24 RESIDENTS EARN CPR CERTIFICATION

24 Roselle Park residents earned their CPR certification after completing the "Putting Life First" seminar held in March. The certification, which is valid for two years, ensures these residents are equipped with essential life-saving skills to respond effectively in emergencies.

"We started this program after a local resident lost their life in a motorcycle accident," said Councilman Gregory Johnson. "In situations like that, sometimes all emergency personnel need is just a few more minutes to arrive. Those minutes can mean the difference between life and death."

The success of the event was made possible through the leadership of Councilman Johnson, the dedication of the Garwood First Aid Squad, and the support of the Roselle Park Police Department. Gratitude is also extended to Neri's Deli for providing refreshments and lunch, as well as to the Gregory Johnson Civic Association for its generous sponsorship of raffle prizes.

"That's why it's critical to empower everyday

people with the tools and training to act swiftly and confidently before first responders get there," continued Councilman Johnson. "This isn't just a seminar — it's a movement. It's about putting life first in Roselle Park and making sure our residents are prepared to protect each other when every second counts."
