KATE WHITCHER SAVES LIFE ON VACATION

Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad (SVFAS)

Summit resident and First Aid Squad volunteer Kate Whitcher (19) was part of a civilian three-person rescue team to resuscitate a patient in Vail, Colorado. While vacationing, Whitcher identified a patient in distress and applied advanced lifesaving measures learned while obtaining her EMT license in her role as a Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad (SVFAS) volunteer. Whitcher joined the SVFAS Junior program in April, 2022 as a sophomore in high school. Currently a freshman at Fairfield University, Whitcher is pursuing a degree in nursing. "I'm so grateful I had the opportunity to become a licensed EMT in high school. I knew my CPR skills might be needed on duty, but I was surprised to use them on vacation," said Whitcher.

Every year the SVFAS accepts applications from high school students who are sixteen years of age to join the Junior Program. Approximately ten candidates are selected for the coveted positions. According to SVFAS Chief, Laura Benevento, "SVFAS Junior

SVFAS EMT's receive ongoing education and utilize state of the art equipment to consistently provide the high quality of care Summit residents deserve and expect.

NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR HOMETOWN HEROES PROGRAM

The City of Summit is announcing that enrollment is now open for its 2025 Hometown Heroes program. The deadline to apply is March 31, 2025.

This will be the eighth year for the successful program that displays banners with the names, images, and dates of service of active military members and veterans on city streets from mid-May through mid-August.

An individual qualifies to take part in the Hometown Heroes program if they are serving or have served in any one of the following branches of the United States Armed Forces: Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, and Navy. Members of the United States Merchant Marine and Women Airforce Service Pilots in World War II are also invited to apply.

Applicants must also have lived in Summit at any time in the past or present, or are currently or have been employed by the City of Summit or Summit Board of Education, or are current or former volunteers in the Summit EMS, Police Auxiliary, or Volunteer Fire Division.

SVFAS GRATEFUL

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad received grants from several Summit-based organizations during the calendar year 2024. They include the Luminary Fund, The Fred C. Rummel Foundation, the Maeve Foundation and The Raymond and Lucille Benedetto Charitable Foundation, who all have been longtime supporters.

The Fred C. Rummel Foundation Grant was used for the purchase of radios for the Squad. The Benedetto Grant will go toward helping fund a new ambulance. The Maeve and Luminary Fund Grants will assist the Squad in providing quality emergency medical services to the Summit Community.

Leah Griffith, President of Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad, commented on the financial gifts, "The support from the community and these local foundations is essential to our ability to respond to emergency calls and we are incredibly grateful for their support."

The generosity and support allow the all volunteer First Aid Squad to answer emergency calls 24/7 365 days a year for a total of 2421 in 2024. In January 2025, the squad responded to 213 calls, including 140 medical emergencies, 27 motor vehicle accidents, 7 traumatic injuries and 3 pedestrians struck by cars.

"GREAT DECISIONS" DISCUSSION GROUP

The Summit Free Public Library is pleased to announce the continuation of its popular "Great Decisions" discussion group, a program dedicated to exploring critical global issues. Reflecting the Library's mission to inform, enrich, and inspire, this long-standing program offers community members a valuable opportunity to engage in thoughtful dialogue on current affairs.

Great Decisions, a national program of the Foreign Policy Association (FPA), provides resources and a structured format for citizens to discuss the most pressing global challenges facing the United States. The program utilizes briefing books written by subject matter experts, DVDs, and a flexible discussion model to facilitate informed conversations. The FPA describes Great Decisions as "America's largest discussion group on world affairs," with groups meeting in various venues across the country. The Summit Library's group stands out by offering free participation to all interested individuals.

Summit resident Fred Honold, a volunteer facilitator with extensive global experience gained through his work with organizations across multiple continents, leads the group. Honold's background, including a history degree from Bowdoin College, provides a unique perspective to the discussions. A long-time Summit resident and Library supporter, Honold

is passionate about fostering community engagement through the Great Decisions program. He dedicates his time to organizing the format, researching topics, providing notes for participants, and occasionally recruiting comoderators.

The Great Decisions sessions, funded by the Friends of the Library, will run monthly from March through December 2025, with breaks in July and August. Meetings are held on the third Wednesday of each month from 1:00-3:00 pm in the Library's Liss Room. This year's topics include: "AI and American National Security", "International Cooperation on Climate Change", "India: Between China, the West, and the Global South", and "The Future of NATO and European Security".

The Summit Library's Great Decisions group attracts an average of 30-35 active local residents from diverse professional and educational backgrounds. In describing the group, Honold says, "Participants arrive at our meetings with an educated point of view, respectfully asking questions and sharing seasoned commentary."

Reference Librarian Rebecca Cohan supports the program by inviting prominent experts to select sessions, further enriching the discussions.

shapes our city and makes it the special place we all love. I hope many students apply and take advantage of this excellent opportunity."


