TRIVIA NIGHT RAISES \$20,000 TO SUPPORT SCHOOLS

Chatham Education Foundation

The Chatham Education Foundation (CEF) welcomed nearly 350 participants at its wildly popular 11th Annual Trivia Night, which featured ten rounds of challenging brainteasers. Teams navigated a range of questions united by a shared objective: to raise funds for Chatham's six public schools. The event raised \$20,000 for support of curriculum-enhancing teacher and administrator grants, helping to address needs that fall outside the scope of the school district's limited budget.

On Saturday November 16th, 34 teams filled the Chatham High School gym, with each team sporting coordinating names, costumes and table decor. Chatham's creativity was on full display with team names such as Risky Quizness, Nacho Average Trivia Team, Genius Bar, Snow-It-Alls, and the Blue Jeaniuses.

Best Dressed was awarded to The Social Network, with each member dressed head-to-toe as an immediately-recognizable digital platform, such as LinkedIn, SnapChat, ApplePay, and Spotify. Best Table was impressively awarded Chatham Take A Hikers, especially since they replaced their table with a campfire.

The trivia kicked off with a challenging round of little-known Chatham facts, followed by nine additional rounds such as hidden logos, history, and math puzzles. The competitive spirit of the evening culminated in the big reveal: three teams were tied for first place with 128 points each. After the tie-breaker, Hot Tub Trivia Time Machine was announced the ultimate winner of the night.

SILENT THIEF OF SIGHT: GLAUCOMA

Mayor's Wellness Campaign

January is Glaucoma Awareness Month: Glaucoma is a leading cause of irreversible blindness in the US. It has no noticeable symptoms in its early stages, and vision loss progresses at such a gradual rate that people affected by the condition are often unaware of it until their sight has already been compromised.

Glaucoma is an eye disease which involves damage to the optic nerve, most often associated with pressure build up inside the eye. Normally, a fluid called the aqueous humor flows around our eye. With those who have glaucoma, either too much fluid is produced, or it doesn't drain efficiently. The fluid builds up and causes pressure to rise inside the eye, which leads to optic nerve damage.

Glaucoma affects people of all ages, but certain groups are at higher risk.

These groups include: African Americans over age 40, Adults over age 60, Those with a family history of glaucoma, Those with diabetes

Often, no symptoms appear until the optic nerve has been significantly damaged. That's why this disease is often called a "silent thief of sight." In its later stages, glaucoma causes blind spots to appear in the peripheral (side) and central vision. Anyone who experiences these symptoms should see an eye doctor right away: Severe pain in the eye or forehead, Blurred or reduced vision, nausea and vomiting, headache, Eye redness, Halos around lights

The best way to protect your sight from

glaucoma is to get a comprehensive eye examination. If you are diagnosed with glaucoma, treatment can begin immediately. The American Academy of Ophthalmology recommends this exam every one to two years for people who are age 65 and older. African Americans and those with a family history of glaucoma should start getting checked for glaucoma as early as age 40.

Early detection is vital to stopping the progress of the disease because eye damage due to glaucoma is irreversible. There is no cure for glaucoma—yet. However, medication or surgery can slow or prevent further vision loss. The choice of therapy is based on the type of glaucoma, among other factors and can include medicated eye drops, laser treatment, and surgery. Maintaining a healthy weight, controlling your blood pressure, being physically active, and avoiding smoking will also help you avoid vision loss from glaucoma. These healthy behaviors will also help prevent other chronic conditions.





habitats. Look for them in estuaries, mudflats, and salt marshes, where they thrive throughout the winter months.

Recently, The Raptor Trust treated a Brant goose (Admit #21-4190) found in Long Valley with wounds from a predator attack. After intensive care, including suturing lacerations, treating an eye injury and parasites, this resilient bird was successfully released at Sandy Hook on November 2nd.

Tunnel to Towers Foundation.


