## **ANGEL TREE PROVIDED GIFTS FOR 125 CHILDREN IN NEED**

The fast pace at which Florham Park and surrounding community residents donated gifts under the Angel Tree continued this season. Sponsored by the Florham Park Rotary, this year the parish at Amazing Grace Lutheran Church (Ridgedale Avenue, Florham Park) joined in and was led by Pastor Beau Nelson and coordinated by parishioner Eunice Dickenson. Parishioners teamed together to select ornaments to grant wishes for disadvantaged children - children who were orphaned, in resource (aka foster) families or families struggling.

On Sunday, December 8, after service, parishioners gathered all the gifts they purchased for the children. Together they wrapped them up for delivery to the Division of Child Protection and Permanency, whose local office is in Morris Plains. Said Pastor Nelson, "We are very happy to have this partnership with the Florham Park Rotary making these donations to an important cause."

Then on Monday, December 9, two members of the Child Protection and Permanency, Jaime O'Leary and Darlene Perez, visited the Church to personally say "thank you!" and to transfer the wrapped gifts by the many parishioners to their van. They were met by parishioners Eunice Dickenson, Andrea Sullivan, and Rotarian Peter Nicolas.

Damion Bernard, Rotary club president, explained that this season, the donations added by Amazing Grace Lutheran Church helped contribute to this project wherein more than 125 children benefit. He thanked the community for another very successful holiday season. He also thanked the Florham Park Post Office for hosting the Angel Tree location again. "This really is a fine example of a community coming together" Bernard extolled.

habitats. Look for them in estuaries, mudflats, and saltmarshes, where they thrive throughout the winter months.

Recently, The Raptor Trust treated a Brant goose (Admit #21-4190) found in Long Valley with wounds from a predator attack. After intensive care, including suturing lacerations, treating an eye injury and parasites, this resilient bird was successfully released at Sandy Hook on November 2nd.


