MADISON ROTARY HOSTS 2024 GRANT RECIPIENTS

recipients joined members of the Madison Rotary Club on November 21, 2024, at the Madison Area YMCA. The gathering provided grant recipients with the opportunity to share the impact of their Rotary Grant and strengthen their partnership with Madison Rotary. Madison Rotary's annual grant program raises funds to address local food insecurity, support development of Madison youth and to support and partner with area nonprofits to enrich the lives of the residents of Madison. Each 2024 grant recipient had the opportunity to introduce themselves and share their mission. This year Madison Rotary awarded a total of \$38,000 in grants.

It was not just a feel-good event. The nonprofit executives shared business cards and explored ways to collaborate and share best practices with other nonprofits. Individual Madison Rotarians were motivated to support the recipient organizations financially or as volunteers.

Several comments touched heartstrings. Among them, Melanie Barry of Preschool Advantage spoke of a single mother of three young children who was able to afford childcare and work full time thanks to Rotary's grant. Bob Butts of the Baroque Orchestra told how Rotary's grant enabled a performance at a local assisted living facility where a former colleague, stricken with Alzheimer's, didn't initially recognize Butts, but his memory was rekindled after hearing their music. Stacey Smollen of the Madison Eagle

Christmas Fund explained how Rotary's grant Adult School of Chatham Madison, Baroque Thirty Madison Rotary Foundation grant help fund gift cards that provide food for the holidays or allows a parent to select an appropriate gift for their child from a local business. And Lisa Firkser, Executive Director of CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) explained that Rotary's grant helps fund the activities of CASA volunteers who provide a consistent relationship to a child who has been been removed from their parents due to neglect, abuse or abandonment.


