CAROLYN GEORGE RECOGNIZED FOR AED ENCLOSURE

The Aliver Foundation

In celebration of The Aliver Foundation's first anniversary, local business partners, community leaders, first responders, donors, and new friends gathered at the Berkeley Heights Volunteer Rescue Squad on January 23, 2025.

The highlight of the evening was when The Aliver Foundation surprised a few individuals who helped make 2024 phenomenal including Berkeley Heights Township's Associate Recreation Director, Carolyn George, who spearheaded the community's efforts in investing in a lifesaving equipment bundle for Lower Columbia Park. Back in May, BHVRS's Chuck Kleinberg (now a board member with The Aliver Foundation) arranged for a meeting between the organization and Ms. George. She was extremely passionate about bringing an allweather, climate controlled outdoor AED enclosure to Berkeley Heights and made sure this equipment was ordered as quickly as possible. Every town in the United States needs

a champion like Carolyn George.

Founder, Jill A. Pall and Board Treasurer, Pamela Lips, discussed what The Aliver Foundation accomplished in just one year's time, including being directly responsible for over 100 all weather, climate controlled AED enclosures having been installed in outdoor public recreation spaces, ensuring lives can be saved 24/7/365; providing over 2000 hours of mental health support for cardiac arrest survivors and their loved ones through their Healing Hearts program, facilitated by a trauma therapist; educating more than 650 people on the stats of cardiac arrest, CPR, and AED usage at nine in-person events; and having content viewed nearly 120,000 times through their social media channels and website.

Ms. Pall and Ms. Lips said that 2024 was a testament to how remarkable things can happen when we work together. They also talked about the organization's 2025 focuses which include deepening relationships with the communities they worked with last year, leaning into education, encouraging counties and communities to invest in outdoor enclosures, and supporting businesses and individuals who want to bring lifesaving equipment to their neighborhoods.

The Aliver Foundation is grateful to the Berkeley Heights Volunteer Rescue Squad for their hospitality and thanks Stop & Shop Berkeley Heights for their generous food and beverage donation.

RESIDENTS REMINDED TO PREVENT FATBERGS

Township of Berkeley Heights

Ever wonder what happens to the grease you dump down your drain? Well, it's going into our sewer system and causing massive "fatbergs" in our sewer pipes, which can cause serious sewer backups in your home, particularly if you have a finished basement with a bathroom. This is not a system fault; fats, oils and greases (FOG) should never be put down the drain in any sewer system. And neither should baby wipes - even the "flushable" ones; they are not actually flushable and contribute to clogs.

As part of the ongoing efforts to maintain the health and efficiency of our town's sewer system, the Township of Berkeley Heights is issuing a crucial advisory to all residents about fatbergs. A fatberg is a massive, rock-like mass of waste matter in a sewer system formed by the combination of flushed non-biodegradable solids (such as wet wipes) with fat, oil, and grease

(FOG) deposits that have cooled and congealed to create sludge blockages in the system. Scraps Berkeley Heights and protect their property by and leftovers from dishes and cooking that are following these few simple steps: washed down the drain, add to the buildup.

As the blockage forms, sewage can overflow resulting in property damage and the spread of • Use a strainer. Install a strainer in the sink to harmful toxins into local water sources. Blockages also lead to untreated sewage entering rivers and streams, causing pollution and harming aquatic life. In addition, the removal of fatbergs requires specialized equipment and labor, resulting in higher maintenance costs for the township and, ultimately, higher expenses for

These obstructions can grow to enormous sizes and are problems in towns, states, and countries everywhere. Considering the danger they pose to infrastructure and the environment, it is and how to avoid them.

Residents can help prevent Fatbergs here in

- Never pour fat, oil or grease (FOG) down the
- catch food scraps and dispose directly into the trash.
- Collect fat, oils and grease in a can or compostable container and dispose of it in the trash or other appropriate place.
- Wipe greasy pots and pans with paper towels before washing, and then dispose of the paper

Dispose of sanitary products and other nonflushable items, such as wipes, diapers, feminine products in the trash, not the toilet.

Please share this information with friends and imperative everyone understands how they form family to help raise awareness and encourage responsible practices.


