HOLIDAY EVENT BENEFITS ALL-VOL EMERGENCY SQUAD

The holiday season started with a bang at the Ladies Holiday Shopping Night at the Fairmount Country Club on November 21st. The brainchild of FCC member Suzanne DeMichele and Board member, Jessica Kelly, the night included a shopping experience with 15 local vendors, a generous spread of delicious food and drink as well as a raffle of popular items, baskets and experiences. Several members of FCC are also members of the all-volunteer Chatham Emergency Squad, and the co-hosts decided to make the evening a benefit for the CES.

Over 180 members and their guests enjoyed the evening of shopping and socializing enhanced by knowing they were also raising money for a worthy and local cause. FCC General Manager, Alex McDonald said “We are delighted to host this event that checks all the boxes – our members get to enjoy a wonderful evening highlighted by a festive buffet while at the same time raising money for such an important service.”

All proceeds from raffle ticket sales as well as 20% of the vendor sales were donated to CES. The event raised \$8,900 for the Chatham Emergency Squad, an all-volunteer, nonprofit organization that provides basic life support for our community.

The Squad provides service 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and is nearly 100% funded by donations. CES President, and FCC member, Evan Skinner, said “Donations from our

MAINTAINING SELF WHILE RAISING AN ATHLETE

Mayors Wellness Campaign Advisory Committee

Parental involvement in youth sports plays a crucial role in shaping an athlete's experience and development. Positive involvement—marked by support, praise, and understanding—leads to favorable outcomes, whereas negative involvement characterized by pressure and high-performance expectations can hinder motivation. Striking a balance with moderate parental involvement is essential for both athlete autonomy and support.

As someone with over 20 years of experience working with athletes, parents, and coaches, I have observed significant patterns in how parenting behaviors affect athletic growth.

Maintaining a sense of self while raising youth athletes yields several benefits, including avoiding vicarious living, fostering a healthy parent-child dynamic, and reducing pressure on the child.

To achieve this balance, parents can employ several strategies.

First, it's important to identify personal passions outside of their child's sports, which encourages mutual independence.

Setting realistic expectations helps parents navigate the ups and downs of their child's athletic journey, promoting enjoyment rather than just focusing on outcomes.

Creating an open dialogue fosters a safe space for children to discuss their goals while

encouraging them to express themselves. Additionally, celebrating their efforts rather than solely their victories cultivates a positive growth mindset. Instead of fixing problems for them, parents should prioritize listening, empowering their children to develop problem-solving skills.

Ultimately, maintaining one's identity and interests helps parents model healthy behaviors, making them more effective supporters and role models in their children's athletic pursuits.

ROBOTIC COMPANION PETS DISBURSED TO HOMEBOUND RESIDENTS

Morris County

The Morris County Office of Aging, Disabilities, and Community Programming (ADCP) reminds residents of the importance of supporting the senior community and ensuring they feel connected, valued, and cared for during this special time of year.

The ADCP office provided more than 110 "Joy for All" robotic companion pets to qualifying residents and facilities across the county as part of an initiative aimed at alleviating social isolation, loneliness, and cognitive decline among seniors.

The program, which was funded by the Aging American Rescue Plan, allocated 20 robotic companion pets to the Morris County Sheriff's Office, which distributed them to clients enrolled in its Project Lifesaver program. Additionally, 12 pets were donated to the Cornerstone Adult Day Center and each of the county's 12 nutrition sites "adopted a pet" to keep onsite. 40 pets were distributed through the Nutrition Home Delivered Meals program, and Hope House will distribute another 25 pets.

"When addressing social isolation and dementia care, we wanted something creative approach. The "Joy for All" companion pets have been the focus of rigorous, peer-reviewed studies demonstrating their efficacy to alleviate the many of the effects of loneliness and social isolation," said Christine Hellyer, Christine Hellyer, Director of the ADCP office. "The partnership with the

Sheriff's Office to distribute the pets was an essential component of this program. In total, about 120 companion pets were provided to seniors or senior programs that could benefit from them."

To qualify for a companion pet, recipients must be at least 60 years of age, homebound, and either socially isolated or experiencing dementia or a similar cognitive condition. Designed to mimic real pets, the "Joy for All" animals aim to provide companionship and comfort for those unable to care for live animals.

Sheriff Gannon, who joined in delivering a companion pet to a Project Lifesaver client,

emphasized the importance of this program.

"Anytime the Sheriff's Office can provide comfort to those in need, we are going to do it. This simple act of support provides aid to those who are homebound," said Gannon. "We look forward to seeing the tremendous benefits of this program being passed on to a sometimes forgotten population in our community."

The pets respond to motion and touch: the cats will roll over and purr, while the dogs bark and wag their tails. The pets do not come with names, allowing recipients the personal experience of naming their new robotic dog or cat, which they are welcome to keep for as long as they wish.

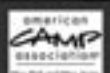

VETERANS RESOURCE CENTER GRAND OPENING

The County College of Morris (CCM) celebrated the grand opening of its Veterans Resource Center with a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Dec. 6, drawing veterans, students, and local dignitaries from around the county in support of a reconstructed area of Sheffield Hall that will assist veterans and their families both on campus and in the broader community.

