

CHILDREN GIVEN A HEAD START IN READING

Morristown Rotary Club

Morristown Rotary Club in its latest cycle of grants has provided a grant to HEADSTART to support their innovative Early Language and Literacy Program, which includes providing books for children who attend the Head Start preschool program located in the club's service area.

The Early Language and Literacy Program is targeted at 90 Head Start eligible families whose preschool-age children (three to five years of age) are served at the Robert C. Grant Head Start Center, located at 1 Medical Drive in Morris Plains. There are 6 Head Start classrooms at this site. Four are public pre-k partnership classrooms with Morris School District. The children in these classrooms live in Morristown or Morris Township. The other two classrooms are populated by children who live in nearby towns.

The objective of the Early Language and Literacy Program is to help Head Start families build the habit of daily reading to their children in the home. A disadvantage faced by these children is the lack of access to high-quality books in their home language. By providing families with new, high-quality children's books in their home language, as well as monthly messages (also in their home language) with literacy tips and strategies, HEADSTART can support families in engagement of home literacy habits and activities. Grant funds will support each child receiving a monthly book to take home and keep.



Repair Cafe returns to Madison on Saturday, April 12, 2025. Volunteer repair experts will be helping you to fix your household items for free at Grace Church in Madison (4 Madison Ave.), from 11:00 until 3:00. All types of items can be brought in: lamps, bicycles, clothing and other fabric items, phones and computers, small appliances, wooden things, jewelry, toys, knives in need of sharpening, and many other kinds of repairs. As a bonus, you will get to meet your neighbors from Madison and surrounding towns!

And bring your kids – the Kids' Take Apart Table will return! See what's inside everyday items. (Reassembly not required!)

The Repair Cafe is central to Rotary International's focus on protecting the environment, and furthers our club's mission of partnering with other organizations to keep Madison one of the "Best Places to Live in New Jersey." This event is also an important part of Grace's outreach program.

The repairers will show you how the repairs are made and what tools are needed. Most of the time they can get your things working for you again, keeping them out of the landfills, and saving you some money. You can even learn how to do the repairs yourself. Items should be small enough to be carried in by one person. No gasoline motors or hazardous materials, please. Also, please note: We start our last repair at 2:30! First come, first served! And if you can, it's helpful if you send us an email telling us what you will be bringing in for repair.

This event is a follow-up to our first two, very successful, Repair Cafes in Madison. Our volunteers and our visitors came from Madison and many surrounding towns. We had over 200 items brought in for repair and we succeeded on getting most of them fixed! Our repairs at our recent events ranged from lamps, to bikes and teddy bears, but also included bird feeders and giant skulls.

And we are always looking for new volunteers to join our team. Whether you are an expert repairer with your own tools, or someone who wants to help out on logistics and organization, we would love to have you! There is no age requirement. Our volunteers have ranged in age from their teens to their eighties.
