

North Jersey Young Marines

Sofia Dersono from Linden, New Jersey, was chosen as one of two special public affairs correspondents who traveled with 36 Young Marine units to Hawaii in December to participate in the remembrance ceremonies for the 83rd anniversary of Pearl Harbor. Sofia, a freshman at David Brearly High School, located in Kenilworth, NJ, is a YM/SSgt, and has been a member of the North Jersey Young Marines in Colonia for five years. In addition to serving as public affairs correspondent, Sofia represented her unit during her time in Hawaii.

The Young Marines is a national youth organization for boys and girls from age eight through high school graduation.

"Sofia has shown herself to be an excellent communicator and was chosen among Young Marines nationwide for this position," said Abra Hogarth, Director of Strategic Communications for the Young Marines. "She was a tremendous support to me as she assisted headquarters staff with documenting events, taking video and photos, and submitting posts for social media."

Among the events Sofia reported on were the Young Marines participation in:

- Community service beach clean-up on Marine Corps Base Hawaii -Kaneohe Bay
- Wreath laying ceremony at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific "The Punchbowl", in memory of all the brave men and women who are interred at the site
- Klipper Ceremony, Marine Corps Base Hawaii
- Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade, Honolulu

Asked about her week serving in these communications efforts, Sofia said, "My trip to Pearl Harbor means so much to me, and it is an experience I will never forget. I am so honored to document the Young Marines' efforts this week and to honor and recognize the lives lost and those who served at Pearl Harbor during World War II."

Sofia's future plans include attending college under the ROTC program,

serving in the military, and becoming an attorney. A significant honor for all the Young Marine units in 2024 was to lead the Pearl Harbor Memorial Parade, on Saturday, December 7, in Honolulu. Young Marines performed a color guard and carried the banners of the 12 capital ships that were attacked. They also assisted with many of the floats in the parade.

This year's events gave each and every Young Marine important memories to cherish as they actively participated in the remembrance events, met and listened to veterans tell their stories, and memorialized veterans who are no longer with us

Young Marines units raised funds at the local level to supplement the costs of traveling to Hawaii. These youth members used their creativity, and applied the program's core values - leadership, teamwork, and self-discipline - to implement unique and effective fundraising efforts to attend this educational and patriotic event.

#### **YOUNG MARINES HISTORY**

Since the Young Marines' humble beginnings in 1959 with one unit and a handful of boys, the organization has grown to over 200 units with over 5,000 youth and 1,950 adult volunteers in 40 states, the District of Columbia, Japan (Okinawa), and affiliates in a host of other countries.

### **DAY TO RECHARGE: TIGER PRIDE DAY**

#### Linden Public Schools

Classrooms and offices across Linden Public Schools recently traded their usual hustle and bustle for something different-an intentional focus on wellness, connection, and community.

The district's first-ever Tiger Pride Wellness Day, held on January 8th, invited students, teachers, and even administrative staff to step back, breathe, and embrace the idea that taking care of yourself is the key to giving your best to others.

The day kicked off in roaring fashion at each school with high-energy, pep-rally-style assemblies designed to ignite Tiger pride and set the tone for the day ahead. Packed gyms and auditoriums came alive with music, cheers, and motivational messages, as students and staff celebrated the Linden community. The excitement was palpable, with chants of "Our Tigers ROAR!" echoing through the halls, creating a unifying sense of belonging.

Superintendent Atiya Y. Perkins spent the day connecting with students and staff, visiting schools across the district to engage firsthand in the activities and conversations that defined Tiger Pride Wellness Day.

At School No. 4, for example, Superintendent Perkins took school spirit to a whole new level, zipping through hallways and classrooms on a motorized scooter decked out in full Tiger Pride flair. Outfitted as a tiger, she turned heads and sparked laughter, stopping by classrooms and the gymnasium to rev up the energy with students and staff. High-fives, chants of "Our Tigers ROAR!" and bursts of laughter followed her every move, embodying the joy and connection that the day was all about.