The Veterans Resource Center on campus was designed to provide a dedicated space for veterans to access U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) education benefits, academic and career advice and counseling services. The center will also connect veterans to county, state, and federal resources available directly on campus.

The CCM Veterans Resource Center was developed in partnership with a Veterans Steering Committee comprised of representation from CCM, public officials, area veterans and organizations including the VA and many others throughout the state and county. The steering committee was led by CCM Board of Trustees Chair Paul Licitra (U.S. Army Vietnam veteran), former director of the Secaucus Vet Center David Cathcart (U.S. Army Vietnam veteran), Morris County Commissioner John Krickus (U.S. Marine Corps veteran), U.S. Dept. of VA Public Affairs Specialist Scott W. Dadaian (U.S. Navy veteran), Morris County Sheriff's Officer Ryan Wood (U.S. Army Veteran), and VFW Post 7333 members Emerson Crooks (U.S. Marine Corps Vietnam veteran), Deacon Richard Reck (U.S.

Army Korean War veteran) and William Menzel (U.S. Army Vietnam Veteran).

During the event, Assemblywoman Aura Dunn (Morris-25) and Assemblyman Mike Inganamort (Morris-24) presented joint assembly resolutions to Cathcart, Crooks, Menzel, Dadaian and Reck, and Paul Licitra acknowledged Wood, who had just returned home from being deployed.

"The Center was created with extensive input from community veterans," said Dr. Anthony Iacono, president of CCM. "It will be a true resource not only for CCM students who are veterans, but for veterans in the community along with their families. CCM is honored to have this opportunity to serve the men and women who have sacrificed for our country, allowing all of us to enjoy freedom and democracy."

The idea for the center originated after CCM hosted the Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall in July 2022, an initiative spearheaded by State Senator Anthony Bucco in partnership with VFW Post 7333. Following the event, CCM leadership engaged with veterans to identify their needs and began planning the resource center.

We are incredibly thankful for our donors' dedication and our educators' passion, which allows us to continue providing these extraordinary opportunities for our students."

GRANTS AWARDED DURING THE FALL 2024 GRANT CYCLE

Horticultural and Agriculture Science Grant (CHS (Mary Donohue & Lauren LoPorto)--\$1,187.35): Horticultural and Agriculture Science

is a new course at Chatham High School that was created based on student and faculty interest. It is an inquiry-driven course designed to introduce students to the topics with a strong focus on sustainable practices. This grant provides funding for equipment necessary to implement the curriculum of the class and provides hands-on experiences for enrolled students. According to the grant applicants, "Students indicated they would like more opportunities to work in the garden/greenhouse throughout the year. This interest ignited the idea for this science elective. This is a unique opportunity as most agricultural courses are offered only in vocational or special education programs. There are few school garden programs in New Jersey public schools with a dedicated course offering."

NJ Symphony Partnership Grant (LAF, CMS, CHS (Liam Keller, Emily Gaul, Suzanne Bass, Christine Spriggs, Justin Lemley)--\$6,300.00): This residency aims to provide customized, multi-week coaching for instrumental music students in grades 4-12, featuring New Jersey Symphony musicians. The goal is to supplement in-school instruction and deepen students' musical understanding. The grant applicants shared, "the musicians from the Symphony provide decades of musical knowledge at the highest level achievable which deepens the understanding and connection of our student musicians. Providing this access at a young age opens our students to possibilities in the music world that are normally reserved for college students and gives them an advantage in statewide ensembles and competitions."

2025 District Choral Festival (LAF, CMS, CHS (Ken Bryson, Dana Goodstein, Jared Badalamenti)--\$3,159.50): CEF continues to support the annual District Choral Festival. This year's guest clinician is Jim Papoulis, who will lead a composing workshop. The grant applicants believe that "this project will help form connections between students who are just starting out their choral career and students who have been participating for a decade. Over the last four years the Choral Festival has shown firsthand how this event has improved student

communication, collaboration, and musicianship. CHS students paved the way for CMS students who then became role models for Lafayette students."

From Seed to Seed (MAS, SBS, WAS (Lauren LoPorto, Sarah Gutierrez)--\$3,682.20): This grant allows for the expansion of an initiative started in the second-grade classes at Washington Avenue School. Classes will use Wisconsin Fast Plants to teach the "Relationships in Habitats" science unit, which provides a more hands-on, interactive learning opportunity. According to the grant applicants, "through activities such as observation, experimentation, journaling, and data collection, students not only develop critical thinking skills but also enhance their scientific inquiry abilities and develop a deeper understanding of disciplinary core ideas."

Biotechnology in the Biology Classroom (CHS (Kelly Baumle)--\$3,975.00): Funding was requested by Chatham High School biology teachers for materials supporting a new and an existing lab experience for the biology classes at CHS. Kelly Baumle, the grant applicant, shared "these labs will not only increase student interest but also provide valuable hands-on experience with real scientific equipment. These labs can be adapted for various biology courses, and the purchased equipment will be a long-term investment for the science program."

