DEIRDRE GELINNE SWORN IN AS ADVOCATE FOR CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

CASA of Passaic and Union Counties

Union County Superior Court Judge Gavin I. Handwerker presided over the swearing-in of Deirdre Gelinne of Westfield, who trained with Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) of Passaic and Union Counties to advocate for vulnerable children in foster care. She trained alongside Ashanti Hameed of Hillside.

Both are now equipped to champion the best interests of child victims of abuse and neglect, the volunteers join a team of hundreds of devoted advocates with CASA of Passaic and Union Counties who provide life-changing advocacy and support services to each of the more than 350 children across both counties living in foster care through no fault of their own.

Gelinne noted she first learned about the CASA program during her 11-year tenure as Executive Director of the Westfield United Fund. "I was inspired by the stories of the many children whose lives were changed by a CASA volunteer." Now retired from that post, she applied to become an advocate.

When asked how she was feeling before taking the oath in court, Gelinne shared, "I'm looking forward to being sworn in so I can begin the work I've trained for. I am conscious of taking on such an important responsibility." That training, she added, "was very thorough. What I found most impactful were the real-life examples shared by the trainers who have all been CASAs themselves."

Said Erica Fischer-Kaslander, Executive Director of Child Focus, the nonprofit organization that oversees the CASA program, "I'm happy to welcome Deirdre and Ashanti! Each have made a powerful commitment to ensure a child's voice is heard, and they bring their own strengths and perspectives to the table. Having completed training and court observation, and now taken their oath before the judge, this is an exciting day. More vulnerable children in foster care will now have a consistent, caring adult in their corner." She added, "I encourage anyone interested in supporting vulnerable children to attend an information session to learn

how they, too, can make what is a lifelong difference."

No prior knowledge of child welfare is required to become a CASA volunteer; comprehensive training equips volunteers with the skills necessary to advocate effectively. Volunteer advocates visit their assigned child at least once monthly and communicate with caregivers, educators, caseworkers, and others in the child's life, and then make informed recommendations to the judge.

CASA of Passaic and Union Counties is a program of Child Focus, which prioritizes the needs and well-being of infants, children, and teens impacted by, or at risk of, abuse or neglect. The Westfield Historical Society Hall of Fame honors past and present residents of Westfield who have brought distinction to the community.

Dr. Carole Shaffer-Koros has earned a place in the Hall of Fame for her lifelong devotion to public service and her focus on education. As a teenage volunteer candy striper to her current role as a trustee with the Westfield Historical Society (WHS), she was raised to believe we all have civic responsibility.

Dr. Shaffer-Koros was the youngest of nine. Born in the midst of the Great Depression, she and her siblings were expected to help family income with small jobs to earn money. After graduating as valedictorian from Riverside High School in western NJ, she entered the University of Pennsylvania school of nursing and earned her diploma. She worked in psychiatric nursing for two years, enrolled in Douglass College of Rutgers University and received a B.A. in Spanish all the while working part-time as campus nurse.

While at Douglass, she met Robert Koros at a dance mixer, eventually married him and they had two daughters, Diana and Silvia. The family moved to Westfield in 1965.

Dr. Shaffer-Koros returned to the University of Pennsylvania and earned her M.A. and Ph.D. in Romance Literature and Literature, commuting to classes in Philadelphia and to libraries to research her theses. Robert was a supportive partner in all ways.

After graduating, she found that women were not being hired by university foreign language departments. Pivoting in her career, she joined the Kean College faculty in 1974 and retrained as a professor of English as a Second Language (ESL). There, she designed and enacted a program to integrate foreign students into academic studies. Later, she taught and led the M.A. in Liberal Studies program. In Kean's English Department, she taught and created a variety of courses, became Chair, and was promoted to Associate Dean of the School of Liberal Arts and then the founding Dean of the School of Visual and Performing Arts at Kean

University.

Locally, Dr. Shaffer-Koros co-founded EDGE (Expanded Dimensions in Gifted Education). Classes ran Saturday mornings at Edison Middle School. Eventually, the Westfield School system integrated gifted education into the schools and EDGE was dissolved as per its charter.

Dr. Shaffer-Koros has published academic articles and book chapters and given many presentations at international academic conferences. She is a participant and has held leadership positions in professional associations. She has been honored by many fellowships, honors and awards.

Following retirement from Kean University, she served as Secretary of the Board of Trustees of Bridgeway, Treasurer of the Genealogical Society of the West Fields, the Treasurer of the WHS Board of Trustees, speaker's program cochair and editor of the WHS Newsletter. She is a play selection reader for Premiere Stages, a professional theatre group at Kean University. She is currently a contributor to a forthcoming book entitled Edith Wharton and the Mediterranean to be published in fall 2025 and has several other projects underway about authors Wharton, Cather, Munro, Hawthorne, Poe, and James.



MEET THRIFT & CONSIGNMENT SHOP VOLS

Every Monday at 114 Elmer Street in Westfield, a team of determined ladies hang and price donated and consigned clothing to sell at the Westfield Service League Thrift and Consignment Shop. Each year they raise between eighty and ninety thousand dollars from the clothing and other items and donate it to local non-profit organizations in the area. Currently, League volunteers are vetting the organizations who will receive the funds in June.

In total, more than 80 volunteers work shifts each week to process the clothing, housewares, jewelry, toys, books, small furniture, designer bags and more that is brought to the blue Victorian house which is owned and maintained by the League. But a few ladies step up each year to manage the shop, including the flow of inventory, deciding when items will go on sale, making sure merchandise is displayed in an attractive manner, and that it is season appropriate.

The women, who come from all walks of life, were all looking to find to a way to give back to the community, form friendships, and to do good work. Sarah Martin, who co-chairs the Consignment Shop with Arlene Bertrand and Charlotte Abruzzo, came to the US from the UK 11 years ago.

Many of the women join the League after retirement. Paula Davino, who chairs the Thrift Shop, was looking for something worthwhile to do after a long career as a teacher.

Others love the fact that all of the merchandise is finding a new home instead of merely being thrown out. Arlene Bertrand sees the League's operation as an opportunity to work with and
