STUDENTS WIN FIRST PLACE IN VEX IQ ROBOTICS TOURNEY WILL REPRESENT NJ IN THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP IN MAY

Borough of Watchung

Watchung Valley View Middle School and Bayberry Elementary School students won first place at the VEX IQ NJ State Championship held at NJIT (Newark). This victory qualifies them for the chance to showcase their skills at the 2025 VEX Robotics World Championship on May 12, 2025, in Dallas, TX.

The VEX IQ Robotics Competition, presented by the Robotics Education & Competition Foundation, make up the world's largest and fastest-growing competitive robotics programs for elementary schools, middle schools, high schools, and colleges around the world. There are more than 23,000 VEX teams from 70 countries that participate in over 2,300 events worldwide.

Watchung's VEX IQ Robotics Competition team is comprised of Rishi Keshavapatnam, Julian Larsen, Ethan Lee, William Lee, Mason Marcellus, Daniel Marko, Jonathan Marko, Tom Marko, and Arman Radia.

In the VEX IQ Robotics Competition, students, with guidance from their coaches and mentors, build a robot using simple, snap-together VEX IQ parts to solve an engineering

challenge that is presented each year in the form of a game. Teams work together to score points in Teamwork Matches and get to show off their skills individually in driver-controlled and programming Robot Skills Challenges.

In addition to building robots, the STEM Research Project component of the VEX IQ Robotics Competition encourages students to actively explore an engineering challenge of their choice and share their research findings with event judges and their community.

The VEX IQ Robotics Competition fosters student development of teamwork, collaboration, critical thinking, project management, and communication skills required to prepare them to become the next generation of innovators and problem solvers.

Ophir Marko, the team's coach said, "This is the third year our teams represent the State of New Jersey at the World Championship. Watchung has a remarkable talent pool to draw from, and competition this year was tough. To say I am proud of these young students would be an understatement."

The Champion Team will be honored during the May 8th Mayor & Council Meeting.

ALISHA LI EARNS REGIONAL HONORS IN FENCING

Wellesley College sophomore Alisha Li of Warren earned the 2025 United States Fencing Coaches Association (USFCA) selection as All-Region honors. Alisha made the Division III team in epee. The awards are determined based on result and field size at each of the NCAA Regional Competitions.

Li made it to the quarterfinals round at the NCAA Northeast Regional, taking 26th among all divisions.

Alisha was Co-Captain of the Fencing team at Warren Hills Regional High School and made First Team All-State in 2022 and 2023. As freshman at Wellsley she won 80 meet matches. She made her collegiate debut with 11 victories at the LIU Shark Tank Challenge. Other accomplishments include: a team-leading 16 wins at the Vassar Invitational; picked up 13 conference wins at NFC Conference Meet No. 1 and the Brandeis Invitational; undefeated against Division I Northwestern at the Tufts Invitational; went 10-2 at the Eric Sollee Invitational and the EWFC Championships; and advanced to quarterfinals and placed 32nd in epee at the NCAA Northeast Regional. Li was awarded USFCA DIII Newcomer of the Year in Epee and earned a spot on the 2023-24 All-Academic Team.

As a sophomore more Alisha earned 54 victories in dual matches; opened the season with six wins at the Shark Tank Challenge; went 11-4 at the Vassar Invitational; notched 16 victories at

the NFC Conference Meets; had strong wins against Division I opponents Cornell and Penn State at the Brandeis Invitational, collected 10 victories at the EWFC Championships.

In both her freshman and sophomore years, Alisha was selected USFCA Northeast Fencing Conference All-Regional Team; Division III All-America Honorable Mention; and Northeast Fencing Conference Second Team.

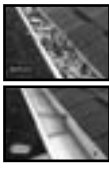

STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN POETRY OUT LOUD COMPETITION

Watchung Hills Regional High School

A partnership of the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation, Poetry Out Loud is a national arts education program that encourages the study of great poetry by offering a dynamic recitation competition to high schools across the country. The Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) English department launched its first year of Poetry Out Loud in September 2024. English teachers Mike Porter, Lynn Raimondo, and Michelle Lesniak led this initiative. Eleven students recited a poem for the full English Department during the WHRHS semi-finals on December 11th. Nine of those semi-finalists competed in the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud finals on January 16th.

