TEACHER SHINES AT SUPER BOWL AS EAGLES CHEERLEADER

Rahway residents and members of the Rahway Public Schools had a common thing to cheer about when the Eagles took on the Kansas City Chiefs in Super Bowl LIX, everyone in town and all those with any kind of love in their hearts for Rahway were rooting for one Eagles cheerleader, Ms. Deanna Flanagan, a 2013 Rahway High School (RHS) graduate and current dance teacher and choreographer at the high school.

Flanagan (who, we'll add, also graduated from RHS as its valedictorian!) is in her rookie year with the team, having previously served as a cheerleader for the New York Jets and also with the Philadelphia Wings out of the National Lacrosse League.

We asked Flanagan how her involvement with professional cheerleading began, so she took us all the way back to the beginning. She started dancing at the age of two in a variety of genres.

She was never a cheerleader growing up, but her dance training served her well, as she pointed out that cheering in the NFL was much closer to dancing than cheerleading anyway.

Following her graduation from RHS, she attended Marymount Manhattan College, earning a degree in dance. From there, she earned a master's in dance education from Hunter College.

Answering an open call for NFL cheerleaders, Flanagan was selected for the Jets squad and cheered for the team from 2019-2022.

Teaching all day and cheering on the side (literally, on the sidelines. Get it?) can definitely be a busy lifestyle. She noted that, over the course of the season, including the preseason, she attends all the home games and also practices with the squad twice a week.

But, she said, she wouldn't change a thing.

"There really is no feeling like this, especially as a rookie," Flanagan said. "The team has worked so hard, and we're all so excited for the game."

"It means a lot to me to represent not only the Eagles but Rahway too," Flanagan remarked. "Sharing this with my students is really special. I hope it inspires them to live out their own dreams."

Flanagan noted that after each Eagles win this season, she and her students would call the return to school the following day "Victory Monday."

"Everyone would yell out, 'The Birds won!' and there was so much excitement in the building. They were so happy for me and what it represented for Rahway," she said.

Flanagan ended our interview by sharing how much the support of the schools and community means to her and how much she loves being from Rahway and working in the public schools.

"I love sharing my passion for the arts, and this is a great place to do it," she said. "We have such a strong arts community and a great program in the schools."

And Rahway clearly loves her right back.

EARTH DAY RAHWAY RIVER CLEAN-UP SATURDAY, APRIL 26

All volunteers are invited to celebrate Earth Day 2025 with a clean-up of the Rahway River within Union County Parks and Recreation's Rahway River Park on Saturday, April 26th (with a rain date of Sunday, April 27th).

Please join the Rahway River Watershed Association, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, local officials and environmental commissions, fisherman and other stakeholders in this annual event. The clean-up will focus on areas upstream and downstream of the dam at Winfield Park, in Cranford, Clark, Linden, and Rahway.

Please come by the parking area adjacent to the waterfall of the Rahway River by the Bloodgood Dam at Winfield Park at 8:45 a.m. to register, pick up bags, gloves, bottled water and snacks, and receive safety information. Teams will be encouraged to travel to any part of the river within the park where they would like to perform cleanup activities. We specifically ask all folks to register and to work in small groups for safety purposes. Everyone under 18 must have their parent's signature on the attached Individual Waiver form as well as adult supervision to participate.

Cleaning up a river and park area is a great way to celebrate Earth Day and if you haven't participated in an event like this before, you will find it invigorating, and you will feel good about what you have accomplished...it is also fun and educational...especially for Scouts and young

adults as they always find something interesting. Over the 25+ years this cleanup has occurred thousands of folks have participated, and pulled some amazing things from the river improving its quality. The Rahway River watershed is a better place thanks to the commitment of so many great volunteers over the last quarter century!

The clean-up will generally be between 9-12, but any amount of time or effort that folks can volunteer is appreciated. There is always a large volume of floatable debris to pick up. The team working registration will provide suggestions on areas with large volumes of floatable debris.

All participants should wear jeans, long-sleeved shirts, gloves and boots, Waders are welcome for folks who like to get a little wet. Each participant should bring a standard 5-gallon carry bucket with a handle (put your name on the bottom)... this makes for easy carrying of "stuff" for transfer to the large garbage bags. A mulching rake is also a great asset to have to enable reaching out and pulling debris into shore from the riverbank.

After the event there is an inventory of the debris removed, and within approximately 24 hours Union County Parks and Recreation removes and disposes of all the trash.




RAHWAY PEER LEADER ATTENDS ELKS CONFERENCE

Ms. Kristina Petti, Rahway Elks #1075 member and teacher at the Rahway Academy, has known Alexa and her family for a few years and was her chaperone on the trip. Another familiar face was Shean Opie, NJ State Antlers Chair.

Alexa was selected to represent her lodge and school because of her positive qualities as a philanthropist and student. She truly embodies the conferences' spirit of collaboration, community, and motivation. Ms. Petti remarked that "Alexa is the type of student that prioritizes our community and helps to make this word better, over her own needs. She deserved to go to the conference because I know that she will bring back what she learned to make an impact on our whole community." Throughout the entire weekend, Alexa could be seen in the front row of every workshop and speaker session, taking notes on her phone, snapping pictures of quotes and information displayed on the big screens, and taking selfies with the speakers.

