering as Court Appointed Special Advocates, or CASA volunteers. The next training session to become a child advocate kicks off in September at the Clark Public Library.

Each year in Union County, more than 250 children are removed from home, through no fault of their own, and placed in foster care. These children suffer a dual layer of trauma - first from the abuse and neglect that led to their placement in the child welfare system, and second from the upheaval and uncertainty that comes with being removed from the only home they've known. They need a reliable adult on their team, someone whose only agenda is speaking up for the best interests of that child.

That's where the nonprofit Child Focus' Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) program comes in. A CASA volunteer ensures a child's needs are met while in care awaiting a safe, permanent home. Advocates visit the child regularly and connect with those in the child's life, making informed, independent, evidence-based recommendations to a family court judge. As caseworkers and resource homes frequently change, the CASA volunteer is often the only consistent adult presence in the child's life, and providing continuity during a time of turmoil and unknowns is critical.

No professional experience or prior knowledge of the child welfare system is needed, as volunteers are trained on the ins and outs of advocating for child-victims, and fully supported by CASA staff. Volunteers complete a 36-hour in-person training course that covers a wide range of topics to ensure volunteers are prepared to navigate court proceedings, build trusting relationships with children, and collaborate with caseworkers and attorneys to create a comprehensive support network.

"Our CASA training program is designed to ensure that volunteers have the tools they need to succeed in this role and advocate for what's truly in the best interests of the child or sibling group," said Erica Fischer-Kaslander, Executive Director of Child Focus. "We teach a strengths-based approach, which helps volunteers harness the potential within each child and the support network surrounding them. It's about fostering resilience and optimism for children who have experienced very difficult circumstances, and for all those involved in their journey toward a brighter future."

In addition to educating volunteers on the child welfare system and preparing court reports, the multi-disciplinary training delves into a range of issues from trauma and mental health to poverty and cultural competency. The training incorporates role-play as well as courtroom observations, the latter of which help demystify the work. Upon successful completion of training, volunteers are equipped with the tools needed to successfully advocate for local vulnerable children, and are sworn in by a Family Court judge.

## HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS FINISH FRESH START SECOND CHANCES PROGRAM

Fresh Start Second Chances, Inc. seeks to combat these issues by supporting students through the scholarship application process and staying in contact with them for up to a year after graduation, offering continued guidance and support.

Students who participated in the workshop expressed disbelief at being selected for scholarships worth \$1,000 or more. They credited the program with boosting their confidence and helping them produce their best work. Parents were kept informed throughout the process and appreciated the support given to their child. Fresh Start Second Chances, Inc. plans to expand the workshop to increase the number of students and scholarship goal for the 2025 graduating class.
