EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ROCKTOBERFEST

This year's Rocktoberfest will take place on September 14 (rain date September 21) from 12:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. at Taylor Park, and admission is free! All proceeds from the day's event benefit the Millburn Education Foundation (MEF), which supports Millburn Township schools, teachers and students by making grants to support important projects around the district. The Rocktoberfest Committee is thrilled to announce the continued and expanded offerings of this year's celebration.

Featuring over thirty music bands and solo artists, this year's Rocktoberfest has multiple stages: the Bauer Center Stage, the Riverside Stage and the Low Sensory Stage. We also invite attendees to Boxcar Bar & Grill from 11:30AM through the evening: start your day with brunch, enjoy live music; and kids, immerse yourself in activities directly outside of the restaurant! After brunch, take the train or drive to Taylor Park for the main event – once that's over, head back over to Boxcar for an after-party with live music until midnight.

The Kids Zone – with inflatable rides, carnival games, face painting, tournament-style games, and more – will offer a fun-filled experience for preschoolers, high-schoolers and everyone in between. Wristbands and tickets will be sold at the event in order to gain admission into the Kids Zone, where you'll also be within hearing distance of the electrifying music coming from the Riverside Stage. Keep in mind that kids will also be able to make murals with Millburn's One River Art Studio for free by the Beer & Wine Garden.

As did last year's Rocktoberfest, this year's celebration will include a low sensory stage featuring acoustic music, which has moved

indoors to a quiet and air-conditioned space inside the Bauer Center. New to the festival, this year the area just outside of the low sensory room will include NJ Special Olympic activities, including an obstacle course and a basketball demo. we forget about the sacrifices our veteran families have to make and this country should appreciate them for this.







ALEXANDER WANG ON US TEAM TAKES 1ST AT INTL MATH OLYMPIAD

Millburn Township Public Schools

Millburn High School Junior, Alexander Wang, was one of 6 members of the First Place winning United States team at the 65th International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO) held from July 11 to 22, 2024, in Bath, United Kingdom. The United States team, is sponsored by the Mathematical Association of America's

AMC). The six high school team members also received medals for their outstanding individual performances.

The IMO is the world's premier high school mathematics competition, attracting the best young mathematicians from around the globe.

American Mathematics Competitions (MAA This year, 108 countries and 609 students competed. The US team scored 192 points, earning them first place. Individual scores are based on solutions to six challenging problems. Notably, US team members Alexander Wang and Jessica Wan placed in the top five individual rankings (third and fifth places, respectively).





On September 17th, Steve Balboni will highlight the road taken to define his career in

Major League Baseball, starting with his childhood in NH and his love of baseball from a very young age — the road from being a nineyear old not making the little league team — to being drafted by the NY Yankees. He will cover his experiences playing for the Yankees and the KC Royals, including some of the highlights of his career and some of the people who helped him along the way. He will talk about the ups and downs of his career and how it eventually led him to coaching and then scouting.

Finally, on September 24th, we will learn about the turtles, frogs, and snakes found at the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge. Our speaker will be Randi Emmer, a member of the Friends of the Great Swamp. Randi will give us an account of the types of amphibians that reside in the Great Swamp, which also was the first national wildlife refuge in the United States.

SCOUTS CONQUER PHILMONT SCOUT RESERVATION EXPEDITION

Scouting America Troop 19

Eleven members of Scouting America Troop 19, chartered at St. Rose of Lima Church in Short Hills, NJ, recently completed a memorable and challenging expedition at the renowned Philmont Scout Reservation from June 26 to July 3, 2024. The inaugural Troop 19 Philmont crew consisted of seven female scouts aged thirteen to sixteen, who showcased exceptional endurance, leadership, and teamwork throughout their high-adventure journey.

After months of rigorous training and a few days to acclimate to high altitudes, the Scouts were well-prepared to tackle the rugged terrain of Philmont, which commenced in Cimarron, New Mexico. With elevations ranging from 6,000 to 12,000 feet, the Scouts covered approximately 50 miles over five days, in addition to performing a half-day trail construction service project.

"This trek was a true test of the Scouts' skills and teamwork," said Scoutmaster James McKenna. "The Scouts showed incredible resilience and determination, tackling each challenge head-on and supporting one another every step of the way."

Philmont Scout Reservation, covering over 140,000 acres, is known for its breathtaking landscapes and historical significance. The Scouts followed trails that were once traversed by Native Americans, Spanish conquistadors, and pioneers. The experience offered not only

physical challenges but also rich educational opportunities, as the Scouts learned about the area's history, wildlife, and geology.

"I loved seeing everyone progress in confidence as the trek went on," said Life Scout Lea McKenna. "Between Day 1 and Day 7, we ended up being a fully performing team that completed a 50-mile trek in 5 days!"

Their adventure took them through various scenic camping venues, including Backache Springs, Urracca, Miners Point, Schaefer's Pass, and Clarks Fork. The Scouts conquered notable vistas such as the iconic Tooth of Time and Schaefer's Peak. Activities along the way included horseback riding, rock climbing, rappelling, navigating a challenge course, and even dodging rattlesnakes.

"The view from Schaefer's Pass was spectacular. From that vantage point, I saw the shadows of the clouds hitting the plains a couple of thousand feet below. It was surreal, and I will never see anything like that again," said Lea.

"My favorite part was doing horseback riding towards the end of the trek," said Star Scout Saanvi Saxena. "I bonded with my horse and look forward to a potential opportunity to work as a Ranch Hand at Philmont now!"

The crew leader, First Class Scout Genevieve Brazell, shared that "each member of the crew carried all their food, water, and gear, with each Scout's pack weighing up to 50 pounds. Despite the heavy loads, the Scouts remained in high spirits and motivated each other to push through the physically demanding days." Life Scout Annette Johnson added, "Staying positive and motivated while on the trail was the key to our success."

"Probably the mental aspect of having one step after the other was the most challenging," admitted Star Scout Sara Winkler. "To overcome this, I learned to live in the moment, take it slow, and simply have a great time with my fellow Scouts."

The Scouts were also joined by Assistant Scoutmasters Sandra Winkler, Jennifer Bhathena, and adult leader Santosh Kumar. Together, they fostered an environment of learning and growth, emphasizing the importance of preparation and minimalism.

"Bring only what you need (food and water weigh a lot!) and make sure to train in advance," advised Scoutmaster McKenna.

Originally, the Scouts planned to raft the Royal Gorge, but the extreme water flows exceeding 5,000 cubic feet per second proved too dangerous. Undeterred, they moved upstream to the equally challenging Big Horn Sheep Canyon, where they successfully conquered thrilling Class 4 rapids, showcasing their bravery.

Reflecting on the experience, Genevieve shared insights about her role as crew leader. "Philmont taught me a lot about leadership and how important it is to stay positive and to think with a clear head even during challenging situations."

Other leadership roles included Life Scout Caroline DeSoe as the Wilderness Guide, responsible for teaching and enforcing Leave No Trace principles, and Sara as the Chaplain Aide, who led devotionals and helped Scouts earn the Duty to God patch.

"It was so rewarding seeing this group of girls progress as a team, overcome challenging obstacles, and achieve more than they thought possible," said Scoutmaster McKenna.

Eagle Scout Kelsey Quane added, "Philmont was such an eye-opening experience, and I would encourage others to attend. I can say it truly challenged and inspired me, and I definitely want to return."

As the Scouts returned home, they carried with them a wealth of memories, skills, and a renewed sense of confidence. Their journey at Philmont Scout Reservation not only tested their limits but also strengthened their bonds and deepened their appreciation for nature and teamwork.