Each student recited two poems during finals. Ms. Mary Ellen Phelan, WHRHS Director of Curriculum and Instruction, WHRHS teacher of Social Studies, Ms. Cara Yuknis, and recently retired WHRHS teacher of English Ms. Laura Goodson served as judges.

Zoya Balakrishnan won the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud finals with Tiffany Hwang as an alternate. As the WHRHS Poetry Out Loud winner, Zoya went on to perform in the New Jersey POL Region 4 competition at the Mayo Performing Arts Center in Morristown.

The first year of Poetry Out Loud sparked much collaboration and learning through close reading, recitation, performance, and competition. WHRHS plans to start its next season this spring to involve more classes, more

teachers, and more students to give them more time to practice and prepare for the NJ POL Region 4 competition. WHRHS hopes to get more people involved, especially the underclassmen, so they can see the whole performance.

They performed in reverse alphabetical order by last name, so Zoya was last in the rotation. This meant that "We Are Not Responsible" was the closing performance - it was a good closer for the show!

A reflection from Zoya Balakrishman "Poetry Out Loud was an amazing way for me to develop a new appreciation for a form of literature often overlooked by high school students in favor of their familiarity with prose. Before participating, I had heard of a few popular poets: Maya Angelou, Ralph Waldo Emerson, and Elizabeth Acevedo. But the three poems I finally chose to

recite were from entirely unfamiliar poets with uniquely fascinating stories to tell. I explored 18th-century sonnets alongside modern blank verse storytelling and practiced performance alongside comprehension. Poetry Out Loud is an amazing way for students to delve into poetry and its intricate interpretations without the pressure of creating original works. I received an immense amount of guidance and advice from our coordinators, all of whom helped me so much with my understanding of the poems on a deeper level. At the regional level, Poetry Out Loud was a chance for me to discover the talents and perspectives of others as well as bond with passionate, like-minded students. I fully intend to participate again next year and hope to see even more students interested in the event, giving them a chance to gain the same enthusiasm and appreciation for poetry that I did."

GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY MARKS MILESTONE

The future of the Watchung library took a significant step forward on Friday, April 4, 2025, with the groundbreaking ceremony for a new building. The event, held in front of the old Watchung Library building, drew approximately 75 enthusiastic community members, library staff, and local officials.

Brian Auger, Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) Library Director, echoed the community's anticipation at the event, stating, "From a library services perspective, this is the 2nd greatest day for Watchung. The greatest day will be when the new library opens its doors for the first time to the Watchung community."

Manny Miracle, the dedicated Branch Manager of the Watchung branch, expressed her deep enthusiasm for the project. "I feel incredibly fortunate to serve as the library branch manager in the town of Watchung at this moment in time," said Miracle. "Watchung is a remarkably vibrant community that invests in the wellness of its residents and beautiful grounds, and I think the library renovation is one more step in creating a community that prioritizes connection, discovery, and exploration. From the moment I stepped into my role here at Watchung, the library patrons, the Friends, The Library Advisory Committee, and the Borough have all been welcoming, inclusive, and engaging."

The groundbreaking marks a new phase in the library's evolution. The Watchung staff and patrons temporarily relocated from their beloved former building in May 2024 to a temporary location at 20 Stirling Rd. (formerly the Valley Furniture Store), which opened with full services in the beginning of June.

Looking ahead, Miracle shared her excitement for the future. "I wake up every day excited to go to work. I delight in hearing our existing patrons talk about their dreams for their library. It's an absolute joy to welcome new patrons into the library, especially our littlest cardholders, and tell their parents about all of the plans for the children's room."

She further highlighted the proactive approach of her team. "The team at Watchung, of which I am incredibly proud, has taken the opportunity this move and renovation has provided to rethink, refresh, and expand program offerings and outreach. Our goal is to provide the best possible experience to the community we serve both today in our beautiful temporary space and in all of the coming tomorrows."

The groundbreaking ceremony signifies the beginning of an exciting new chapter for the Watchung library, promising an enhanced space for discovery, exploration, sharing and community connections for years to come.

