Westfield United Fund, spoke to the Rotary club members during a recent regular lunchtime meeting.

The Westfield United Fund provides funding for programs for social service organizations in Westfield or Union County area. 92% of the donations come from Westfield residents, which is why they try to keep the donations local. The organization was started in 1938, 86 years ago.

They evaluate each recipient agency every year to see if they still need funding, and if they are using the funds properly. Last year they distributed \$375,000 and provided funding to 16 agencies. They keep their overhead down by having a lot of volunteers help them. Their service to residents involves assessing the charities' need for ongoing financial support by evaluating the urgency of funding each year and the effectiveness of the programs.

The agencies they are funding this year are: After School Tutoring; BSA Patriots Path Council; Caring Contact; Center Community Wellness; Cerebral Palsy League; Imagine; Jewish Community Center; Jewish Family Service; Literacy New Jersey; Mobile Meals of Westfield; Moms Helping Moms; St. Joseph's Social Service; Westfield Area "Y"; Youth & Family Counseling; & YWCA Union County.

Beth Saad graduated from Vanderbilt University, then worked as a recruiter in London and New York. She moved to Westfield with her family 8 years ago and became involved with the Westfield United Fund as the Social Media


