NYC MARATHON TEAM RAISES \$26K FOR GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP IMAGINE

Dr. Konika Bose, a long time Westfield, NJ resident, took to the streets of New York City on Sunday, November 3rd, as she ran the TCS New York City Marathon in honor of her late brother, Kanishka Paul to support Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss. Dr. Bose, along with fellow runners, helped raise over \$26,000 for the nonprofit organization, which provides grief support to children and families.

Dr. Bose was part of a dedicated team of runners, including Caden Mika and Maddy Choate from New York, and Sunny Chang from Georgia, who raced through the five boroughs of New York City. While Florida's Michael Becker was unable to race due to an injury, he was still a significant contributor to the fundraising efforts.

Reflecting on the experience, Dr. Bose shared, "To say this was the experience of a lifetime is an understatement. I felt my brother was cheering me on the entire time, putting his hand on my shoulder and coaxing me through the course. After crossing the finish line, I simply let go and cried as I walked out of Central Park."

Imagine will find out in January if they will be selected as an official charity partner for the 2025 TCS New York City Marathon. If chosen, the organization will begin accepting applications for the 2025 marathon team in late February or early March. If you are interested in applying for a spot

on the 2025 team, you can begin checking their website, Imaginenj.org in late January.

Imagine would like to extend a heartfelt thank you and congratulations to all members of the 2024 TCS NYC Marathon Team. Their dedication and fundraising efforts have been instrumental in supporting children and families coping with loss to foster resiliency and emotional well-being for all those who grieve.

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss is a 501c3 that offers grief and loss education and training to the community and free year-round grief support groups for children ages 3-18 and young adults 19-30 who are coping with a loss due to death. Concurrently, support groups are available for the parents and guardians of the children in the groups and offered in English and Spanish. "The goal has always been to provide entertainment to the seniors while also giving them an opportunity to shop for inexpensive items in their own environment, since the majority of them lack access to transportation."

Beyond the fashion show, an additional thirty WSL volunteers set up a Boutique on the premises where items such as jewelry, toys,

scarves, handbags, hats and gloves, and holiday décor were purchased. Almost all items were \$5.00 or less. Barbara Cantor and Patty Tata co-chaired this part of the event and worked with the volunteers to sell the merchandise.

"This event is wonderful on so many levels. The seniors have fun, they can buy holiday gifts for their families and something for themselves, and we raise money for the non-profits that the WSL supports," said Barbara Cantor.

"For the second year in a row, the seniors received a special gift from Martin Jewelers in Cranford. We are grateful to owner Ellen Ramer for providing these gifts," said Patty Tata.

"I'm thrilled with the relationship we have with the Westfield Service League and thankful to Michele Williams for coordinating the Annual Fashion Show and Boutique. I also want to thank

all the volunteers who help to make this such a special event for our residents each year." said Cindy Rabinowitz, Executive Director, Cranford Senior Housing.

The WSL Thrift & Consignment Shop is located at 114 Elmer Street in Westfield. All net proceeds from the fashion show, the boutique, and the shops are given out in grants to local non-profits that the WSL supports. Last year, the WSL donated more than \$90,000 to 41 organizations.

LIFT WHILE YOU CLIMB AWARD

Westfield Public Schools

Three Westfield High School students have been recognized with the Lift While You Climb Award, in honor of the late WHS principal Dr. Derrick Nelson.

Nelson, who died in 2019 from complications suffered while donating bone marrow to a boy he didn't know in France, once said: "We have an obligation to our fellow human beings that if we are in a position to help someone, you do it. You lift as you climb. If you can do that, you have contributed more to society than anything your bank account can produce and, ultimately, contribute more to your own well-being."

Nominated by WHS faculty and staff for Fall 2024, the three recipients of the Lift While You Climb Award are 12th grader Ethan Selvers, and 11th graders Jose Flores Rodriguez and Chloe Martin.

Selvers - nominated by the WHS Counseling

Department - is described as going "above and beyond to help his school community." The counseling team writes: "As part of Model United Nations, Counseling Ambassadors, and other community service projects outside of school, Ethan shows selflessness and a genuine interest in helping others."

"Jose is a new student at WHS from Panama," writes Spanish teacher Pilar Vasconez Urigelz in her letter of nomination. "In a short time, he has demonstrated a very positive attitude towards the school and community."

In her letter of nomination, French teacher Samantha Carrington says Martin is "well-rounded and profoundly dedicated to helping the community. She volunteers at Children's Specialized Hospital and for a rescue squad."

The award is sponsored by the WHS Counseling Department twice during the academic year, in the fall and the spring.

Ellen Devin of Westfield proudly took the oath as a volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) on Nov. 1, 2024 along with fellow trainees Deirdre Monroy of Scotch Plains, Kathleen McMahon of Cranford, Lydia Hernandez-Walford of Bayonne, Esther Paden of Linden, and La Wrence Burroughs and Tisa Joyner-Nance of Rahway. Union County Superior Court Judge Gavin I. Handwerker presided over the swearing-in.

