SENIORS PICNIC BRINGS COMMUNITY TOGETHER



CELEBRATE LOCAL HISTORY AT WASHINGTON ROCK



The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) will participate in Somerset County's Journey Through the Past history tour on Sunday, October 13, 1-3 p.m. at Washington Rock State Park in Green Brook, weather permitting. Members of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter will be on hand to help tell the story of this famous landmark.

According to local tradition, George Washington used this outcrop on the Watchung Mountains as an observation point in 1777. When the site was in danger of being sold to a quarry in 1909, the family of a DAR member purchased 20 acres that included the rock and deeded the land to the State of New Jersey. The Continental Chapter then led efforts to erect a monument at the site.

The Green Brook Cultural, Heritage and Historic Preservation Committee is hosting the event at the park that includes a visit by George Washington (re-enactor Sam Davis) at 1 p.m. Washington spent more than 40 percent of the Revolutionary War in and around the Watchung Mountains.

The DAR is a nonprofit service organization open to women 18 and over who can prove descent from an individual who aided the cause of independence during the American Revolution. Based in Green Brook, the chapter serves areas of Somerset, Middlesex and Union counties. New members are welcome. Contact the chapter at ESCchapterDAR@gmail.com.



CONSTITUTION WEEK PROCLAMATION TO DAR

The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) accepted a Proclamation from Green Brook Township that declared September 17-23, 2024, as Constitution Week. Members of Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter DAR had requested the Proclamation, presented by Mayor Jim Van Arsdale at the September 3 Township Committee meeting.

The Proclamation stated that "More than two centuries ago, our Founders set in motion the most extraordinary experiment of selfgovernment the world has ever known with three

simple words: 'We, the People.' These timeless words from our Constitution help capture the very idea of America — that we are all created equal and deserve to be treated equally throughout our lives."

DAR is a nonprofit, nonpolitical service organization open to all women 18 and older who can prove descent from a patriot of the American Revolution. Founded in 1896, Elizabeth Snyder-Continental Chapter is based in Green Brook.



LONG-TIME PUPPY RAISERS HONORED

The Seeing Eye

The Seeing Eye recently honored five longtime puppy raisers with induction to "The Seeing Eye 21 Club", a special honor for volunteers who have raised at least 21 Seeing Eye® puppies. The non-profit also honored the Seeing Eye puppy raising club volunteers with two awards, the Outstanding Leader Award and the 20-year Leader Award. Finally, 34 exceptional collegebound puppy raisers were awarded college scholarships totaling \$64,000.

"Each year, The Seeing Eye's Family Day is a celebration of all the hard work and dedication of our volunteer puppy raising families," said Seeing Eye director of canine development Peggy Gibbon. "An army of volunteers provides each Seeing Eye puppy with a loving home environment, socialization, and basic training that prepares them to become Seeing Eye dogs for people who are blind."

"We're actively recruiting puppy raisers and puppy sitters for our upcoming litters that are planned for the coming months. If you're interested in joining our community of dog lovers, now is a great time to reach out to us and learn what puppy raising is all about," said Gibbon. "We need homes and families of all shapes and sizes for our puppies because fully trained Seeing Eye dogs are placed in similarly diverse families and living situations with people who are blind."

A puppy raiser family is responsible for providing a loving and nurturing home environment for approximately one year. During that time, the raiser is responsible for teaching basic obedience, house manners, bringing the puppy to Seeing Eye puppy club meetings and socialization trips in their area. The Seeing Eye puppy could be a German shepherd, Labrador retriever, golden retriever, or a Labrador/golden retriever cross.

Puppy raisers must live within New Jersey, eastern Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware or New York (Rockland or Orange Counties) so they can attend regular puppy club meetings where they will receive help and coaching with their puppies. All veterinary expenses are covered by The Seeing Eye and a stipend is provided to help cover the cost of dog food. If a Seeing Eye puppy does not graduate from the program, the family who raised the puppy is offered the first option to adopt the puppy they raised. For more information visit seeingeye.org/raise.

Established in 1929, The Seeing Eye provides specially bred and trained dogs to guide people who are blind. Seeing Eye dog handlers experience greatly enhanced mobility and independence, allowing them to retain their active lifestyles. The Seeing Eye is a 501(c)3 non-profit supported by contributions from individuals, corporations and foundations, bequests, and other planned gifts.


