CUB SCOUTS VISIT GREAT SWAMP

Cub Scout Pack 23, sponsored by St. Genevieve's Church in Elizabeth, visited the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge in Morris County on Saturday, March 8. The Cub Scouts started their trip by walking two boardwalk trails to bird blinds at the Wildlife Observation Center. In spite of some wind, the Cubs used binoculars to look for birds at the blind, and learned to identify several trees, bushes and other plants along their walk. They learned that you can make birch beer from black birch trees.

Pack 23's next stop in the Great Swamp was the Helen C. Fenske Visitor Center, where the Cubs saw exhibits about wildlife and habitat and visited the gift shop. The Scouts ate their lunch at a pavilion behind the Visitor Center.

Then Pack 23 drove to its final stop of the day – the Raptor Trust. Located on the southern border of the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge, the Raptor Trust is a private, volunteer-staffed hospital and rehabilitation center for injured and orphaned birds. The Cub Scouts strolled the grounds, where many hawks, owls, and even bald eagles are housed in enclosed pens.



WHAT, WHERE, WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH

ROBERT E. LEE LIVED IN KENILWORTH – PART 1 OF 2

Robert E. Lee lived in Kenilworth – but not the Confederate General. Nevertheless, he was the General's relative – a great grandnephew. The great grandfather of Robert E. Lee of Kenilworth, was the General's brother. I will refer to Kenilworth's Robert E. Lee as "Mr. Lee."

Born in NYC, Mr. Lee lived from 1892 to 1963. He and his wife, Mary (Glass), had three daughters: Madeline, Roberta, and Mary. All are now deceased. Their son, Robert E. Lee, was killed in a 1933 Five Points automobile accident near to where they lived in Union. In 1941 the Lees moved Kenilworth where they had purchased a new, Blue Ridge Manor home at 12 Columbia Ave. for \$2,850. It was a model home. It was expanded a few years ago by a subsequent owner.

They were practically living in Kenilworth when they lived in Union. Daughter Mary stated in 2002, "We lived in the old Lynch farm house before coming to Kenilworth. It was located somewhat on the SE corner of Galloping Hill Rd. and Washington Ave. It was the home of the same Mr. Lynch as in Merrill and Lynch stock brokers." Today that would be opposite to the entrance of the Merck Pharmaceutical complex.

Mr. Lee studied art at the Fawcett School in Newark and at Cooper Union in New York. He taught art in the Newark, Maplewood, Elizabeth, and Union school systems. Budget cuts of the Great Depression ended his teaching career. To support his family, he became a full-time, selfemployed commercial artist and sign painter. His employers and clients included major outdoor ad-

vertising companies and Bamberger's, Texas Oil, and other firms.

Mr. Lee had an inventive mind, remarkable artistic talents, and a generous heart. Back in the 1920s he invented the "home trainer." He sold the patent rights in 1927 in order to have sufficient funds to purchase a home in Union, later moving to the old farmhouse. Today we know the "home trainer" as the exercise bicycle. He was an avid bicyclist. Before going off to war in 1917, he took part in the Tour d' France.

Daughters Mary and Madeline Virginia confirmed that while in Kenilworth their father developed an electric football board game for two players. They stated their father "waited for an extended period of time to hear about the patent he applied for about the game. During what became a somewhat extended period of time waiting to receive word on his game patent, their father noticed that a major manufacturer of board

games was marketing a product amazingly similar to the one he had developed." They commented that their father attempted to get to the bottom of what had happened to his patent application and how some national company ended up producing a game so much like his own. But he ran into one road block after the other. Lacking the financial resources to pursue it further he stopped his search for answers.

All volunteers are invited to celebrate Earth Day 2025 with a clean-up of the Rahway River within Union County Parks and Recreation's Rahway River Park on Saturday, April 26th (with a rain date of Sunday, April 27th).

The clean-up will focus on areas upstream and downstream of the dam at Winfield Park, New Jersey in Cranford, Clark, Linden, and Rahway.

> Please come by the parking area adjacent to the waterfall of the Rahway River by the Bloodgood Dam at Winfield Park at 8:45 a.m. to register, pick up bags, gloves, bottled water and snacks, and receive safety information. Teams will be encouraged to travel to any part of the river within the park where they would like to perform cleanup activities. We specifically ask all folks to register and to work in small groups for safety purposes. Everyone under 18 must have adult supervision to participate.


After the event there is an inventory of the debris removed, and within approximately 24 hours Union County Parks and Recreation removes and disposes of all the trash.


