GIRL SCOUTS EARN PRESTIGIOUS SILVER AWARD

The Girl Scout Silver Award is one of the highest awards a Girl Scout Cadette can earn, demonstrating their commitment to leadership, service, and making a positive impact. The award recognizes leadership, personal values, and service to the community through a Take Action Project, requiring Girl Scouts to research an issue, make a plan, and take action to improve their community.

Meghan Gupta, Sonia Nikhil, Grace Schroeder, and Olivia Videla, four WHRHS freshmen from Troop 65461 in Green Brook earned their Silver Award.

Sonia Nikhil and Grace Schroeder's project entitled, "Positive Smiles Go For Miles," spread mental health awareness to local young children. They interviewed doctors and experts about the ways to teach kids about the importance of mental health and positivity. They also hosted a positivity workshop for young kids where they discussed how to bring happiness to your day, words of affirmation, flip flopping, and understanding your emotions, as well as inner peace and gratitude. They emphasized the importance of gratitude with the kids by putting it into action. Each of the kids made a bracelet with a word of affirmation and wrote an accompanying card that they later brought to young cancer patients at a local hospital. Along with the card, which they called a smile card, were six ways to bring positivity to your

day and a QR code to a spotify playlist curated by the kids at the workshop with songs intended to put you in a happy, cheerful mood. The cancer patients loved and appreciated the cards and bracelets, and the kids that attended the workshop learned valuable lessons about mental health.

Meghan Gupta and Olivia Videla's project entitled, "The ABC's of Healthy Living," addressed current childhood obesity concerns by promoting a healthy lifestyle to young children through a curriculum and workbook designed to encourage healthy eating habits and exercise. They interviewed numerous community members, including pediatricians, school administrators, kindergarten, physical education, and special education teachers. Their insight helped guide the design of the workbook. The workbook, also titled "The ABC's of Healthy Living," provides a variety of educational opportunities for the young students. For each letter of the alphabet, the workbook provides a recipe and exercise along with pages to color, to practice handwriting and spelling, as well as math skills. The workbook also provides a social-emotional component for each letter, and the entire workbook includes accommodations for special education students and gifted and talented learners. The workbooks have been distributed to local schools, after care and summer camp locations, and the local library.


COMPUTER SCIENCE STUDENTS RANKED #1 IN STATE AND HEADED TO FINALS IN MAY

ALISHA LI EARNS REGIONAL HONORS IN FENCING

Wellesley College sophomore Alisha Li of Warren earned the 2025 United States Fencing Coaches Association (USFCA) selection as All-Region honors. Alisha made the Division III team in epee. The awards are determined based on

Li made it to the quarterfinals round at the NCAA Northeast Regional, taking 26th among all divisions.

Alisha was Co-Captain of the Fencing team at Warren Hills Regional High School and made First Team All-State in 2022 and 2023. As freshman at Wellsley she won 80 meet matches. She made her collegiate debut with 11 victories at the LIU Shark Tank Challenge. Other accomplishments include: a team-leading 16 wins at the Vassar Invitational; picked up 13 conference wins at NFC Conference Meet No. 1 and the Brandeis Invitational; undefeated against



Division I Northwestern at the Tufts Invitational; went 10-2 at the Eric Sollee Invitational and the EWFC Championships; and advanced to quarterfinals and placed 32nd in epee at the NCAA Northeast Regional. Li was awarded USFCA DIII Newcomer of the Year in Epee and earned a spot on the 2023-24 All-Academic Team.

As a sophomore more Alisha earned 54 victories in dual matches; opened the season with six wins at the Shark Tank Challenge; went 11-4 at the Vassar Invitational; notched 16 victories at the NFC Conference Meets; had strong wins against Division I opponents Cornell and Penn State at the Brandeis Invitational, collected 10 victories at the EWFC Championships.

In both her freshman and sophomore years, Alisha was selected USFCA Northeast Fencing Conference All-Regional Team; Division III All-America Honorable Mention; and Northeast Fencing Conference Second Team.

Watchung Hills Regional High School

A partnership of the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation, Poetry Out Loud is a national arts education program that encourages the study of great poetry by offering a dynamic recitation competition to high schools across the country. The Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) English department launched its first year of Poetry Out Loud in September 2024. English teachers Mike Porter, Lynn Raimondo, and Michelle Lesniak led this initiative. Eleven students recited a poem for the full English Department during the WHRHS semi-finals on December 11th. Nine of those semi-finalists competed in the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud finals on January 16th.

Each student recited two poems during finals. Ms. Mary Ellen Phelan, WHRHS Director of Curriculum and Instruction, WHRHS teacher of Social Studies, Ms. Cara Yuknis, and recently retired WHRHS teacher of English Ms. Laura Goodson served as judges.

Zoya Balakrishnan won the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud finals with Tiffany Hwang as an alternate. As the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud winner, Zoya went on to perform in the New Jersey POL Region 4 competition at the Mayo Performing Arts Center in Morristown.