In the central office, Perkins brought the spirit of wellness to administrative staff, ringing a bell as she visited each department to share messages of encouragement and hand out healthy treats. Accompanied by Assistant Superintendent Dave Walker, who pushed a food cart filled with snacks, Perkins reminded staff that wellness is just as important for them as it is for the students.

After the rousing start, students and staff transitioned into a variety of classroom activities focused on wellness. Instead of the usual hum of lessons and lectures, classrooms buzzed with restorative circles, lively Kahoot competitions, and heartfelt conversations about what it means to feel good-mind, body, and spirit.

Early childhood students sang I Am Special

Services, played a vital role in the success of and discussed what it means to be a good friend. Older students reflected on their "happy places," with one child sharing, "A happy place for me is out of the country. I haven't been there, but I imagine it, and it makes me smile."



Winners in the competition will be announced by television stars at the red carpet awards ceremony on April 5, 2025, at the Television Academy in North Hollywood, California. Designed to emulate the Emmy® Awards, student entries are judged by Television Academy members. Criteria for the College Television Awards reflect industry standards of excellence, imagination, and innovation.

Jenkins is nominated, along with classmates at Montclair State University, in the News category for his work as a director, producer and writer on Arizona Stories: Border, Water and Politics. Jenkins traveled to Arizona to work on the project as part of an "On the Road: Reporting from the Field" class for Montclair News Lab. The program aired in May 2024 on Montclair Township's Local Access Channel 34 and covered a wide range of topics in Arizona including immigration, homelessness, drought and the environmental impact of millions of visitors to the Grand Canyon.

Jenkins is a recent graduate of Montclair who majored in sports communication. Originally from Newark, New Jersey, Jenkins attended Linden High School in Linden, New Jersey. He is currently employed as a road production assistant for World Wrestling Entertainment.

programs from colleges across the country. floor my final year," said Jenkins. "Toward the end of the fall semester, I saw the flyer for the class, an opportunity to dip my toe in journalism in a state I knew little about. Special free Concert by Hanover Wind Symphony

Like a kaleidoscope, arrangements for wind bands have changed in tone and tenor through the years, and the renowned Hanover Wind Symphony will spotlight these changes in a special free concert, called "Kaleidoscope," on Wednesday, Feb. 12, at 7 p.m., at Memorial Junior School, 61 Highland Ave., in Whippany.

"This concert presents a wonderfully eclectic and changing view of wind band repertoire," Matthew Paterno of Parsippany, HWS music director and conductor, points out. "From classic to contemporary, we explore the changing colors and styles of this most versatile ensemble."

Guest conductors for the concert will be Thomas Sansone and Ayden Khan.

He received his master's in percussion performance, as well as his bachelor's in music education, from Montclair State University. He regularly performs in New Jersey, New York City, and Philadelphia. Additionally, Khan has taught master classes and coached percussion ensembles and drum lines in several different schools in New Jersey. He was the first recipient of the merit-based Centanni Percussion Scholarship for showing

excellence in artistic performance, advanced methods, and demonstrating high academic achievement. Among his numerous accomplishments, the guest conductor was honored with the opportunity to perform as the principal timpanist at Carnegie Hall, and on tour in Spain and Argentina with the Grammy Award-winning New York youth symphony.

Thomas Sansone, guest conductor for "City Trees," is an instrumental music teacher in the Montville Township public school district. He holds a bachelor's degree in music education from Rutgers University, and a master's in curriculum and instruction from Liberty University. This is his third season playing bass trombone with the Hanover Wind Symphony. He has a strong commitment to music education and performance.



### **UNION COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY PRESERVING HISTORY**

The Hannah and James Caldwell Memorial Obelisk recently underwent a complete restoration and cleaning at the Siloam-Hope First Presbyterian Church (formerly known as the First Presbyterian Church of Elizabethtown) in Elizabeth thanks to the Union County Historical Society (UCHS).

