COLLECTION DRIVE FOR RISE AGAINST HUNGER – SEPT. 28

Osceola Presbyterian Church (OPC) in Clark, NJ, is thrilled to announce our annual Meal Packing Event with Rise Against Hunger, is scheduled for World Communion Sunday, October 6, 2024.

Rise Against Hunger (riseagainsthunger.org) aims to end hunger in our lifetime by providing food and life-changing aid to the world's most vulnerable, while empowering and educating the communities they serve through locally-led development programs worldwide. OPC has partnered with this organization for 7 years, and during the event, volunteers will pack 10,000 meals to support this crucial cause.

From the youngest to the oldest, everyone can participate in helping to end world hunger. This year we will hit 80,000 meals!

In order to raise funds for this mission OPC is hosting a drive on Saturday, September 28 from 2 - 3 p.m. in the church parking lot at 1689 Raritan Road, Clark. We invite the community to come

out and donate clothing, clothing accessories, shoes, small toys, stuffed animals, towels, sheets, bicycles and strollers. All proceeds will be used to help cover the costs of the meal packing event.

In addition to Rise Against Hunger, OPC supports the community with a robust food pantry program that assists many local families in need. We thank the many local groups that donate food to our Pantry so that we can keep the shelves stocked however there is increasing food insecurity and we always welcome donations!

Located next to GSP exit 136 and affectionately known as 'the little church on the parkway,' Osceola Presbyterian Church, a presence in Clark since 1943, celebrated its 80th anniversary this past year. After a devastating fire in 1989, the determined congregation rebuilt and upgraded the church, preserving all but one of the original stained-glass windows, which were saved along with the sacraments by a Clark firefighter.

William Paterson University

For graduating senior Claire Johnson, her years at William Paterson University can be chronicled in photos.

An art major graduating summa cum laude, Johnson started as a freshman at William Paterson in 2020, when all courses were online because of COVID. The Cranford native subsequently describes her early days of college as lonely. But all that quickly changed during her sophomore year when she started an on-campus job as a student photographer for the University's Marketing and Public Relations Department.

"It completely changed my college experience," says Johnson, who describes herself as shy during high school. "Working as a photographer on campus got me out of my shell and gave me a lot of confidence. I know so many more people than I ever would have expected and it made me feel so much more comfortable here."

Over the past few years, Johnson has captured a multitude of images depicting life at William Paterson, working with departments from all over campus and photographing events, people, and places—from Common Hour activities to WP jazz students performing at Dizzy's Jazz Club in New York City to musician Colin Hay at Shea Center, among many others. Her photos have graced the University website, as well as its social media pages and promotional materials.

With the encouragement of her art professor, Robin Schwartz, Johnson also took the opportunity to showcase her photography skills for her Honors College thesis in the independent track, creating a photo book of images from Governors Island, a 172-acre island in New York Harbor that includes a park, dozens of historic buildings, and educational and cultural facilities.

Johnson first began visiting the island in 2012 with her father, who is now a vice president of the Trust for Governors Island, and later did a horticultural internship there during high school. The 32-page photo book, entitled "Governor's



Island: Inside and Out," reflects Johnson's personal history and perspectives on the island as she has seen it grow and change over the years.

Her photographs chronicle both the natural beauty of the island as well as the insides and outsides of abandoned buildings and spaces that she found "beautiful in an empty way."

"My photography skills improved through critiques, looking through photos with Professor Schwartz, and revisiting Governors Island to photograph it multiple times," she says, noting that she also benefited from thesis advice and guidance from Honors College Dean Barbara Andrew and art professor James Blasi.

Images from her project were displayed this spring during her thesis class exhibit at Power Art Center and the "Here/Now" exhibition of student art at Ben Shahn Center for the Arts on campus.

Although more comfortable behind the camera than in front of it, Johnson is also one of the proud student faces portrayed in the University's new "Powerhouse" marketing campaign, where she appears on everything from Tik Tok and Snapchat video ads to the cover of the University's Admissions viewbook.

