# **EMS TOPPED 200 CALLS IN THE MONTH IN JUNE**

Summit's EMS volunteers once again topped the 200 calls per month mark by responding to 215 in the month of June.

Calls for the month included 131 medical emergencies; 33 falls; 10 motor vehicle accidents; 16 traumatic injuries; one allergic reaction; one animal bite; nine cases of overdose or poisoning; two responses to a medical alarm; and one pedestrian struck by a vehicle. Squad Volunteers also provided two "lift assists" to patients who did not require transport to a hospital.

Ten emergency calls were answered by an off-duty "back-up crew" of volunteers responding from home or work when the on-duty crew was busy. Summit volunteers also provided mutual aid assistance five times to three neighboring towns. 13 patients transported to a hospital by Squad members also received advanced life support care from hospital-based paramedics who accompanied the Squad's ambulance. During June, Squad volunteers transported 159 patients to five different hospitals.

On at least 2 occasions during June, the Squad had all 3 ambulances responding to emergency calls and on June 12, 11 members participated in an active shooter/reunification exercise at Summit High School and Fountain Baptist Church. The Squad also hosted two CPR classes at their building and provided EMS coverage at 4 community events.

The Squad answers calls for help 24 hours a day and at a variety of locations. June responses included 77 to a patient's home or apartment; 20 for accidents or medical emergencies on streets or highways, including 4 on route 24 or 78; four in a public park; four at Summit's City Hall and three at other public buildings; nine at a local business; three at a bar or restaurant, and five at a health care professional's office. There were also

32 medical incidents at Summit's train station; 16 at a local behavioral health facility; four on the grounds of Overlook Medical Center; 15 to an assisted living facility, one at a house of worship; 13 on a sidewalk; seven in a parking lot; two at a school; and one at a public pool.

The all-volunteer First Aid Squad, responds to emergency calls 24/7, is entirely funded through private donations and does not bill for service. The Squad is always looking for new volunteers to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided. 





# **WARM HEARTS OPENS DURING HEATWAVE**

#### Summit Interfaith Council

During the recent heatwave, Summit Warm Hearts, a program of the Summit Interfaith Council, opened for three additional nights of overnight hospitality. During both the day program and overnight, case management and connection to vital services was provided by Bridges Outreach, Inc.

Summit Warm Hearts completed overnight hospitality for the 2023-2024 season in March. 56 individuals visited the overnight respite since November 1. With case management provided through Bridges Outreach, Inc. and a robust diversion process connecting individuals to services in their municipality of origin, the program saw a high rate of stabilization-20 individuals of the 56 connected to Summit Warm Hearts remain unhoused and in Summit. Overlook Family Medicine visited the overnight program to offer health checks.

Behavioral health is an ongoing challenge within the program; there was a drastic increase this year in need. The Summit Warm Hearts overnight hospitality costs a total of \$90,000.00 per year to operate in order to provide staff and a care coordinator for the safety of the overnight program.

Summit Warm Hearts thanks Beacon UU Congregation, Christ Church, Fountain Baptist Church and St. John's Lutheran for hosting and Zappia's, Tito's, Soup Kitchen 411, and Junior League of Summit for providing meals. In

addition to individual donors and houses of remains an ongoing challenge. A year-round worship, Summit Warm Hearts is supported by vital grants from the Summit Foundation, Union County, Lydia Collins deForest Charitable Trust, Bank of America, N.A., Trustee, Summit Luminary Fund, Junior League Summit, Overlook Medical Center, and Black Bear Fund.

Summit Warm Hearts will continue to coordinate with Bridges to support establishing housing for the remaining individuals who are all from Summit. At present, housing inventory

program to provide adequate emergency housing including during extended heatwaves like the present one is not possible given current funding.

The daytime respite program continues throughout the summer on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Beacon UU Congregation and Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Bridges. 



In addition to books, the Summit Free Public Library also offers borrowable items like mobile hotspots, high pressure washers, power tools, free museum passes, and much more.


