

PRESBY MEMORIAL IRIS GARDENS THE RAINBOW ON THE HILL

The Presby Memorial Iris Gardens is in its 98th year of blooming. It is located at 474 Upper Mountain Avenue, Upper Montclair. Opening day is May 15th. Walk through a garden blooming with more than 100,000 iris flowers.

Essex County is hosting a 'Family Garden Party' on Saturday, May 17th (Rain Date: Sunday, May 18). This is a free community event featuring entertainment, crafts, face painting, booths from local organizations such as the Essex County Environmental Center and Turtle Back Zoo, and various food trucks. The Bloom Room will be open for shopping.

Located at the base of the 7 1/2-acre Mountainside Park (474 Upper Mountain Ave., Upper Montclair), the Presby Memorial Iris Gardens contain over 14,000 irises of approximately 3,000 varieties and produce over 100,000 blooms over the course of the season.

The annual spring Bloom Season is typically mid-May

through the first week of June. Certain beds will bloom in October. Visitors can see by the arching slope of the garden beds is why Presby is often referred to as the "rainbow on the hill".

A recent addition is the PresBee Sanctuary which currently supports 10 active hives with well over 100,000 Italian honeybees.

This park contains a segment of the 36-mile Lenape Trail, a unique urban/suburban trail connecting 18 parks and 11 municipalities in Essex County. 

MEMORIAL DAY: A TIME FOR REFLECTION AND ACTION

Every Memorial Day, millions of Americans attend parades, fire up their grills, and host large backyard BBQs for friends and family. As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and servicemembers take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. Fortunately, there are many organizations working tirelessly to help our uniformed heroes get through these difficult times.

In 2017, the New Jersey Veterans Network (501(c)3) was created with a focus on the wellbeing of military members, veterans, and their families. The NJVN is a volunteer-driven mobile outreach team that actively seeks out veterans in need, providing them with free, life-saving resources and services. As a grassroots organization, we have a unique perspective on the needs of our uniformed heroes.

Our approach, combined with the ability to

collaborate with other organizations that share our mission, has allowed us to save lives and help veterans live a better quality of life. Recently, the NJVN has ramped up our mentorship and peer support programs. However, our recreational therapy events and functions have produced the most impactful results.

The NJVN has had great success hosting social events such as: movie nights, group hiking, paintball, professional sporting games, fishing trips, hunting, and other outdoor activities. Additionally, every year, the NJVN sends veterans to Camp Patriot (a PTSD retreat) for a week of healing.

Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits information, and mental health support. By partnering with numerous other groups and organizations, we can offer our uniformed heroes a better way of life.

We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives. Volunteers are the most important NJVN resource, and we would love to have more people help us save lives. 




Come see Brady Corbet's THE BRUTALIST on the big screen in our program room!


This film is rated R, and runs 3 hours & 40 minutes, including a 15-minute intermission. It will be screened with English subtitles for the hard of hearing.






