FIRE SAFETY TIPS FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

Summit Fire Department

The City of Summit Fire Department is issuing a series of campus fire safety tips for college students to use during the school year. U.S. fire departments respond to an estimated annual average of 3,870 structure fires in dormitories, fraternities, sororities, and offcampus housing. According to the U.S. Fire Administration, from 2000 to 2015, 85 fires that resulted in 118 fatalities occurred on a college campus.

"The Summit Fire Department recognizes that going to college is an exciting time for students and their families," explains Fire Chief Eric Evers. "Living away from home for the first time not only gives young adults more freedom to make their own choices, but it also puts upon them an increased level of personal responsibility while at school. When it comes to on- and off-campus housing, it's important to educate students on fire safety."

The following safety tips from the National Fire Protection Association can be used to ensure a fire-safe environment on campus.

- · Look for fully sprinklered housing when choosing a dorm or off-campus housing.
- sleeping room has a smoke alarm, or your dormitory suite has a smoke alarm in each

living area as well as the sleeping room. For the best protection, all smoke alarms in the dormitory suite should be interconnected so that when one sounds, they all sound.

- If you live in an apartment or house, make sure smoke alarms are installed in each sleeping room, outside every sleeping area, and on each level of the apartment unit or house. For the best protection, all smoke alarms in the apartment unit or house should be interconnected so that when one sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least monthly, and never remove batteries or disable the alarm.
- Learn your building's evacuation plan and practice all drills as if they are the real thing.
- If you live off campus, have a fire escape plan with two ways out of every room.
- When the smoke alarm or fire alarm sounds, get out of the building quickly and stay out.
- Check with your local fire department for any restrictions before using a grill, fire pit, or chiminea.
- Check your school's rules before using electrical appliances in your room.

ELAINE ANDERSON SWORN IN AS CASA VOLUNTEER FOR FOSTER YOUTH

Child Focus

Elaine Anderson of Summit was sworn in as a CASA volunteer on June 11th alongside training classmates Patience Opaola of Linden, Loretta Gadson of West Orange, Kathleen Oates-Nies of Westfield, Christine Larrabee of Cranford, and Robert Tracy of Cresskill.

Union County Superior Court Judge Rosalba Comas presided over the swearing-in of the newly trained volunteers, and each can now be assigned to work with children living in foster care through no fault of their own, advocating for

met while in the child welfare system.

"As a volunteer opportunity, CASA brings it all together for me," Anderson shared. "The organization allows me to have a meaningful impact on my local community with a purpose that I truly believe in. Every child deserves a chance."

The nonprofit organization Child Focus operates CASA of Passaic and Union Counties, and its goal is to provide a CASA volunteer for each of the more than 250 child-victims in Union County foster care. Currently, just 30 percent of these vulnerable infants, children, and teens have the continuity and support of a CASA volunteer serving as extra eyes and ears for judges hearing their cases. The need is critical for additional volunteers to step up and serve waiting children.

Judge Comas expressed her gratitude for the CASA program and the volunteers' commitment to the children they serve. "If I really want to know what's happening with a child I listen to the CASA worker, because they are 100% in tune with everything that the child needs, and everything that's happening in the child's life,"

Since caseworkers, attorneys, and foster homes are ever-changing, the CASA volunteer - or advocate – is a much-needed constant in a child's life, committing to work with the child until they reach permanency in a stable home and the case closes. Children assigned a CASA volunteer are more likely to receive services, spend less time

their best interests and ensuring their needs are in the foster system, and experience significantly better outcomes than those without an advocate.

Becoming a CASA requires no special skills or background in child welfare. Child Focus provides thorough training on the ins and outs of advocating for abused and neglected children, and volunteers are fully supported by CASA program staff. Volunteers visit the children at least monthly and get to know the people in the child's life, such as foster parents, biological parents, teachers, therapists, and attorneys in order to make unbiased recommendations to the family court judge that support the child's best interests.

There is an urgent need for additional community members to speak up for abused and neglected children. The first step to becoming an advocate is to attend an information session. SUMMIT EMS RESPONSES – JULY 2024

Summit's EMS responded to 196 emergency calls during the month of July.

Calls for the month included 119 medical emergencies; 23 falls; 7 motor vehicle accidents; 21 traumatic injuries; two allergic reactions; three cases of overdose or poisoning; two cases of heat exhaustion; five responses to a medical alarm; two pedestrians struck by a vehicle; and 1 response to a fire scene. Squad Volunteers also provided two "lift assists" to patients who did not require transport to a hospital as well as 2 nonemergency transports of Summit residents.

12 emergency calls were answered by an offduty "back-up crew" of volunteers responding from home or work when the on-duty crew was busy. Summit volunteers also provided mutual aid assistance five times to three neighboring towns. 20 patients transported to a hospital by Squad members also received advanced life support care from hospital-based paramedics who accompanied the Squad's ambulance. During July, Squad volunteers transported 142 patients to three different hospitals.

On 2 separate occasions during July, the Squad had all 3 ambulances responding to emergency calls or stand-by events. The Squad also hosted two CPR classes at their building and provided EMS coverage at 4 community events, including Summit's Independence Day activities, Summit Community Night, and the Mt. Carmel Festival in Berkeley Heights.

The Squad answers calls for help 24 hours a day and at a variety of locations. June responses included 80 to a patient's home or apartment; 19 for accidents or medical emergencies on streets

or highways, including 4 on route 24 or 78; seven in a public park; two at Summit's City Hall; three at Summit's Public Library, and six at other public buildings; nine at a local business; seven at a bar or restaurant, and eight at a health care professional's office. There were also 11 medical incidents at Summit's train station; three at a bus stop; 12 at a local behavioral health facility; three on the grounds of Overlook Medical Center; 13 to an assisted living facility, two at a house of worship; seven on a sidewalk; two in a parking lot; and two at a public pool.

The all-volunteer First Aid Squad, responds to emergency calls 24/7, is entirely funded through private donations and does not bill for service. The Squad is always looking for new volunteers to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided.