These volunteers, equipped to champion the best interests of child victims of abuse and neglect, join a team of hundreds of devoted advocates with CASA of Passaic and Union Counties. Child Focus, the nonprofit organization that operates this CASA program, aims to provide dedicated life-changing advocacy and support services to each of the more than 500 children living in foster care through no fault of their own, across both counties.

“These seven dedicated individuals have made an invaluable commitment to ensure that every child’s voice is heard and valued. We are proud to welcome them to the Child Focus family,” said Erica Fischer-Kaslander, Executive Director of Child Focus. “Each CASA volunteer brings unique perspectives and strengths that impact the lives of those who need it most. There is a waitlist of children awaiting an advocate, and we urgently need community members to step up to serve. We encourage anyone interested in supporting vulnerable children to attend an upcoming information session to learn how they can make

a difference.”

No specific qualifications are required to become a CASA volunteer; Child Focus provides comprehensive training to equip volunteers with the skills needed to advocate effectively. Volunteers commit to visiting their assigned children at least once a month and collaborate with caregivers, educators, and other key figures in the child's life to make informed recommendations to the court.

Child Focus urges the community to enroll in CASA winter training to support growing list of abused and neglected children awaiting an advocate. This winter, Child Focus will hold two expedited CASA training sessions, each of which cover all necessary material over two- and three-week periods, as an alternative to the traditional six-week course.

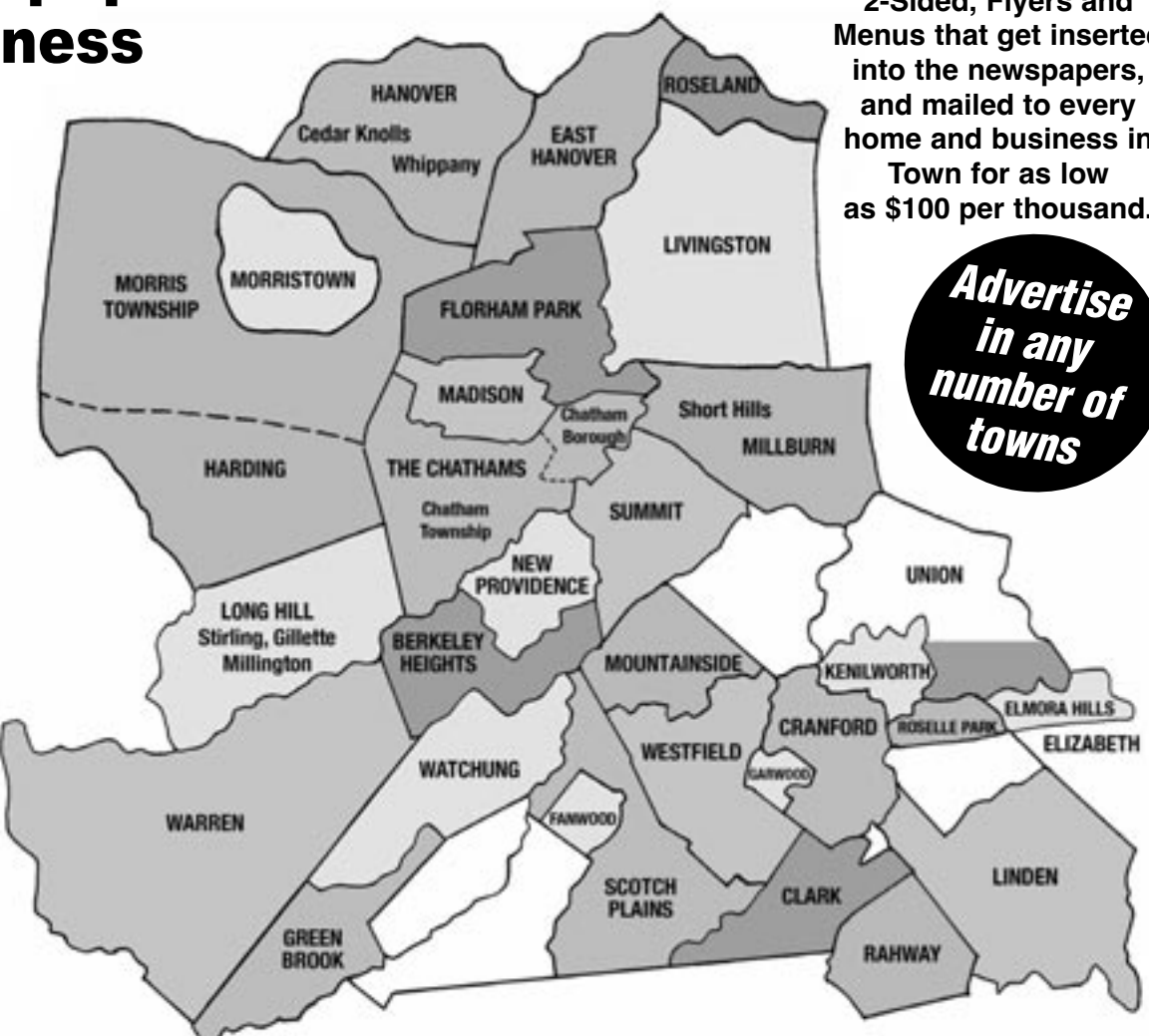
