LINCOLN SCHOOL CELEBRATES “RESTART A HEART DAY”

As part of their October’s Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Month activities, The Aliver Foundation partnered with Lincoln School for Restart A Heart Day to help hearts and save lives.

“Restart a Heart Day has been held worldwide on October 16th each year since 2013 and was started by the European Resuscitation Council to increase the number of people surviving out-of-hospital cardiac arrests. The Aliver Foundation was thrilled to work with Principal Emmons and Superintendent Kinney to develop a full day of activities for each grade at Lincoln School. We look forward to partnering on more programming for Garwood’s youth,” Jill A. Pall (Founder & President, The Aliver Foundation).

Joined by Detective Christopher Czachorowski and Police Officer Eric Miller, Pall chatted with the younger students about the benefits staying hydrated, getting a good night’s sleep, physical activity, and eating well can have on the heart. They also discussed the importance of calling 9-1-1 in the event of an emergency. After spirited Q&A sessions (one of which included a student inquiry regarding a Lamborghini for the Garwood Police Department), the children listened to a reading from Hear Your Heart (this along with two other Cardiology for Kids books have been donated to the Garwood Public Library), decorated paper tubes, and used their “stethoscopes” to listen to one another’s hearts.

Pall shared some of her cardiac arrest story with the older students. During a fourth and fifth grade assembly, she and Stephanie Lovero Willix (Assistant Secretary and Life Member, Garwood First Aid Squad & Board Member, The Aliver Foundation) answered questions about sudden cardiac arrest and emergency response. “This assembly was extremely engaging and educational for the students. They were very interested and asked some really thoughtful questions,” Willix said.

The middle school assembly included a hands-on interactive CPR/AED demonstration conducted by Luciane Raibin (Vice President, Garwood

First Aid Squad), Kymm Balinth (Lieutenant, Garwood First Aid Squad), and Chuck Kleinberg (EMT, Berkeley Heights Volunteer Rescue Squad & Advisory Council Member, The Aliver Foundation). Students had the opportunity to use an AED and learn chest compressions.

“The Restart a Heart Day program at Lincoln School had a positive impact on our students. It’s wonderful that the students left school with a deeper understanding of heart health, recognizing the signs of heart problems, and knowing how to take immediate action in an emergency. Equipping our young people with important life saving skills—like calling 9-1-1, staying calm, checking for responsiveness, and, depending on age and training, possibly providing CPR —helps create a safer environment for everyone. Thank you to Jill and The Aliver Foundation crew for providing such an informative and age-appropriate public service presentation to our staff and students,” Mary Emmons (Principal, Lincoln School).

“It is vital that we educate our staff and students in the importance of life saving techniques as well as giving them awareness of their community and its resources. One true resource is the passion of Jill and The Aliver Foundation. The Garwood Public School District is grateful for the opportunity to learn from her and the organization,” added Christopher Kinney (Superintendent, Garwood Public School District).

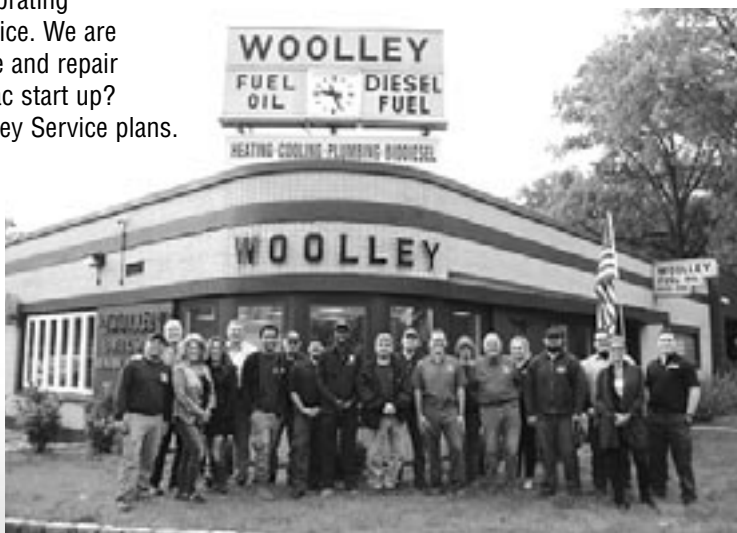
proud of all of his accomplishments, and his determination to succeed, with so much on his plate, and I'm so excited for his future."

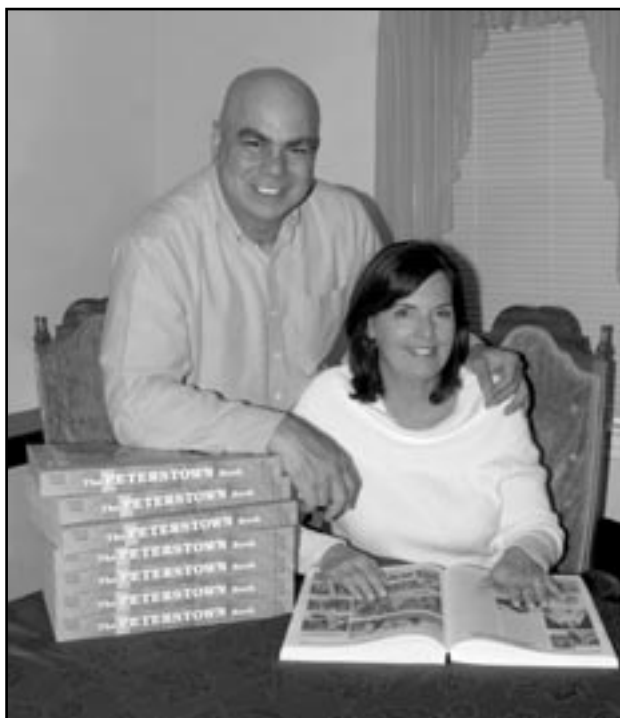
