HANDS-ON LEARNING AT STEM CAMP IN WESTFIELD

Westfield Public Schools

The popular Westfield STEM Camp again welcomed students in grades 3-8 this summer, offering hands-on, problem-based learning in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

During the week-long, half-day sessions in July, STEM campers participated in four workshops among a selection of 12 courses, including the newly offered Solar Boat Racing, with campers exploring the world of renewable energy and engineering as they built their own solar-powered boat racer. Also, back by popular demand, was Scratch Programming, a workshop where students used Scratch, a programming interface developed at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), to create a computer-based game.Other courses included CSI Forensics, Stop Motion Animation, Engineering Design Challenges, Robotics Explorations, Flight Engineering, Surviving a Disaster, Mind-Blowing Science, Makey Space, Mission Impossible, and DNA: Cracking the Code of Life.

"STEM activities promote a child's natural curiosity. They are given the opportunity to be inventive and collaborative as they learn to solve problems," say camp co-directors Sean Bonasera and Laura Paiva. "We want all campers to

develop a can-do attitude and see that they can design solutions and build things no matter what their age. We hope the exposure to our activities will encourage them to dive deeper into new STEM skills and concepts that will help them both in school and later in life."

The courses are taught by Westfield Public School teachers with a passion for STEM education. Co-directors Bonasera and Paiva teach technology education and computer science technology, respectively, at Edison Intermediate School.

"All workshops are developed to provide fun, but meaningful, hands-on learning," says Paiva.



The Westfield Public School District's Extended School Year (ESY) Program recently wrapped up its 22nd summer, assisting students with Individualized Educational Plans (IEPs) in preventing skill regression and preparing for the upcoming school year.

"The ESY Program is for students with IEPs who would benefit from maintaining skills during the summer months to prevent learning loss," says ESY Supervisor Julia Torres, praising the district teachers and paraprofessionals who support the students in the program. "It also is a way for students from across the district to meet each other and form friendships."

The district's ESY program operated from July 2-August 7, serving approximately 126 students in preschool through grade twelve. The

instructional day was structured with a focus on maintaining language arts and math skills, along with the students' IEP goals. The schedule allowed for opportunities to learn and build on important social-emotional and other skills as well.

"We had some fun activities this year, including a visit with a librarian from the Westfield Memorial Library and physical education classes, with members of the Westfield High School girls and boys basketball teams volunteering their time to help the younger students," Torres says. "The students enjoyed a visit from a therapy dog, along with a weekly "Peaceful Playground" program where they focused on cooperative play, taking turns, and creative thinking to foster teamwork and positive play interactions."





for working with adult students in one of three categories: English as a Second Language (ESL), Job Readiness Skills or Basic Skills.

Five training sessions will be conducted online via Zoom. The five required sessions will take place on September 10, September 17, September 24, October 1 and October 8 from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. The 6th training session will be at the Elizabeth Public Library on Tuesday October 15 at 6 p.m.

After completing the training sessions, tutors are matched with a small group of adult students from the growing waiting list of students who need to improve their literacy skills. Tutors meet with their students for 2 hours per week. After meeting your students, tutor trainees may be



matched with a tutor mentor to guide them through their first lesson plans. New tutor volunteers are asked to make a commitment of at least 50 hours of instruction with students.

Literacy New Jersey provides ongoing supervision and support to tutors in the form of free Professional Development workshops on specific topics such as Digital Literacy, ESL Conversation, and Citizenship.

To volunteer, you must be at least 18 years old, able to speak English and willing to tutor in Union County. You do not need to have any teaching experience, and you do not need to speak a foreign language. The training will provide volunteers with techniques and strategies for working with adult learners, as well as sample instructional materials and activities. JESUS CHRIST SUPERSTAR COMING TO CRANFORD

will open with the seminal rock musical, Jesus Christ Superstar which will run from October 11 through the 27th.

The legendary score, which includes 'I Don't Know How to Love Him', 'Gethsemane' and 'Superstar', began life as a groundbreaking rock double-album, with lyrics by Tim Rice and music by Andrew Lloyd Webber who, at the ages of 25

The 106th season at CDC Theatre in Cranford and 21 respectively, were just embarking on what would become extraordinarily long and successful careers. Though originally conceived as a theatre piece, no one was interested in producing it on stage, so the pair created a concept album instead. Jesus Christ Superstar is set against the backdrop of an extraordinary series of events during the final week in the life of Jesus Christ, as seen through the eyes of Judas



Iscariot, one of his twelve apostles.

Released in 1970, the album's popularity rocketed with thousands of plays on FM radio. It became a #1 hit on the USA Billboard album charts 4 months after its release. It went on to be the biggest-selling album of 1971 beating the likes of such masterpieces as 'Sticky Fingers' by the Rolling Stones, 'Santana III' and John Lennon's 'Imagine'. Jesus Christ Superstar also received a 1972 Grammy nomination for Album of the Year, but lost to Carole King's Tapestry. On October 12th, 1971, Jesus Christ Superstar opened at the Mark Hellinger Theatre on Broadway with Tom O'Horgan, who had previously directed the original production of Hair, directing.

The cast is led by Jared Milian as Jesus, Blaze Levario as Judas, Melissa Calicchio as Mary, Corey Chichizola as Caiaphas, Shane Long as Herod, Robbie Stevens as Peter, Michael Fleischer as Pilate and Danielle Bouie as Simon. Joining them as Apostles, Priests and Ensemble will be Asher Cerreto, Arielle Dance, Alex Foreman, James Hahn, Ranai Jones, Gene Juanich, Kaite Kane, Alexandra Marcinak, Erica Vieira, Edgar Hidalgo, Joe Rodriguez, Michelle Sblendorio, Christina Cruz, Haley Deluna and Nikki Scavone.
