

Virginia Procino Hartmann, Class of 1968. Ms. Hartmann is a retired Lieutenant Colonel, who served in the United States Air Force Academy for 24 years. Among her duties, included being an air training officer who helped train one of the first group of women cadets to attend the United States Air Force Academy.

Dr. Nan Masterson, a former nurse at the high school, is the founder of Global Health Services, a non-profit charitable organization that provides children of orphanages access to facilities, supplies, and food to address malnutrition and the resources necessary for children to attend schools in such countries as Kenya and Haiti.

Mr. Michael Stanfield, Class of 1982, a former three-sport letterman at Watchung Hills, is currently the Vice President of Sales for the New Orleans Saints and New Orleans Pelicans. 




## 2025 NJ FMBA COOKED & UNCORKED




