

The Summit Foundation recently awarded \$320,000 in grants to 19 exceptional organizations dedicated to enriching the lives of people residing in the Summit area. These grants will support a wide range of impactful programs, from health and education to the arts and community services.

Highlights of the Fall 2024 grant cycle include:

Community FoodBank of New Jersey (\$50,000): Fresh produce procurement and distribution through local partners and Summit Public Schools.

Child Focus (\$25,000): CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) training for advocates of Union County children in foster

Reach Out and Read New Jersey (\$5,000): Literacy and cognitive development program for babies and toddlers at Overlook Healthstart Clinic and Family Medicine.

Arts By The People (\$3,000): Eight-week creative writing workshop for Summit residents held at Summit Free Public Library.

Opportunity Project (\$19,000): Program and facility enhancements for adults with brain injuries to support reintegration into family, work, and community life.

Summit Public Art (\$10,000): Temporary and permanent art installations in Summit.

Center for Hope Hospice (\$29,085): Replacement of medical beds for terminally ill patients.

Paper Mill Playhouse (\$15,000): Fully adapted theater experiences for children with autism and their families.

AN UNUSUAL GOOSE REHABBED AND RELEASED

The Brant goose, with its compact size and striking black-and-white plumage, is a remarkable bird. Adapted to drink saltwater, these geese embark on long migratory journeys from their Arctic breeding grounds to coastal winter

habitats. Look for them in estuaries, mudflats, and salt marshes, where they thrive throughout the winter months.

Recently, The Raptor Trust treated a Brant goose (Admit #21-4190) found in Long Valley with wounds from a predator attack. After intensive care, including suturing lacerations, treating an eye injury and parasites, this resilient bird was successfully released at Sandy Hook on November 2nd.

SUMMIT EMS RESPONSES TO CARDIAC ARREST CALLS

Volunteer First Aid Squad has responded to sixteen 9-1-1 calls for cardiac arrest, five of which occurred during the month of October alone. These life-threatening events occurred in patients' homes, exercise facilities, restaurants, public parks, doctor's offices, and in vehicles on the highway.

With any cardiac arrest, time is of utmost importance: minutes matter! Squad Chief George Shepherd reminds everyone, "Initiating CPR, as soon as possible after cardiac arrest, and utilizing an AED increases the likelihood of survival. Thanks to the rapid response of our crews, along with Police and Fire First Responders, we were able to provide lifesaving support and get these patients to the critical care they needed at the hospital. But it is important to remember that anyone on-scene should start CPR compressions."

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad, founded 62 years ago, continues to thrive despite a number of other volunteer first aid squads struggling with membership and some even closing their doors. "Our members come from a variety of career backgrounds and age groups, yet

SUMMIT EMS RESPONSES – NOVEMBER 2024

For the 3rd consecutive month, Summit's EMS volunteers answered over 200 calls with 210 emergency calls in November. Calls for the month included 111 medical emergencies; 26 falls; 18 motor vehicle accidents; 12 traumatic injuries; five pedestrians struck by a vehicle; three allergic reactions; 22 cases of overdose or poisoning; one burn injury; one animal bite; three responses to a medical alarm; and one response to a fire scene. Squad Volunteers also provided five "lift assists" to patients who did not require transport to a hospital.

Twelve emergency calls were answered by an off-duty "back-up crew" of volunteers responding from home or work when the onduty crew was busy. Summit volunteers also provided mutual aid assistance to neighboring towns nine times. Fourteen patients transported to a hospital by Squad members also received

advanced life support care from hospital-based paramedics who accompanied the Squad's ambulance. During November, Squad volunteers transported 160 patients to five different hospitals.

On November 21 the Squad responded to 2 pedestrian struck incidents simultaneously: 1 in Millburn near the train station, and another on Union Place at Summit's train station.

The Squad also hosted a blood drive and two CPR classes at their building, provided EMS coverage at two community events and provided manpower for the Other Fellow First Foundations' 17th annual Frozen Turkey Drive.

The Squad answers calls for help 24 hours a day and at a variety of locations. October responses included 79 to a patient's home or apartment; 32 for accidents or medical emergencies on streets or highways, including three on route 24 or 78; one in a public park;

three at Summit's City Hall; three at Summit's Public Library; two at Summit's Post Office, and four at other public buildings; eight at a local business; three at a bar or restaurant; one at a hotel, and 13 at a health care professional's office. There were also 18 medical incidents at Summit's train station; 11 at a local behavioral health facility; six on the grounds of Overlook Medical Center; 14 to an assisted living facility, six on a sidewalk; six in a parking lot; and eight at a school.
