

One thing our team decided to do was to have Gold Star families meet disabled veterans at our events, so they can work together and form a bond. By adding veteran family members to the team, it allows us to work together on our peer support and recreational therapy programs. We are honored to have veteran family members to work alongside us and know they are just as committed with helping our veterans live a better way of life.
