GENE SPILLANE REFLECTS ON SERVICE AND SACRIFICE

In an emotional and deeply personal address, Army Captain Eugene "Gene" Spillane recently stood before a gathering of 20 veterans, Sons of the American Legion, and community members at the Guy R. Bosworth American Legion Post in Millburn to share his journey of service, sacrifice, and healing, 17 years after returning home from war.

Captain Spillane, a proud Millburn native and 1983 graduate of Millburn High School where he played football, recounted his remarkable path from local banker to battlefield leader. A former employee at PNC Bank on Essex Street, Spillane graduated from Army Airborne School in 1985 and made his fifth jump right here in New Jersey at Fort Dix. Married and the father of twin daughters, Spillane's life took a dramatic turn when he was deployed as an Army Reservist from Fort Bragg to Sadr City in northern Baghdad.

Assigned to a Civil Affairs unit under the direction of General David Petraeus, Spillane's mission was nothing short of rebuilding a war-torn community. With a background in finance, he jokingly referred to himself as a "banker turned tanker". In the combat zone, he quickly became known as "the money man." His work included reestablishing essential services: reopening markets, delivering electricity and clean water, building schools and clinics, and establishing police and fire departments to bring a sense of normalcy and stability back to the people of Sadr City.

During his deployment, the Millburn Post and Squadron supported his unit with a care package that was filled with comfort items like Kool-Aid, socks, and even some spirits to lift morale.

Captain Spillane proudly presented the Post and Squadron with a flag signed by members of his unit, along with a commemorative Commander Coin he had received from his commanding officer, Colonel Hort. "It's my way of saying thank you," he said.

In a moving moment, Captain Spillane admitted that he had recently opened his footlocker for the first time since returning home at the age of 42. Encouraged by his wife, who he credits with helping him finally face the past, he shared stories that had been locked away for nearly two decades. His voice cracked with emotion as he recounted how his interpreter and dear friend, Ali, saved his life on two separate occasions.

Spillane recalled June 24, 2008 as a day of both joy and tragedy. While home for the birth of his twin daughters, a bomb exploded at a District Advisory Council meeting he would have attended. Among those lost that day were:

"These were the best of us," Spillane said solemnly. "When you send people to war, you send your best."

Through his grief, Captain Spillane shared the hope that came from his team's accomplishments. By the end of his tour, schools were open, adults were taking computer and nursing classes, and Sadr City had stabilized. "God puts you in places where you are needed," he said. "And we were needed there."

Now 17 years later, Spillane continues to live with purpose. I try every day to be a good father, husband, friend, and American. "I had to put everything away and figure out how to live," he said. "Tonight, I feel like a weight has been lifted."

Joseph Cobianchi, American Legion Essex County Commander, was in attendance and shared, "As a Vietnam veteran, I understand where he comes from. I know more than anyone else about the pain and emotion he had to wait 17 years to share and get out of his system." And Darrell Collins, a member of the American Legion Department Executive Council, reflected on the power of the evening: "I am fortunate to be here tonight as he was bringing us into his story, and many soldiers don't tell their story. These are stories that need to be heard and need to be shared with others."

"We thank Captain Spillane for joining us tonight, presenting us with his unit's flag that will be prominently displayed in our hall as a poignant reminder of the price of freedom and the healing power of community" said American Legion Post 140 Commander, Burt Brown.

As a veteran, I look forward to marching in a parade and attending a BBQ. However, before the festivities begin, I make it a point to check in on fellow veterans and ensure they are in a good place. For some veterans, Memorial Day is a difficult day, and they could use some reassurance from a friend or comrade.

For too long, our military members and veterans have been facing a heartbreaking crisis. A new study suggests that 44 veterans and service members take their lives every day. This has become a nationwide epidemic, and countless families are struggling with this issue alone. 



SCHOLASTIC ART AND WRITING NATIONAL MEDAL WINNERS

Millburn Township Public Schools Seven Millburn High School students have won 9 National Medals for Art, the highest honor a student can earn in visual arts in our nation.

A national medal in the portfolio category of the Scholastic Art Competition is arguably the highest distinction that a high school student can

earn in the Visual Arts. To be eligible for this Award in Art for her portfolio, For Her Voices, award, graduating seniors must submit a series of 6 distinct works that communicate versatility in artistic vision and a high level of technical skill.

Obenewaa Frimpomaa is one of eight national gold medal recipients of a 2025 Gold Portfolio

which was chosen from a pool of more than 6,162 portfolios. That's less than 0.1%! Winners of this highly selective award receive a \$12,000 educational scholarship and are specially highlighted at the national awards ceremony held at Carnegie Hall in New York City.

LADDERS TO SPLATTERS, A CAUTIONARY TALE FROM THE TOP RUNG The Perilous World of Springtime Yardwork

Submitted by Emilie Whitley, MSHVFAS When I hear the chipper roar, or the chainsaw rev, I wince, as a picture of an ER visit unfolds. My husband openly admits he's afraid of heights, so normally I'm the one who climbs the ladder. Having returned that morning on the red-eye, he was the one to climb. Jet lagged, or the lure of a warm spring day, fate was sealed.

It's spring! The house needs fixing, the yard needs cleaning, we dust off those tools and fire up those engines. It's also a time when the Millburn Short Hills Volunteer First Aid Squad (MSHVFAS) would probably prefer we weren't so zealous. Falls off ladders, especially when improperly secured, are common. MSHVFAS responded to 201 fall calls in 2024, including residents clearing gutters or repairing roofs. Falls from such heights can result in serious injuries, from spinal fractures to internal trauma1.

We unleash our power tools come spring to do battle with bushes, trees and lawns. These can inflict serious injuries, from lacerations, eye injuries to amputations. Yard work is physically tough and heaving mulch, digging or wrestling wheelbarrows, can turn into an extreme workout. Renewed physical activity can stress the heart, leading to angina or heart attacks.

Our gardens are the envy of many, lawns pristine, borders spectacular. The secret behind their beauty? Chemical fertilizers, weed killers

and insecticides. These chemicals, if inhaled or absorbed, are poisonous. Symptoms of exposure include diarrhea, vomiting, teary eyes or even seizures.

Out in the garden, poisonous plants can cause severe skin rashes (poison ivy, poison oak, giant hogweed, and poison sumac)2. Sheds, or roof soffits, are places where hornets and wasps like to nest over winter. Removing nests without proper protection can cause hornets to swarm and sting. Skin scratches or punctures can become contaminated with the tetanus bacteria, a reminder to keep up to date with tetanus vaccinations3.

My husband got away with a torn ligament, a nasty graze, and a Jackson Pollock original on the balcony. The man in the opposite bay who'd also fallen wasn't so lucky – he broke his neck. We left hospital with a new resolve; some jobs are best left to the professionals. But don't let this put you off. Get out there. Feel the sun on your face, get your hands dirty. Just be smart, keep your wits about you, stay alert, and whatever you do, don't climb ladders when you're running on fumes and espresso.