The goals of the conference are "to increase participant's ability to make healthy decisions for themselves, and to assist their peers in doing the same. The Conference provides peer leaders with specific tools and resources to implement action plans in their communities, thus creating a network with the ability to educate their peer groups, schools, and communities on the skills learned at the conference.

This year's schedule was rigorous but also included opportunities for fun and enjoyment!

The students heard from seven different speakers and had three different opportunities to go to workshops of their choice. The event culminated with a planning session where they had encouraged them to set goals and make a plan to implement them. Specifically, to "set goals to be accomplished in 1 month, 3 months, and 1 year. To make your school a better place."

The conference also included so many elements of fun. Students got to room with their friends overnight on Friday and Saturday, and the youth staff led them in playing fun games during down times. The conference provided students the opportunity to make new friends, step out of their comfort zone, and share your story, in the hopes that someone can relate.


This year's Peer Leadership conference saw a record high of attendees, with 484 students attending the conference. This conference is unique to New Jersey and students from all over the Garden State attended. The cost of the conference is \$385 per attendee, however that does not cover the entire cost to the state. Throughout the year, the Elks Drug Awareness committees fundraise on the state, district, and local levels to donate towards this incredible event. State chair, MaryEllen Lawrence, from Howell Lodge, revealed that we raised \$55,000 across the state this year and has set a goal of \$65,000 for next year. That is all money that is not part of the participant cost, but goes towards Peer Leadership, as well as other drug awareness programs through the Elks.

Next year, the Rahway Antlers #39 will have many more eligible students for this opportunity, as they have a large number of members in eighth grade. KU KLUX KLAN PROVIDES DARK CHAPTER IN RAHWAY HISTORY (PART 1)

When most think of the Ku Klux Klan, they probably think of the South and the period after the Civil War. One might have images of hooded specters carousing under moonlit skies terrorizing former slaves in an attempt to reestablish the traditional southern way of life. What usually doesn't come to mind are images of Klansmen in full regalia burning crosses and staging mass gatherings in places like New Jersey. Yet, for the ten years following World War I, the Klan experienced a revival as their twisted philosophy of extremism and hate spread into cities and states across the mid-west and north and by 1922 was even at Rahway's doorstep.

If the first wave of the KKK's activities was during the Period of Reconstruction (1865-1877), the nineteen teens and 1920s are considered the second wave. A catalyst of the rebirth was D. W. Griffith's 1915 silent film "The Birth of a Nation" which glorified the founding of the Klan and romanticized its noxious exploits. Shortly after the movie's premier, a mass meeting of Klan members was held at Stone Mountain, Georgia for the purpose of reviving the organization. Traditional values were once again being threatened and this time there were new groups to hate.

The 18th Amendment to the United States Constitution was adopted in 1919 effectively production, outlawing the importation, transportation, and sale of alcoholic beverages. The Klan sided with federal lawmakers and Christian extremists that alcohol was a main factor in destroying the fabric of American society and they pointed their fingers at those they felt were to blame. Emphasizing their "America First" agenda, they honed in on foreigners, immigrants (especially Italians), the Roman Catholic Church, and Jews as the ones responsible for changing the American ethnic character. The Klan continued their hostility towards Blacks, was opposed to organized labor, and spoke against the League of Nations. The views seemed radical, but by the 1920s nationwide membership in the KKK reached 4,000,000 and Americans across the country were becoming aware of their shadowy presence.

By the summer of 1924, the Klan had become a political force and had made their way onto the floor of both Republican and Democratic National Conventions. Delegates who supported the cultural and social philosophies of the Klan were there to influence the party platforms and the selection of a candidate to run for President of the United States. Although they failed to accomplish much, the Klan had reached the pinnacle of its power and was ready to put their power on display.

On Thursday, July 1, 1924, the Rahway Police Department was notified at 11:30 PM that a cross was on fire on the SE corner of St. Georges Avenue and Central Avenue on the field next to Lincoln School. The blaze was reported to be 6' tall and 4' across. When a patrolman arrived, no one was found in the vicinity and the concern became moving vehicles that had stopped on St. Georges to view the fire. It was not established if


this was the work of the KKK or a prank by young boys imitating the group. The next incident would leave no doubt the Klan's nefarious presence was active in the city.

On Wednesday evening, February 25, 1925, the residents living in neighborhoods around Central Avenue were roused out of their beds at 12:30 at night by a deafening bomb blast sounding from the direction of Riverside Park (Veterans Field). The blast signaled the lighting of a huge 18' tall cross positioned in the middle of the field. At the same time the blast was heard, two smaller crosses were lit in two other locations. One cross was burning on the corner of Elm Avenue and St. Georges and a second was lit on the corner of Hazelwood Avenue and New Brunswick Avenue across from Columbian School. After the explosion, an eyewitness observed a truck going down Central followed by eight or ten cars moving in parade-like fashion. A resident familiar with the ceremonial practices of the Klan explained that crosses were burned to either mark when membership enrollment reached 200 or to signal the end of a member drive.

Most responded to the bomb and blazes with surprise. The belief in Rahway was that, although there were news reports of Klan activities in other cities in Union County, they had never invaded Mentioning the Ku Klux Klan by name, he Rahway. You don't have to pack up your supplies and travel to your community garden to water and take care of them. Additionally, with the help of a friend, containers can easily be moved into a sunnier area later in the season as the sun shifts its position.