UCHS President Joanne Rajoppi said, "The 179-year-old obelisk honoring Revolutionary War pastor and patriot James Caldwell and his wife Hannah, was in terrible condition: encrusted dirt from years of neglect with loose mortar and unreadable engravings. As we approach the 250th anniversary of our country, what better time to reflect, remember and honor the contributions of our patriots, especially the Caldwells, who sacrificed their lives for independence."

The Siloam-Hope First Presbyterian Church cemetery is one of the oldest in the state, dating to the late 1680s. More than 40 officers of the partially funded by a Union County Heart Grant,

Continental Army are buried there, many of whom attended the church while Reverend Caldwell served as its pastor. Caldwell also served as General George Washington's Deputy Commissary of supplies during the war. The British placed a bounty on his head and he was murdered in 1781. His wife Hannah and mother of their nine children had been murdered the previous year by a British soldier in the aftermath of the Battle of Connecticut Farms.

There are also more than 313 enslaved and free African Americans buried in the historic cemetery, often in unmarked graves: some are children, and some are likely war veterans. The 313+ Ancestors Speak Project acknowledges and commemorates their lives and burials. A monument with their names was recently erected in the cemetery.

The restoration of the Caldwell memorial was

donations by the Union Township Historical Society, the NJ Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, (NJSAR), the West Fields Chapter of SAR, American Legion Post 248, the First Presbyterian Church of Springfield and many individual contributors.

Ms. Rajoppi said that the restoration included a workshop on how to clean gravestones.

Volunteers, including local area Boy Scouts, the Crane's Ford Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and UCHS members attended the four-hour event.

The restoration work was completed by Richard Grubb & Associates, a full-service cultural resource management firm and one of the largest, independent archaeological and historic preservation consulting companies in the eastern United States. Their corporate headquarters are in Cranbury, New Jersey.

#### **ABOUT THE UNION COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF NEW JERSEY**

The UCHS was incorporated by an Act of the 93rd Legislature of the State of New Jersey on April 1, 1869. The objective of this Society is the collection and preservation of all matter of historical relics, books, records, documents, and manuscripts, to stimulate and encourage historical research and the study of history pertaining to the territory originally embraced by Elizabethtown and the present Union County.

The Society exists through the help and generosity of its members. Membership is comprised of citizens who have a common interest in preserving the past. There is no paid staff. The Executive Board and Members perform all Society functions.



### **NJ CERTIFIES NEW RECORD FISH**

#### New Jersey Fish and F&W Record Bowfin 2024

Frank Hubert caught the new state record Bowfin in Mantua Creek on December 17, 2024. The fish weighed 12 pounds, 10 ounces, replacing Pierce Dopkin's 11-pound, 8.5-ounce record from 2017, which was caught in the same creek.

Frank was casting from a kayak and using a Sixgill spinning rod with a Shimano spinning reel loaded with 30-pound test Snakehead Outlawz braided line when the fish hit. A Snakehead Outlawz Dragon Destroyer was the lure used for catching this new record bowfin.

#### ABOUT THE NJ STATE RECORD FISH PROGRAM

Despite its small size and high population density, New Jersey offers a wide range of fishing opportunities, including the chance to catch "trophy-size" fish. Such fish are recognized in the Skillful Angler Program and the State Record Fish Program.

The objective of the Record Fish Program is to increase the awareness of fishing opportunities for species that are regularly sought after and routinely found in the freshwaters or off the coast of New Jersey. Separate lists are maintained for freshwater and marine species, and in 2014 a new Spearfishing category was created for saltwater species.

Presently there are 90 species (31 freshwater

and 59 saltwater, including 17 in the Spearfishing category) eligible for entry in the Record Fish Program. In May 2007, the program was revised to include Retired Categories (Saltwater) of fish no longer accepted for entry in the program, as well as Retired Historical Records which were believed to be "unbeatable" at the time.