The first year of Poetry Out Loud sparked much collaboration and learning through close performance, reading, recitation, and competition. WHRHS plans to start its next season this spring to involve more classes, more teachers, and more students to give them more time to practice and prepare for the NJ POL



more people involved, especially the underclassmen, so they can see the whole performance.

They performed in reverse alphabetical order by last name, so Zoya was last in the rotation. This meant that "We Are Not Responsible" was the closing performance - it was a good closer for the show!

A reflection from Zoya Balakrishman "Poetry Out Loud was an amazing way for me to develop a new appreciation for a form of literature often overlooked by high school students in favor of their familiarity with prose. Before participating, I had heard of a few popular poets: Maya Angelou, Ralph Waldo Emerson, and Elizabeth Acevedo. But the three poems I finally chose to recite were from entirely unfamiliar poets with

Region 4 competition. WHRHS hopes to get uniquely fascinating stories to tell. I explored 18th-century sonnets alongside modern blank verse storytelling and practiced performance alongside comprehension. Poetry Out Loud is an amazing way for students to delve into poetry and its intricate interpretations without the pressure of creating original works. I received an immense amount of guidance and advice from our coordinators, all of whom helped me so much with my understanding of the poems on a deeper level. At the regional level, Poetry Out Loud was a chance for me to discover the talents and perspectives of others as well as bond with passionate, like-minded students. I fully intend to participate again next year and hope to see even more students interested in the event, giving them a chance to gain the same enthusiasm and appreciation for poetry that I did.





ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

Household items such as old furniture, rugs, and collections from attic, basement or tool shed. Please be sure that all items can be safely moved from your vehicle to the dumpsters. Use appropriate boxes where needed.

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED:

Major appliances, air conditioners, concrete, propane tanks, tree stumps, tires, paint and other toxic materials, recyclables and building materials will not be accepted. If it is more than 1-2 sections of fence or sheetrock, it will not be accepted.

PLEASE SEPARATE METAL AND ELECTRONIC ITEMS:

ANNUAL EGG HUNT WAS A SUCCESS



STUDENTS SHINE IN THE 2025 STEAM TANK™ CHALLENGE

Green Brook Public Schools

Sixth-grade STEAM students at Green Brook Middle School showcased their creativity and problem-solving skills in this year's STEAM TankTM Challenge, an annual event hosted by the New Jersey School Boards Association. Open to all public schools in New Jersey, this competition encourages students to devise innovative solutions to real-world problems, from climate change to societal issues affecting their schools, communities, and beyond.

This year, Green Brook Middle School excelled with seven teams advancing to the Regional round of the competition. During the virtual presentations at Regionals, students introduced their inventive solutions to a panel of judges. Among the projects were a gas separation membrane designed to capture carbon dioxide from factory smokestacks, an app for donating food to those in need, a faucet device aimed at conserving household water, robots to clean oceans and beaches, a drone package delivery system, a seedbox farming kit for dispersing seed balls in challenging environments, and an app focused on making healthcare more accessible and affordable.

The dedication, teamwork, and ingenuity of the students were evident as they presented their inventions and innovations tailored to tackle pressing challenges. Their innovative thinking and presentation skills received high praise from the judges. Competition results will be announced soon, and if selected, the students will advance to the Final round of the competition.

VEHICLE THEFTS AND RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES

Vehicle thefts and residential burglaries are not unique to our township, as they are happening throughout the entire State of New Jersey. These incidents are crimes of opportunity. To help you protect your family and neighbors, we provide below some simple actions that you can take right away.

Most Importantly, Report Suspicious Activity Immediately! If you see a suspicious person or vehicle, contact the Police Department without delay at (732) 968-1188 or dial 911 in the event of an emergency. Even if you think it might not be significant, it is better to report it to the police rather than just posting it on social media or a community page.

BELOW ARE ADDITIONAL ACTIONS THAT ALL Residents can take to protect one Another:

- Make your home look occupied and difficult to break in by illuminate your home. Beginning at sunset, leave both interior and exterior lights on whether your home is occupied or not.
- Secure your vehicle. Always remove key fobs and garage door openers from your vehicle. Lock the car doors. If possible, park your vehicle in the garage overnight.
- Activate your alarms. Always set your home and vehicle alarms.

- Do not leave vehicles running and unattended. Never leave a running vehicle unattended. Never leave valuable items, such as purses and wallets, inside the vehicle and visible from the outside.
- Protect valuables. Do not keep large amounts of cash at home. Secure jewelry or other valuables.
- Check your security cameras. Test and confirm that your security cameras are functional and properly positioned to monitor key areas.
- Lock all doors and windows in your home, and keep garage doors closed and locked.
- Install deadbolts on exterior doors. Place a secondary locking device on sliding glass doors, such as a door stop lock or a bar in the sliding track.
- Remove all packages delivered to your home as soon as possible. Activate electronic delivery notifications so you know when packages arrive.
- Remove garbage and recycling cans from the street soon after pickup.
- Remove mail from your mailboxes daily.
- Keep your cell phone nearby. Have your phone within reach, so you can quickly contact the police if needed.
 - Spread awareness. Share this information with friends, family, and neighbors.

As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the wellbeing of military members, veterans, and their families. We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives.