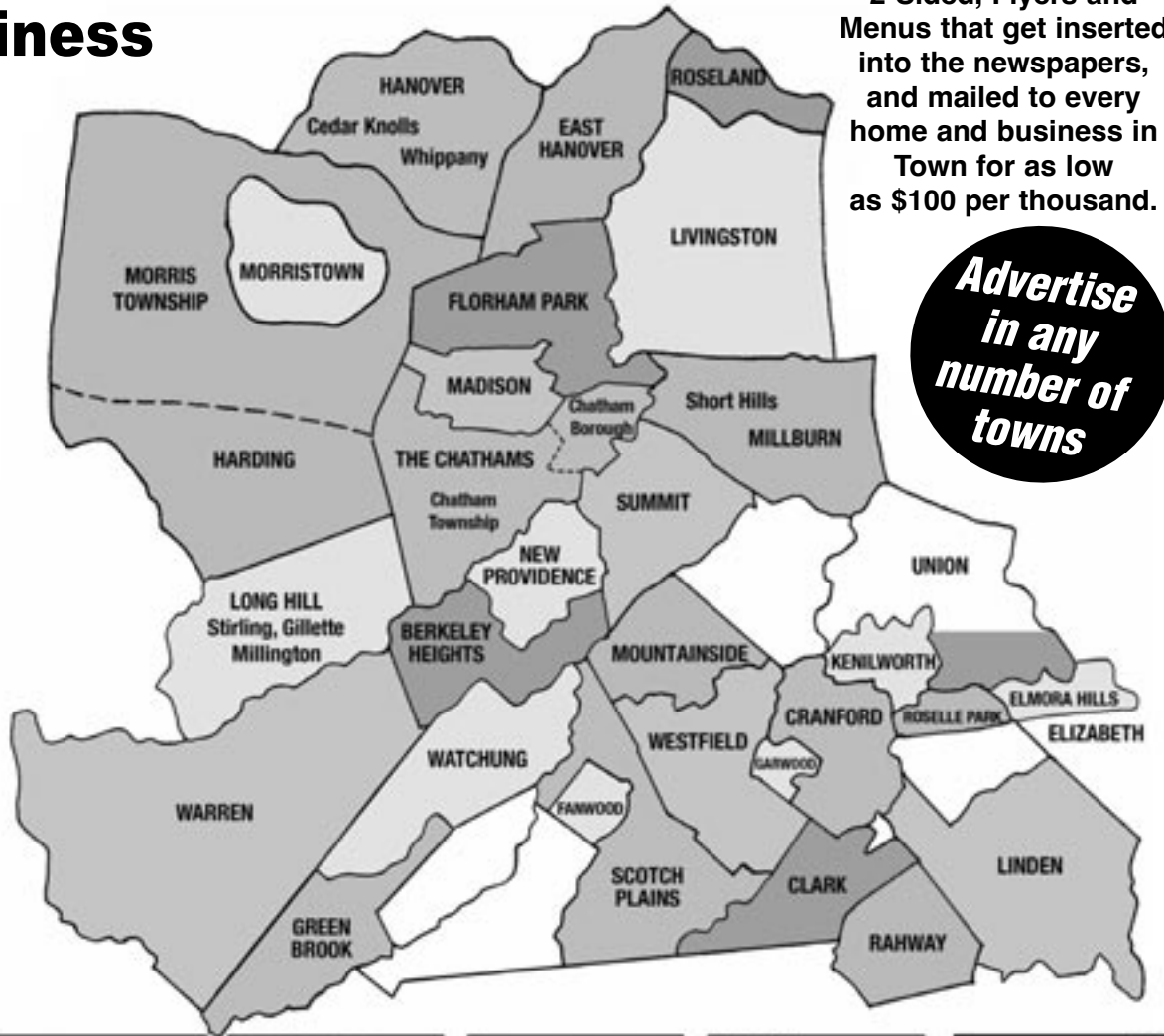

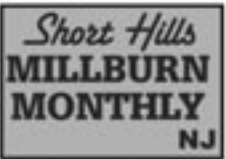

JANUARY 7: FRED POLAK

On January 7th, Fred Polak will relate the love story of his parents, Jack and Ina, who nurtured their relationship through the exchange of letters while each was incarcerated in concentration camps during WWII. After liberation, they married and moved to America in 1950. Jack became the president of the Ann Frank Center, USA and lectured extensively on the Holocaust. Jack passed away at the age of 102 and Fred has been dedicated to retelling his parents’ story and the lessons to be learned from this awful period.

JANUARY 14: SCOTT WALKER

On January 14th, we will learn how Rutgers Provides academic Support Services to Student Athletes. Our speaker will be Scott Walker, executive director of Rutgers’ Academic Support Services for Student Athletes program (ASSSA), and a Princeton graduate. Services provided by ASSSA are available to all student-athletes at

Rutgers. During his tenure, which includes entry of Rutgers into the Big Ten, Scott has overseen the expansion and modernization of the program and the unprecedented academic success achieved by individual student-athletes and team sports. Scott will provide an insider’s view of the services provided by ASSSA and how it has evolved over the years.

On January 21st, our speaker will be Dr. Stanley Gersch.
