AHLUWALIA CONTINUES HIS UNBEATEN STREAK

Millburn Library Student Chess Tournament

In 1981, Michael Wojcio directed the first Millburn Library Student Chess Tournament sponsored by The Friends of the Millburn Library. It became an annual event which Wojcio directed for the first 30 years. On Saturday December 7, 2024, the 43rd Annual Millburn Library Student Tournament was held with the only absence being 2020, the covid year.

The tournament drew 37 children mostly from Millburn, Livingston and Maplewood into 3 sections from ages 5 to 14. Dorothy Kelly and many other Friends of the Millburn Library did a fantastic job of organizing the event. Two parents, Rajesh Sharma and Mashal Dias did a great job on the floor by confirming checkmates. tournament was directed by Master Scott Massey.

Section I (5-7 year olds) had 12 children. Sven Mao, a 6 year old first grader from South Mountain won first place by winning 3 games and one draw for a 3 1/2 out of 4 score. He was the only undefeated player in Section I. Anish Sharma, a first grader from Hartshorn Elementary School in Millburn captured second place after a playoff game over third place Manveer Kainth. Both scored 3 out of 4 wins. Honorable mention went to Enzo Puri from South Mountain and Dylan Zhang



from Collins Elementary school in Livingston both with 2 1/2 out of 4 points.

Section II (8-10 year olds) was dominated by Nikhil Begerhotta. This 8 year old from Hartshorn was the only one to win 4 successive games during the tournament with the last 2 against the second and third place finishers. A playoff decided the next three places as all three won 3 games and lost one. Second place went to Juefei Liu, a third grader from Hartshorn. Third place went to Logan Zipkin, a fourth grader from Collins. Arjun Korada, a third grader from Glenwood Elementary School in Millburn finished in fourth place.

The headline for this tournament could have been; Ahluwalia continues his unbeaten streak in Millburn Library Chess Tournaments. Five years ago, Ayansh dominated Section I by winning all 4 games. He did the same in Section II a couple of years later. Neil G. stopped the winning streak in round 4 as the game ended in a draw. These 2 seventh graders from Millburn Middle School faced each other in a playoff game. It ended in a draw so a second playoff game was needed. Ayansh won to capture first place in Section III (11-14 year olds). Neil G. took a very close second place. Third and fourth place was also decided by 2 eighth graders in a playoff game. Athary Karamcheti from Millburn Middle School took third place while Max Greenspan from Newark Academy was fourth.





Once again, our students and school community collected Thanksgiving food items and other non-perishable pantry staples to distribute to local families and local community partners serving those in need in Essex County.

Togeter, we packed more than 95 food boxes/bags that were distributed to local families, and through the Interfaith Food Pantry of the Oranges to the broader Essex County community. Mr. Connolly received his Bachelor of Arts in Education from Rowan University and his Master of Arts in Education, Human Services Leadership, from the College of St. Elizabeth.





PROCLAMATIONS RECOGNIZE CHILDREN'S GRIEF AWARENESS DAY

Imagine a Center for Coping with Loss

The Township of Millburn joined Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss, in recognizing November 21, 2024, as Children's Grief Awareness Day. Other municipalities that joined in issuing proclamations in recognition of the day included Bridgewater, Cranford, Mountainside, Raritan, Scotch Plains, Westfield, and the entire County Commissioners of Essex County.

Additionally, Governor Murphy added Children's Grief Awareness Day to the commemorative dates honored in New Jersey. Imagine would like to thank them all for their partnership in Imagine's work to ensure that all communities are aware of the need for grief support for children, teens, young adults, and all those who are grieving.

Imagine's Executive Director, Lindsay Schambach shared this about the importance of recognizing this day: "I remember, 7 years ago,

not knowing this honorary day existed, or even that there was a need for this day to be recognized at all. I was unaware that 1 out of every 13 children in our state would suffer from losing a parent or a sibling before they turn 18 years old. In 2018, I was blissfully unaware of all of this, until I started at Imagine. My husband of just 8 years, died in June 2018, June 14th to be exact, and I called Imagine about 20 days after, in a blur, unsure of what I said, or what I expected, just knowing that my son and I needed support.

In July, my son and I walked through the doors of Imagine for the first time. I don't remember much from that first visit, other than the adoration on my son's face as he lit up seeing the beauty of this grief support center. The word grief was new to him at the time. But it didn't matter. He didn't see Imagine as being a place for grief. For him, it was a place for belonging.

Our first group in September, we were

encouraged to bring a picture of the person who died. Cameron and I found a space on the wall, and I cried as we put his picture up. Cameron wiped away my tears. As we left that first night, Cameron ran down the hallway and stopped at his father's picture. "I'll see you in two weeks, Dad," he said. And just like that, his little ritual took hold. Each week, "I'm here, Dad" he said at the start of our groups. And "Bye, Dad, see you in two weeks," as the groups ended.

In November, it was our first Children's Grief Awareness Day. I was so destroyed, having to acknowledge this day. I couldn't believe that my children would be included in this. It felt like the world was playing a cruel joke, but we chose to participate in Imagine's recognition of the day.

Now, as the Executive Director of Imagine, I understand that it is all of our responsibility to advocate, to understand, to fundraise, to ensure that every child, like Cameron, and the 151,000 other children in the state of NJ, have the support that they need, when their lives fall apart, because we never know who it will happen to. We are so deeply grateful for our local municipalities that have answered the call and done their part to raise awareness!

We all share a responsibility in ensuring that children have the chance to belong to a community where they aren't just living in their grief, but are finding places of belonging, where their pain and fear and loss is welcome and acknowledged, and their joy and growth and resilience is fostered.

Thank you to everyone who helps children to feel less alone and who remembers that children are grieving every day! Not just on Children's Grief Awareness Day."
