When you see flashing blue lights in your rearview mirror, what's your first reaction? For most, it's a signal to slow down, move over, or let an emergency vehicle pass. However, not everyone reacts appropriately, and misunderstanding or disregarding these lights can delay lifesaving responses. For off-duty EMS providers responding to calls from their personal vehicles, blue lights are more than just a signal—they are a critical tool that helps them reach emergencies quickly and safely.

Why EMS Uses Blue Lights

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) operate under immense pressure, responding to time-sensitive incidents such as heart attacks, strokes, and major trauma. Blue lights allow off-duty personnel to respond to calls from personal vehicles and are used to alert other drivers and pedestrians to an emergency response in progress. They provide EMS crews with the right-of-way in traffic, allowing them to navigate through congested roads safely and efficiently.

In many areas, EMS personnel have the option to equip their personal vehicles with blue lights when responding to emergencies, helping them reach their station or the scene faster. However, public awareness of these uses remains low, leading to confusion and, in some cases, dangerous road behavior.

THE CHALLENGES OF BLUE LIGHT RESPONSES

Despite their clear purpose, blue lights are often ignored or misinterpreted by drivers. Some motorists fail to yield, creating hazardous situations for both EMS personnel and the public. Others panic, slamming on their brakes or veering unpredictably, increasing the risk of collisions. Another growing issue is "blue light fatigue," where frequent exposure to emergency lights reduces their impact. In urban areas with constant sirens and flashing lights, drivers may become desensitized, leading to delayed or inappropriate reactions.

HOW THE PUBLIC CAN HELP

Respecting blue lights on both ambulances and personal vehicles is simple and can save lives. When you see an emergency vehicle approaching with flashing lights:

- Move to the right and come to a complete stop when safe to do so.
- Do not block intersections
- -- allow ambulances to pass through quickly.
- Never tailgate or try to follow an emergency vehicle

to bypass traffic.

EMS blue lights are a vital part of emergency response, ensuring that help arrives when seconds matter. By staying alert and responding correctly, drivers can play a crucial role in supporting first responders and saving lives. 

BENJAMIN LI TO Compete in science Talent search finals

Millburn High School Senior Benjamin Li was named a Regeneron Science Talent Search (STS) Finalist. He is one of 40 finalists out of 300 Scholars named in January.

The Regeneron STS, formerly known as the Intel STS (before the Westinghouse STS), is generally regarded as our country's oldest and most prestigious science competition. Thirteen alumni of the STS have gone on to win the Nobel Prize, and two have won the Fields Medal. Entrants conduct original research and submit a research paper documenting their findings.

Ben's research project title was "Multimodal, Depth-Aware Brain Tumor Segmentation in Sub-Saharan Populations." Ben will travel to Washington, D.C., in March to compete in the week-long Regeneron Finals, where students compete to be one of the top ten winners and receive awards.

Science Research Teacher Christopher Cook says, "Ben is a senior who has participated in the MHS Science Research Program since he was in 10th grade, where he regularly helps other students develop their machine learning projects. Ben has a special talent for computer science, but he develops modern technology using oldfashioned dedication and persistence. His achievement is an inspiration to us all."


