

ST. JOHN THE APOSTLE PARISH CELEBRATES 75TH ANNIVERSARY

The Church of St. John the Apostle began its 75th Anniversary Celebration on February 26, 2025 with a Gala Dinner at Nanina's in the Park in Belleville NJ. Over 250 parishioners and parish friends attended the event along with the current Pastor Mauro Primavera and Auxiliary Bishop Elias R. Lorenzo, OSB, regional bishop for Union County. Also present were Parish Clergy, the Sisters of St. Dominic as well as representatives from the Township of Clark and the City of Linden.Honoree at the celebration was Sister Donna Marie O'Brien OP who was honored for her commitment to Catholic Education and shaping the minds of countless children from 1960-2015. Sr. Donna was past principal of St. John the Apostle School for 34 years, retiring in 2015.


Bishop Elias Lorenzo addressed the attendees at the Gala and wrote in the Commemorative Anniversary Book, "The Diamond Anniversary offers all in the parish the opportunity to renew and reinvigorate your founding mission... and be a community of living faith that witnesses Christ's love to the world!"

The Most Reverand Thomas J. Walsh, Archbishop of Newark founded the parish on June 4, 1948, and appointed the Rev. Thomas F. Mulvaney as the first pastor. Father Mulvaney was given the task of organizing the parish and construction the buildings. The new parish used the Winfield Park Community Center for masses until the new church building was ready. The cornerstone was placed on September 10, 1949. On March 10, 1950, Archbishop Walsh dedicated and blessed the new church and school and the first mass was celebrated in the church.

St. John the Apostle School opened in September 1950 with of a registration of 710 students. The teaching faculty was led by Sisters of the Dominican Order who served for the school for 65 years. The school enrollment grew and a third floor was added to the school. By 1963, enrollment had more than doubled to 1,429 students prompting the construction of the annex building to accommodate a growing middle school.

Saint John's is a vibrant growing parish with over 300 students enrolled in its religious education programs, 340 students enrolled in its Pre-k to 8 school, 24 Hour Perpetual Adoration, ongoing adult religious education programs, and many other social and religious events. Continued 75th Anniversary Celebrations will continue throughout the year. A closing Anniversary Mass will be celebrated by Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, CSsR,Archbishop of Newark on Sunday October 12th at the 12 noon mass.

SUPPORT FOR CRITICAL REPAIRS IN ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLDS

Residents in Clark may be eligible for assistance through a Home Improvement Program designed to help low- and moderateincome homeowners make up to \$20,000 in essential repairs to their homes.

This program is available to homeowners struggling with outdated or failing major home systems. It provides financial assistance for necessary repairs and replacements such as roofing, plumbing, electrical systems, heating units, and weatherization features like windows and insulation.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- To qualify, applicants must:
- Own and reside in a home located within the designated program area.
- Be current on property taxes and, if applicable, mortgage payments.
- Maintain valid homeowner's insurance.
- Have a household income that falls within the program's limits for low-to-moderate income (as defined by household size and geographic region).
- Have at least one major system in need of significant repair or replacement.
- Meet any additional requirements, as outlined in program guidelines.

Seeing the ambulance also makes them more comfortable by taking the mystery out of what happens when we treat a patient and transport them to a hospital.

After the tour, the troop leader provided materials for each Scout to make her own first aid kit, explaining how each item in their kit should be used.