An aspiring photographer, Johnson's experience participating as a subject for the advertising portraits taken by Ologie, the University's marketing agency, was particularly interesting.

"It was super exciting to see the agency photo shoot from behind the scenes with the whole crew there. I realized that is something I would love to do myself," she says.

Other highlights of Johnson's time at WP include making close friends through Theta Phi Alpha sorority and traveling to Paris on a spring break trip with the Honors College. She is planning to pursue a career in photography after graduation.

will open with the seminal rock musical. Jesus Christ Superstar which will run from October 11 through the 27th.

Know How to Love Him', 'Gethsemane' and 'Superstar', began life as a groundbreaking rock double-album, with lyrics by Tim Rice and music by Andrew Lloyd Webber who, at the ages of 25 and 21 respectively, were just embarking on what would become extraordinarily long and successful careers. Though originally conceived as a theatre piece, no one was interested in producing it on stage, so the pair created a concept album instead. Jesus Christ Superstar is set against the backdrop of an extraordinary series of events during the final week in the life of Jesus Christ, as seen through the eyes of Judas Iscariot, one of his twelve apostles.

Released in 1970, the album's popularity rocketed with thousands of plays on FM radio. It became a #1 hit on the USA Billboard album charts 4 months after its release. It went on to be the biggest-selling album of 1971 beating the likes of such masterpieces as 'Sticky Fingers' by the Rolling Stones, 'Santana III' and John Lennon's 'Imagine'. Jesus Christ Superstar also received a 1972 Grammy nomination for Album of the Year, but lost to Carole King's Tapestry. On October 12th, 1971, Jesus Christ Superstar opened at the Mark Hellinger Theatre on

The 106th season at CDC Theatre in Cranford Broadway with Tom O'Horgan, who had previously directed the original production of Hair, directing.

CRANFORD DMC RECEIVES STATE FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SPACES

Cranford Township

Cranford's award-winning Downtown was awarded \$2.7 million in the New Jersey Fiscal Year 2025 state budget for revitalization and pedestrianization projects. This funding will directly support the Downtown's public spaces. This tremendous support will allocate financial resources to enhance accessibility, improve safety, refine the functionality, and increase the vibrancy of Downtown public spaces and provide flood mitigation remedies to businesses in the Downtown.

Over the past year, the Cranford Downtown Management Corporation (DMC) Board has been seeking the views of stakeholders and working with a planning firm to identify priority improvements for the Downtown. The effort identified opportunities to unify and expand public spaces in the heart of Cranford's downtown to benefit local businesses and residents of all ages while improving the pedestrian connections and experience with focus on accessibility and safety. The last major infrastructure improvement for the Downtown was approved nearly four decades ago.

"The last major investment in our Downtown was almost 40 years ago," said Cranford Township Commissioner and DMC Liaison Kathleen Miller Prunty. "This planned streetscape improvement project is exciting and an important reinvestment in our Downtown to make sure Cranford remains competitive and a desirable destination for shoppers and businesses."

"The DMC staff and board have long seen the

need for improved public gathering spaces within Cranford's downtown--spaces that allow for community gatherings, bolster local businesses, improve pedestrian safety and increase accessibility to all," said Kristen Mider, the DMC Board Chair. "The evergrowing popularity of our downtown as a destination--to dine, to shop, to attend the multitude of special events organized by the DMC office--makes this a logical next step. We're grateful the state understands the importance of supporting New Jersey's small downtown economies and improving safety and accessibility for all."

"This is a great opportunity for our community," said Cranford DMC Director Caren Demyen. "Cranford has long since recognized the importance of the Downtown. Back in 1985, we became the first community in New Jersey to create a Special Improvement District. I'm grateful for this support as we continue to serve our business owners, property owners and residents."

With this funding secured, Cranford will launch a broader public outreach campaign to solicit views and feedback from additional residents, Downtown business and property owners, and a range of Township Boards and Committees, including the Complete Streets Committee, the Shade Tree Commission, Environmental Commission, and Green Team. Cranford has already conducted a traffic study of potential improvements and will review the findings with the New Jersey Department of Transportation.