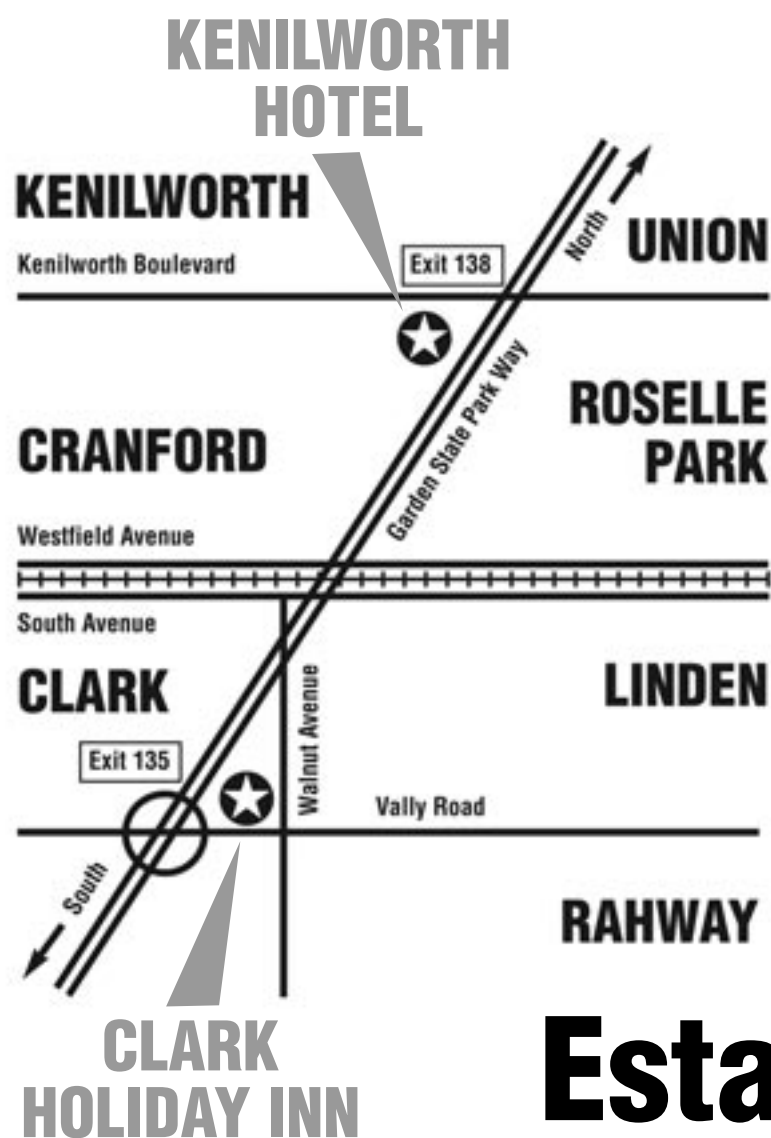

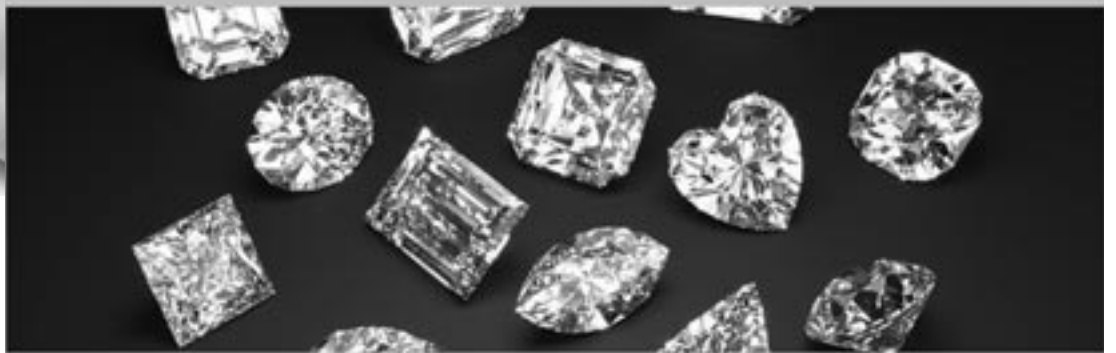

Each week, the NJVN provides veterans with food, clothing, housing assistance, VA benefits information, and mental health support. By partnering with numerous other groups and organizations, we can offer our uniformed heroes a better way of life.

