CASA FOR CHILDREN OF ESSEX COUNTY

CASA for Children of Essex County (CASA Essex) staff LAST YEAR NEARLY 500 CHILDREN IN ESSEX COUNTY convened with their advocates at Rutgers University School of Law on March 8th to further their understanding of issues affecting youth in foster care.

Karen Smith from the Psychology Department at Rutgers University kicked off the day by helping advocates explore how predictability and safety create variability in children's responses to facing adversity.

Following this informative session, the training leaned into inclusion. Nayamka Williams and Qiana Cooper from the DCF Office of Diversity, Equity and Belonging led a highly engaging discussion of why words matter when addressing individuals and respecting how they choose to address themselves.

To culminate the training, advocates and staff alike were provided with key steps on how to assist youth in the foster care system that are facing immigration issues, led by Katarina Martucci of the NJ Consortium for Immigrant Children.

This day of training proved to be a deep dive into hot topics that are prevalent in the current climate – topics that deeply affect the ability of a child to thrive. As such, there are still over 300 youth in foster care in Essex County that do not have a CASA advocate. Nearing its 40th anniversary, CASA Essex has always aimed to ensure that these youth have a voice in court and in all areas of life by training and supporting community volunteer advocates.

They are removed from their home due to abuse, neglect, or abandonment, separated from their family, and find themselves in a world filled with professionals they don't know. Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) is committed volunteers who work diligently to make sure these children receive the services they need while in foster

WHAT A VOLUNTEER DOES:

Being a CASA is a unique volunteer experience, one where you will make a difference in the life of a child. Working one-on-one with children in foster care, you give them a voice. CASA volunteers advocate for a child's best interest. Volunteers work to collaborate with others involved in the child's life, conduct an assessment of the child's needs, make recommendations on the child's behalf, and provide critical information to the court to assist judges in making timely and informed decisions.

ELIGIBILITY

You do not need any special skills to be a CASA volunteer. You just need desire to help change a child's story, a valid driver's license, be at least 21, clear a background check, basic computer skills and have the ability to communicate orally and in writing. CASA for Children of Essex County provides equal opportunities to all volunteers and volunteer applicants without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity. NO PLASTIC BAGS REMINDER

Livingston Township

Recycling in Plastics Bags?

Residents are reminded that they should never put plastic bags in with recycling or put any type of recycling in plastic bags. Always put recycling out in a sturdy reusable container, such as a recycling container or bin. Paper recycling can be put out in paper bags or in a sturdy reusable bin.

Garbage can be put into plastic bags — kitchen bags, contractor bags, or saved single-use bags, such as those from a supermarket or store from takeout food, etc. Put heavier-duty bags at the curb by themselves or in a bin or container. Lighter-weight bags should be put inside a sturdy container such as a trash can and placed at the curb.

Why Not Use Plastic Bags for Recycling?

Recycling plants use machines and production lines to handle a high volume of recycling items. Plastic bags in the recycling stream become tangled with other items and then get caught and twisted around the rollers. When this happens, the processing line must be completely stopped in order for the plastic bag to be cut apart so that it can be removed from the rollers. This is why it is so important that residents never put either paper or commingled recycling out in plastic bags of any kind.

Properly disposing of these plastic bags in a Why Not Put Plastic Bags in Recycling or Plastic Bag Recycling Bin helps the environment and helps keep local recycling moving smoothly. Anyone needing to dispose of plastic bags can place them in one of the special Plastic Bag Recycling Bins, such as those located outside of the Livingston ShopRite and the Livingston Kings Supermarket, both located on S. Livingston Avenue.
