

The Summit Free Market is a student-led, volunteer-run initiative that promotes the principles of reuse, sustainability, and community sharing. Since its inception in 2008, the Summit Free Market has helped more than 5,000 residents and kept over 175 tons of reusable materials out of the waste stream. The market is open to Summit residents, offering them an opportunity to bring gently used, yard-sale quality items they no longer need and, in turn, take whatever they wish at no cost.

Sustainability: The event encourages the reuse of goods, reducing waste, and promoting a circular economy.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

To attend the Summit Free Market, residents must have a permit to access the Transfer Station. Permits are available for purchase online through the City of Summit Parking Services Agency. The cost for an annual permit is \$10 per vehicle and \$5 for seniors over 62. The permit is annual and is valid from November 1 to October 31.

GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPATION

60-Minute Time Limit: In order to ensure fair access for all, visitors are limited to 60 minutes per event.

No Resellers: The Summit Free Market is a community exchange event. The resale of items collected at the market is not permitted, in line with the spirit of sharing.

Signs are posted at the Summit Free Market building to remind attendees of these guidelines, and any violations may result in removal from the event to maintain a fair and positive experience for all participants.






Residents are encouraged to visit the new firehouse at 281 Broad Street for any fire-related needs. The new location offers ample on-site parking for ease of access.

TASK FORCE ON HOMELESSNESS ADDRESSES POST OFFICE SAFETY

City of Summit

Mayor Elizabeth Fagan's Task Force on Homelessness, working in partnership with Congressman Tom Kean, Jr., has addressed concerns about public health and safety at the Summit Post Office, which had become a focal point for a growing homeless encampment. Recent efforts to reduce overnight disruptions in the post office's vestibule have resulted in adjusted operating hours and an improved environment for both postal workers and residents.

"The safety and well-being of our community members are a priority, and our Homelessness Task Force is dedicated to connecting individuals to the right resources - whether for shelter or longer-term housing solutions," said Summit Mayor Elizabeth Fagan. "By working with Congressman Kean and the U.S. Postal Service, we've found a balanced approach that resolves immediate concerns and continues to support the homeless population with the proper resources they need."

The post office had been struggling with unsanitary conditions due to people seeking shelter in the vestibule overnight. Residents who used the self-service kiosk early in the morning were confronted with the difficult situation of walking over individuals who were sleeping in the lobby. Post office workers also expressed safety concerns over the encampment. The adjustment of operating hours helps resolve this issue, while also ensuring that those in need are directed to shelters and services that offer appropriate resources.

The Mayor's Task Force on Homelessness will continue its mission to ensure that service providers and first responders continue outreach efforts to connect homeless individuals with needed services with long term housing as the ultimate goal. In the past year, the task force has connected eight individuals experiencing homelessness with either a home, work, or rehab services.



UNION COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY PRESERVING HISTORY

The Hannah and James Caldwell Memorial Obelisk recently underwent a complete restoration and cleaning at the Siloam-Hope First Presbyterian Church (formerly known as the First Presbyterian Church of Elizabethtown) in Elizabeth thanks to the Union County Historical Society (UCHS).

UCHS President Joanne Rajoppi said, "The 179-year-old obelisk honoring Revolutionary War pastor and patriot James Caldwell and his wife Hannah, was in terrible condition: encrusted dirt from years of neglect with loose mortar and unreadable engravings. As we approach the 250th anniversary of our country, what better time to reflect, remember and honor the contributions of our patriots, especially the Caldwells, who sacrificed their lives for independence."

The Siloam-Hope First Presbyterian Church cemetery is one of the oldest in the state, dating to the late 1680s. More than 40 officers of the partially funded by a Union County Heart Grant,

Continental Army are buried there, many of whom attended the church while Reverend Caldwell served as its pastor. Caldwell also served as General George Washington's Deputy Commissary of supplies during the war. The British placed a bounty on his head and he was murdered in 1781. His wife Hannah and mother of their nine children had been murdered the previous year by a British soldier in the aftermath of the Battle of Connecticut Farms.

There are also more than 313 enslaved and free African Americans buried in the historic cemetery, often in unmarked graves: some are children, and some are likely war veterans. The 313+ Ancestors Speak Project acknowledges and commemorates their lives and burials. A monument with their names was recently erected in the cemetery.

The restoration of the Caldwell memorial was



donations by the Union Township Historical Society, the NJ Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, (NJSAR), the West Fields Chapter of SAR, American Legion Post 248, the First Presbyterian Church of Springfield and many individual contributors.

Ms. Rajoppi said that the restoration included a workshop on how to clean gravestones.

Volunteers, including local area Boy Scouts, the Crane's Ford Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and UCHS members attended the four-hour event.

The restoration work was completed by Richard Grubb & Associates, a full-service cultural resource management firm and one of the largest, independent archaeological and historic preservation consulting companies in the eastern United States. Their corporate headquarters are in Cranbury, New Jersey.

ABOUT THE UNION COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF NEW JERSEY

The UCHS was incorporated by an Act of the 93rd Legislature of the State of New Jersey on April 1, 1869. The objective of this Society is the collection and preservation of all matter of historical relics, books, records, documents, and manuscripts, to stimulate and encourage historical research and the study of history pertaining to the territory originally embraced by Elizabethtown and the present Union County.

The Society exists through the help and generosity of its members. Membership is comprised of citizens who have a common interest in preserving the past. There is no paid staff. The Executive Board and Members perform all Society functions.