We are always looking for volunteers that can both assist with upcoming events and help mentor veterans so they can live better productive lives. 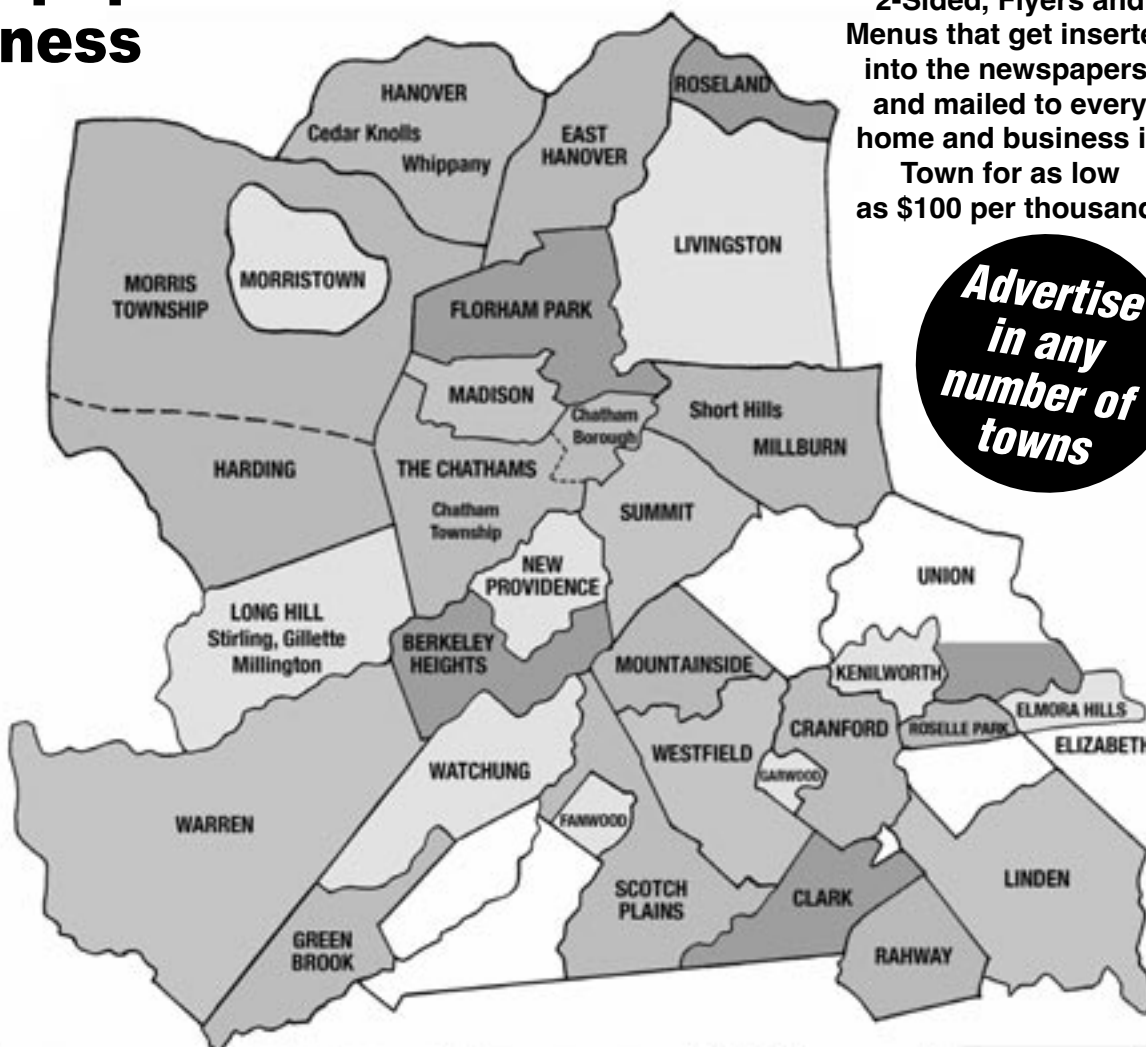
