CLARK VES REMEMBERS THOSE LOST ON 9/11

The Clark Volunteer Emergency Squad (CVES) attended Clark Township's 9/11 Memorial. Clark resident James Nelson, an 18-year veteran with the Port Authority Police Department, walked into the towers that day. He saved lives, but lost his in the process.

The squad had a significant presence during the aftermath of the attack. CVES Life Honorary Member and current Township Business Administrator, James Ulrich, was working in lower Manhattan during the attack and used his skills to help others.

Mayor Bonaccorso introduced EMT Gary Wagner to speak. The Mayor also thanked Gary for his fifty years of service to the squad. Gary told how the CVES captain at that time, Lorraine Podraza (who is still a member) organized a crew and they went to Jersey City. They spent hours triaging people coming by ferry from Manhattan. Later, CVES was needed in Hoboken to continue with rescue efforts.





CELEBRATE LOCAL HISTORY AT WASHINGTON ROCK

The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will participate in Somerset County's Journey Through the Past history tour on Sunday, October 13, 1-3 p.m. at Washington Rock State Park in Green Brook, weather permitting. Members of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter will be on hand to help tell the story of this famous landmark.

According to local tradition, George Washington used this outcrop on the Watchung Mountains as an observation point in 1777. When the site was in danger of being sold to a quarry in 1909, the family of a DAR member purchased 20 acres that included the rock and deeded the land to the State of New Jersey. The Continental Chapter then led efforts to erect a

monument at the site.

The Green Brook Cultural, Heritage and Historic Preservation Committee is hosting the event at the park that includes a visit by George Washington (re-enactor Sam Davis) at 1 p.m. Washington spent more than 40 percent of the Revolutionary War in and around the Watchung Mountains.

The DAR is a nonprofit service organization open to women 18 and over who can prove descent from an individual who aided the cause of independence during the American Revolution.



LONG-TIME PUPPY RAISERS HONORED

The Seeing Eye

The Seeing Eye recently honored five longtime puppy raisers with induction to "The Seeing Eye 21 Club", a special honor for volunteers who have raised at least 21 Seeing Eye® puppies. The

non-profit also honored the Seeing Eye puppy raising club volunteers with two awards, the Outstanding Leader Award and the 20-year Leader Award. Finally, 34 exceptional college-bound puppy raisers were awarded college scholarships totaling \$64,000.

"Each year, The Seeing Eye's Family Day is a celebration of all the hard work and dedication of our volunteer puppy raising families," said Seeing Eye director of canine development Peggy Gibbon. "An army of volunteers provides each Seeing Eye puppy with a loving home environment, socialization, and basic training that prepares them to become Seeing Eye dogs for people who are blind."

"We're actively recruiting puppy raisers and puppy sitters for our upcoming litters that are planned for the coming months. If you're interested in joining our community of dog lovers, now is a great time to reach out to us and learn what puppy raising is all about," said Gibbon. "We need homes and families of all shapes and sizes for our puppies because fully trained Seeing Eye dogs are placed in similarly diverse families and living situations with people who are blind."

A puppy raiser family is responsible for providing a loving and nurturing home environment for approximately one year. During that time, the raiser is responsible for teaching basic obedience, house manners, bringing the puppy to Seeing Eye puppy club meetings and socialization trips in their area. The Seeing Eye puppy could be a German shepherd, Labrador retriever, golden retriever, or a Labrador/golden retriever cross.

Puppy raisers must live within New Jersey, eastern Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware or New York (Rockland or Orange Counties) so they can attend regular puppy club meetings where they will receive help and coaching with their puppies. All veterinary expenses are covered by The Seeing Eye and a stipend is provided to help cover the cost of dog food. If a Seeing Eye puppy does not graduate from the program, the family who raised the puppy is offered the first option to adopt the puppy they raised. For more information visit seeingeye.org/raise.

Established in 1929, The Seeing Eye provides specially bred and trained dogs to guide people who are blind. Seeing Eye dog handlers experience greatly enhanced mobility and independence, allowing them to retain their active lifestyles. The Seeing Eye is a 501(c)3 non-profit supported by contributions from individuals, corporations and foundations, bequests, and other planned gifts.



AMERICAN REPERTORY BALLET PRESENTS WONDERMENT

American Repertory Ballet's 2024-2025 season opens with WONDERMENT, a program sure to delight both audiences new to ballet and aficionados alike. Presented at the New Brunswick Performing Arts Center (NBPAC) on Friday, October 18 through Sunday, October 20, 2024, WONDERMENT is a mixed bill of four unique and exciting dance works: Antony Tudor's Little Improvisations, Lar Lubovitch's Something About Night, the Swan Lake "Black Swan Pas de Deux and Coda," and the world premiere of a new ballet choreographed by Ethan Stiefel, ARB's Artist in Residence.

Antony Tudor's Little Improvisations depicts two children playing in an attic on a rainy day. Choreographed for one man and one woman, the ballet premiered at Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival in 1953, and features music by Robert Schumann. From Amanda McKerrow and John Gardner at the Antony Tudor Ballet Trust: "It is always an immense pleasure for us to share Antony Tudor's work with new generations of dancers, but we are particularly delighted to be staging Little Improvisations at ARB. Both Ethan Stiefel and Gillian Murphy are highly respected longtime friends and colleagues and we are thrilled to be working together again. An added joy for us is that Gillian will be involved in the staging this time and sharing her experiences of when she danced this ballet at University of North Carolina School of the Arts."

Something About Night is "danced to Schubert's tender choral songs about the mysteries of the heart," says choreographer Lar Lubovitch. "Something About Night offers a glimpse into the art of stillness. An opportunity for the dancers and the viewers to share a moment of quiet in a world that has become profoundly noisy." ARB Executive Director Julie Diana Hench says: "It is an honor to have Mr. Lubovitch working directly with our talented artists, and we are delighted to feature his beautiful ballet in the opening program of our 2024-2025 season."

The renowned Swan Lake "Black Swan Pas de Deux and Coda" is an iconic display of technical bravura. This excerpt from Act III of the classic ballet tells the story of Prince Siegfried as he is seduced by Odile, the Black Swan, daughter of the evil Von Rothbart, and the doppelganger of Odette, the White Swan. This pinnacle moment in the tragic tale seals Odette's fate, as Siegfried had previously declared his undying love to her in order to break Von Rothbart's mystical spell trapping her as a swan.

WONDERMENT features a world premiere choreographed by American Repertory Ballet's Artist in Residence Ethan Stiefel. This new ballet is inspired by prolific baroque composer, conductor, and ballet dancer Jean Baptiste Lully, and one of his protégés, Marin Marais. From Stiefel: "In the 1990's, I was introduced to, and mesmerized by, the viol or viola da gamba, particularly through the artistry and musicianship of Jordi Savall. Many years later, I have found myself in a place where the opportunity has arisen in which I can celebrate the many years of inspiration this music has provided to me. A

chance to create a ballet that looks to imbue the drama, reverence and illuminations within the baroque musical and dance canon, although not necessarily by way of pursuing a completely historical or biographical approach to the movement."
