Linden Public Schools

Linden Public Schools celebrated a significant milestone on November 15, 2024, with the grand opening of the Multilingual Learners Welcome Center, a dedicated facility designed to support the district's rapidly growing multilingual population. The event featured a ribbon-cutting ceremony and guided tour.

Danie Orelien, Director of the Multilingual Learners Department, expressed her excitement about the center, the first of its kind in Union County. The center comes at a pivotal time as the district's multilingual student population has grown substantially, from approximately 500 students in 2019 to over 1,300 in 2024. This surge reflects the diverse and varied backgrounds of families seeking new opportunities, quality education, safety, and refuge from challenging conditions, including war and persecution.

The grand opening represents the culmination of Orelien's long-standing vision and tireless advocacy for a comprehensive resource center. Recognizing the limitations of conventional language support programs, such as ESL and bilingual education, Orelien aimed to create a center that addresses the full spectrum of needs critical for multilingual learners to thrive.

The Welcome Center's mission aligns with the whole-

child approach supported by Superintendent Atiya Y. Perkins and the Linden Board of Education. This holistic framework offers a range of essential services that empower students and engage their families:

Mental Health Support – The center connects students with mental health professionals, providing a safe space for them to process migration-related challenges and nurture emotional well-being.

Social Services and Community Connections – Partnering with local organizations, the center assists families with access to financial aid, food support, and healthcare, alleviating stress and enabling students to focus on their education.

Translation Services and Parent Workshops – To bridge linguistic and cultural gaps, the center provides translation services and hosts workshops that educate parents about school policies, academic expectations, and resources, fostering stronger parental involvement.

"The Multilingual Learners Welcome Center embodies Linden Public Schools' commitment to inclusivity and holistic student support," said Superintendent Perkins.





Union County Superior Court Judge Gavin I. Handwerker presided over the swearing-in.

These volunteers, equipped to champion the best interests of child victims of abuse and neglect, join a team of hundreds of devoted advocates with CASA of Passaic and Union Counties. Child Focus, the nonprofit organization that operates this CASA program, aims to provide dedicated life-changing advocacy and support services to each of the more than 500 children living in foster care through no fault of their own, across both counties.

"These seven dedicated individuals have made an invaluable commitment to ensure that every child's voice is heard and valued. We are proud to welcome them to the Child Focus family," said Erica Fischer-Kaslander, Executive Director of Child Focus. "Each CASA volunteer brings unique perspectives and strengths that impact the lives of those who need it most. > No specific qualifications are required to become a CASA volunteer; Child Focus provides comprehensive training to equip volunteers with the skills needed to advocate effectively. Volunteers commit to visiting their assigned children at least once a month and collaborate with caregivers, educators, and other key figures in the child's life to make informed recommendations to the court.

> Child Focus urges the community to enroll in CASA winter training to support growing list of abused and neglected children awaiting an advocate. This winter, Child Focus will hold two expedited CASA training sessions, each of which cover all necessary material over two- and threeweek periods, as an alternative to the traditional six-week course.

ABOUT CHILD FOCUS:

Child Focus prioritizes the needs and wellbeing of infants, children and teens impacted by, or at risk of, abuse or neglect by amplifying their voices and working toward lasting, permanent solutions that address their unique situations and provide support needed to thrive. This critical work is accomplished through three distinct but complementary programs: CASA of Passaic and Union Counties, NJ Safe Babies Court Team, and the Open Door Store.
